Area Women Return From Demo Confab

Four local Democratic women have returned from a three-day national campaign conference for Democratic women in Washington, D. C. The group was headed by Mrs. W. Vincent Roberts, who served as hostess for the Florida delegation. Accompanying Mrs. Roberts were Mrs. Jane Adriatico, publicist-coordinator for the conference, and Mrs. Florence Gilmarin and Mrs. Cora Gabel.

Mrs. Roberts described the highlights of the conference, beginning with a tour of Washington which emphasized Mrs. Lyndon Johnson's beautification program and included a briefing meeting with presidential cabinet officers and ranking government officials, a reception at the White House as guests of the first lady, cocktail parties, dinners and receptions.

During a tour of the Capitol the Florida women were escorted by three members of the Florida delegation, Rep. Charles Bennett, Sen. Spencer Holland and Rep. Dante Fascell. They also talked with former Florida governor, Farris Bryant, chairman of the Office of Emergency Planning.

Mrs. Roberts attended a reception given by Vice President Hubert Humphrey and another by Mrs. Nicholas Katzenbach, wife of the U. S. Attorney General. She received a gold charm bracelet from the vice president as a memento.

The title of "Woman of the Year" was won by Mrs. John Passmore of Miami, Democratic Women's Club, for her work with "Project Head Start" in South Miami. She was escorted to the speakers' platform by Rep. Dante Fascell who received a "Wider View" gold medal from the President for consumer affairs to make the consumer cause our cause. We also were urged to help in Mrs. Johnson's program on national beautification," she added.

Mrs. Roberts said she helped the Chamber of Commerce by personally inviting everyone she saw to come to Florida, and telling them about Seminole County and Sanford's new marina project.

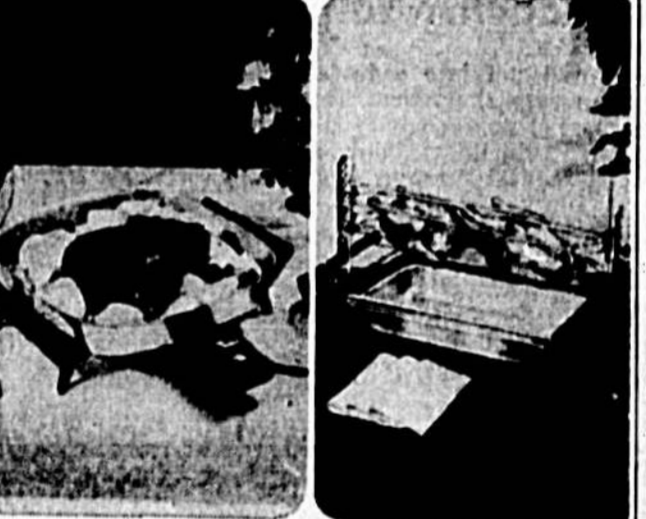

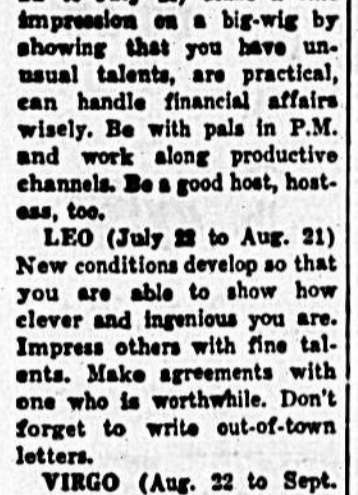

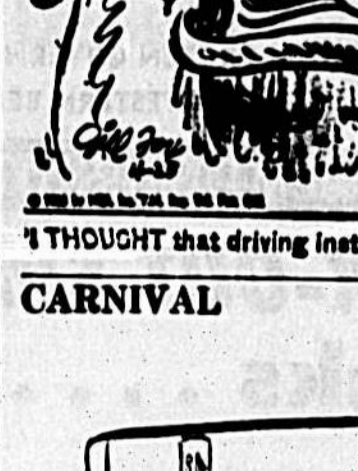

St. Johns River Estates Action Delayed Again By County Council

The Board of County Commissioners today delayed action on a bid for paving streets in St. Johns River Estates pending study of a proposal presented by St. Johns River Properties, Inc., to do the work on certain streets.

The proposal was made by Carl Langford, trustee, and called for paving on Canal Street, Perch Avenue and Beacon Drive, plus abandonment of certain sections of the subdivision.

Langford said construction could start immediately under his proposal. "This is an extremely attractive proposal and offers a solution to this problem," Langford said. He indicated that he might ask a federal court to enjoin anyone else from doing paving work in the subdivision.

One bid for doing the paving work was received by the commission last week and it was \$120,000 to do the work under the original specifications drawn up in 1952. The paving bond, called for by the county, is for only \$14,000.

However, there are alternatives to the bid and work could be done up the amount of the bond. Commissioner John Fitzpatrick suggested that the Atlanta (UPI) Evangelist Billy Graham will go to Poland in late September to help celebrate the establishment of Christianity there 1,000 years ago.

Joseph Powell of Longwood today was sentenced to 25 years in prison for the slaying of a woman in 1952. Powell was found guilty of second degree murder at the conclusion of a two-day trial Nov. 10. A pre-sentence investigation was ordered.

Anti-Reds End Lenin Exhibit
JACKSONVILLE (UPI) - Militantly anti-Communist Indiana students forced the closure of a Lenin exhibit in its cultural center. The center and the embassy were placed under heavy guard by the Indiana Association of Students (IASA). IASAs delivered an ultimatum to the cultural center Monday night to close down within 12 hours or face possible student violence.

Welcomes Jury Duty 'With Joy'
JACKSONVILLE (UPI) - Some people try to get out of jury duty but the Federal Court here has received a letter from a man who said he would be "delirious with joy" to serve. The letter from Roger Thomas of Jacksonville, was in response to a questionnaire sent to determine the qualifications of prospective jurors.

Experiments Outlined By Entomologist
Research at the Central Florida Experiment Station in Sanford is being conducted under 23 formal projects in special fields ranging from entomology to plant breeding. Dr. J. W. Wilson, entomologist and head of the station, told other researchers attending an annual vegetable research workshop sponsored by Florida Fruit and Vegetable Association in Orlando that emphasis has been placed on chemical control and insecticide residues remaining on vegetable crops at harvest. Specific work is being done on cabbage looper, cabbage aphid, and corn earworm.

Experiments Outlined By Entomologist
In plant pathology research, work is being conducted on the control of European blight of celery, helminthosporium leaf blight of sweet corn, bacterial diseases of cabbage and peppers, lettuce drop, pink rot of celery and black speck of cabbage.
