





In the charter he found positive, specific sponsorship of a wide range of economic and social activities aimed at the mutual betterment of the participating lands.

By his measure, the "competing interest" concept the Russians espouse is at opposite poles from this basic and highly promising charter objective.

He saw the charter, too, as a clear, unassailable declaration of the principles of equal political rights, economic opportunities and justice for all nations and

All these visions are very general, but it may be argued that it is precisely on these broad yet fundamental grounds that the United Nations is today under its




