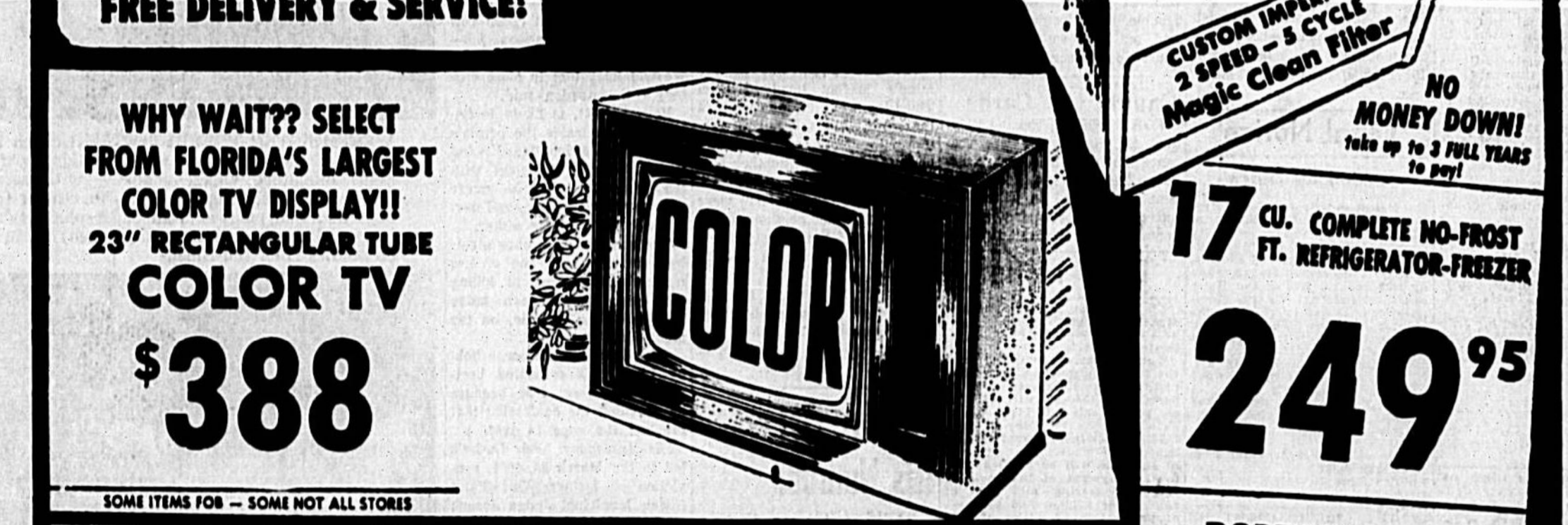

Mays Catches Williams, Trails 714 Pace Of Ruth By Only Six Weeks

 Willie Mays is passing the parade by.
 It's amazing 35-year-old captain of the San Francisco Giants, who doesn't participate in the game of trumps and the sound of 74 trombones whenever he achieves another baseball milestone, has marched into the ranks of the most accomplished sluggers in baseball annals and doesn't appear ready to stop until he overcomes them all.

Mays continued his steady advancement Thursday by leading the 1959 season with 10 home runs, 10 RBIs, 10 runs scored, 10 hits, 10 errors, 10 stolen bases, 10 walks, 10 strikeouts, 10 assists, 10 putouts, 10 catches, 10 outs, 10 innings pitched, 10 errors committed, 10 double plays turned, 10 bases on balls, 10 wild pitches, 10 balks, 10 hits by pitch, 10 errors by fielders, 10 errors by pitchers, 10 errors by catchers, 10 errors by infielders, 10 errors by outfielders, 10 errors by pitchers, 10 errors by catchers, 10 errors by infielders, 10 errors by outfielders.

stepper to be passed by Mays sometime later this season. Ruth is another matter. The Babe's monumental 714 homers are in a class by themselves, but a class Mays could conceivably join before his career is ended.

Williams was 42 when he hit his last home run and Fox was 37 when he lagged No. 554. More important, however, Ruth himself did not sock his 22nd homer until early in the 1959 season when he, like Mays, was 35. Williams, therefore, trails the Babe's pace by approximately six weeks, hardly an impossible disadvantage.

The victory stretched the Giants' National League lead to 4 1/2 games over the Los Angeles Dodgers. In the only other scheduled game, St. Louis is nipped Houston 3-1 and Cincinnati overpowered Pittsburgh 4-2.

Baltimore, Detroit and Cleveland, the three top teams in the American League, continue to pull away from the pack. The Orioles whipped New York 6-2, the Tigers crushed Washington 6-1 and the Indians scalped Boston 8-6 in the only scheduled games.

Mays' shot came off Chicago's leech Dick Ellsworth and sailed over the right field wall at Wrigley Field. He also collected two singles to raise his batting average to .382. His 18 homers and 47 runs batted in are second best in the N.L. only Hank Aaron's 24 and 60.

Bob Gibson pitched a four-hitter to chalk up his fourth consecutive victory. The St. Louis fanhailer struck out four to raise his major league record to 11-1.

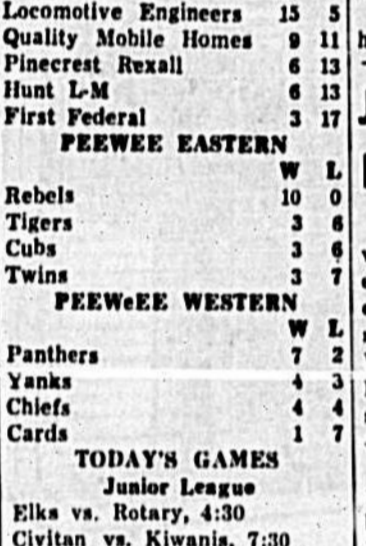
