In what could become a landmark courtand the Washington Evening Star have filed suit asking for an injunction to forbid the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission from prohibiting separate "male" and "female" columns case, the American Newspaper Publishers Assn.

in help-wanted advertisements in newspapers. The Commission had announced "guidelines" to go into effect Dec. 1 which would prohinit the advertising of job offerings by sex, unless "sex is a bona fide occupational qualification for the particular job involved." In particular, the commission would outlaw the labeling of columns of classified ads either "male" or "female." If the commision's 'guidelines' are permitted to stand, each individual job ad will have to be separately identified as to sex, and then only if sex is a 'bona fide" requirement for the

job-whatever that means. One immediate result of the commission's ruling, of course, would be a higher cost of recruitment to employers. But prospective employes answering ade also would waste much time applying for positions which might be sexless in the eyes of the commission, but in which they would be anything but comfortable.

Perhaps Washington sees no reason why the boss's secretary shouldn't be a man or why the officer on the best shouldn't be a woman, but then not many people these days think govern-Whatever the otucome of the ANPA-Star suit. it is clear the last has not been heard of the sex-less issue.—Macon (Ge.) News.
