

# Los Angeles Rams Add Named Men To Hike Hopes

## Hope To Bolster Team With Players Like Harmon and Susic

LOS ANGELES—The rag-torn champions of the National Football League in 1945—the Los Angeles (nee Cleveland) Rams—have picked up glamor galore and

a batch of big-name players they hope will bring another title. The aggressive Rams swooped into the City of Angels to become the league's first far western member, quickly sewed up prior rights to the mammoth Coliseum and proceeded to bolster their already formidable roster with such grid luminaries as Tom Harmon and Kenny Washington. They outbid the rival Los Angeles All-America Dons for Harmon's services, thereby rubbing salt into wounds which promise only to fester more—perhaps on both sides—as the blazing 1946 pro grid war progresses. The addition of Harmon at a reported \$15,000 per year gives the Rams probably the two highest-salaried players in the league. Art quarterback Bob Waterfield, last

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year's T formation sparkplug and most valuable player in the circuit, has a contract calling for something like \$20,000. Coach Adam Walsh has the complicated, though not unpleasant, job of fitting these expensive pieces together into a high-geared unit. Starting with Waterfield at quarterback, Walsh's present plans call for Harmon to alternate with Fred Cehrke, last year's leading Ram ground-gainer, at left half; either Tom Farmer, ex-Iowa star, or Jim Gillette, holdover, at right half; and probably Steve Susic, former Illinois buster, at fullback. Washington, the superb ex-UCLA halfback, probably will spell Waterfield at quarter. Walsh's trick knees, operated on this spring, may prevent his best running, but his passing to end Woody Stroh, another Bruin Negro great, may be a threat throughout the circuit. Susic, a real bulldozer, may get preference over two other rugged fullbacks, holdover Pat West and Mike Holovak, former Boston College ace. Farmer and Jack Banis, former Philly Eagle, have flashed form in the Rams' training sessions at nearby Compton. Harmon, out of moleskins for five years, has been having leg trouble, but Walsh is counting on him for at least part-time duty. If the former Michigan All-America comes anywhere close to his collegiate capers, the Rams' management figures he'll be well worth the investment. Other backs include Jack Wilson, Bob Hoffman, Jim Hardy, Ralph Ruthstrom and Albie Retas. Strong Line A powerful line is headed by Arkansas Jim Benton, Waterfield's crack receiver, and a great group of ends. Besides Benton, who led the league by snagging 45 passes for eight touchdowns and 1,087 yards, the Rams have such stilet tankmen as Woody Strode, Steve Pritko, Ray Hamilton, Bob Shaw, Howard Hickey, Ben Hightower and Jay McDowell. # Coach George Halas Predicts Best Year Since 1943 For Chicago Bears

COLLEGEVILLE, Ind.—Skipper George Halas, back in personal command of the Chicago Bears after three and a half years in the Navy, is setting a comeback course. He expects to produce the best Bear team since the championship outfit of the 1940-42 era. But Halas, who doubles as owner and head coach, eschews a bald statement, and sets forth his opinion by circumlocution. "It looks like we'll be in pretty good shape in personnel," he says, as he glances at the huge squad training here. "I don't know where we'll finish, but we'll guarantee to win a few more games than last year. They'll be the best Bears in several years." That "several years" bridges back to the title days. The club, with Halas away, began to slide down the ways in 1944, and splashed into fourth place in the western division in 1945, with only three wins and seven losses. But things are looking up now for several reasons. Halas, a resourceful strategist and a relentless competitor, is back at the helm, ending conjecture that he might leave his actual coaching to his aides. "The old urge came back," he says, wagging a sheet of play diagrams. "I'm getting a great bang out of it." Seventeen veterans who were in squads which earned National League titles have returned to form the nucleus of a postwar team, and three of them—Bulldog Turner, Sid Luckman and George McAfee—would make a neat nucleus for anybody's club. Then, there'll be fresh manpower—and novel maneuvers. Bob

Zupke, who directed the University of Illinois to seven Big Ten pennants, has joined the brain trust as an advisory coach. "Some of the innovations will be quite radical," says Halas, who learned his football from Zupke in the 1914-18 period. "Zup has some new ideas. For example, he'll adapt the old Flying T-press play to the T-formation." But the biggest factor in bringing the Bear out of hibernation is Halas himself. He has a rare knack for keeping the players on the hustle. "Perhaps Turner, an intelligent and observant fellow, can explain the Halas technique. 'Well,' the Bulldog says, 'he never lets the boys get the idea they're good.' It's some subtle psychology involved." "Nope," says the Bulldog. "He just tells 'em."

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Muddled Foreign Policy

That the Democratic party is as badly split in the field of foreign policies as it is in regard to domestic matters was clearly revealed last week when Secretary of Commerce Henry Wallace delivered an address in New York City in which he thoroughly repudiated the course which the State Department has been following in foreign affairs and specifically denounced the stand taken by Secretary Byrnes only the week before at Stuttgart.

It is had enough in the field of foreign affairs when members of the opposition party give voice to carping criticism over every course of action which may be pursued, but when the party in power, when even the members of the President's own cabinet cannot agree on what ought to be done in a most critical hour of the nation's history in dealing with a highly authoritarian power like Russia, the situation indeed becomes most demoralizing at home and abroad alike.

The bridegroom's brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Wade, acted as best man and matron of honor.

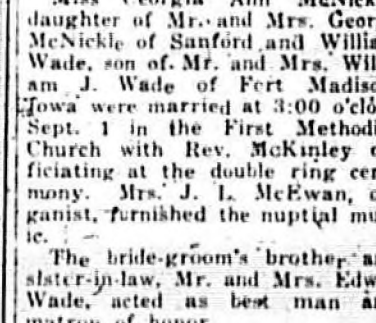

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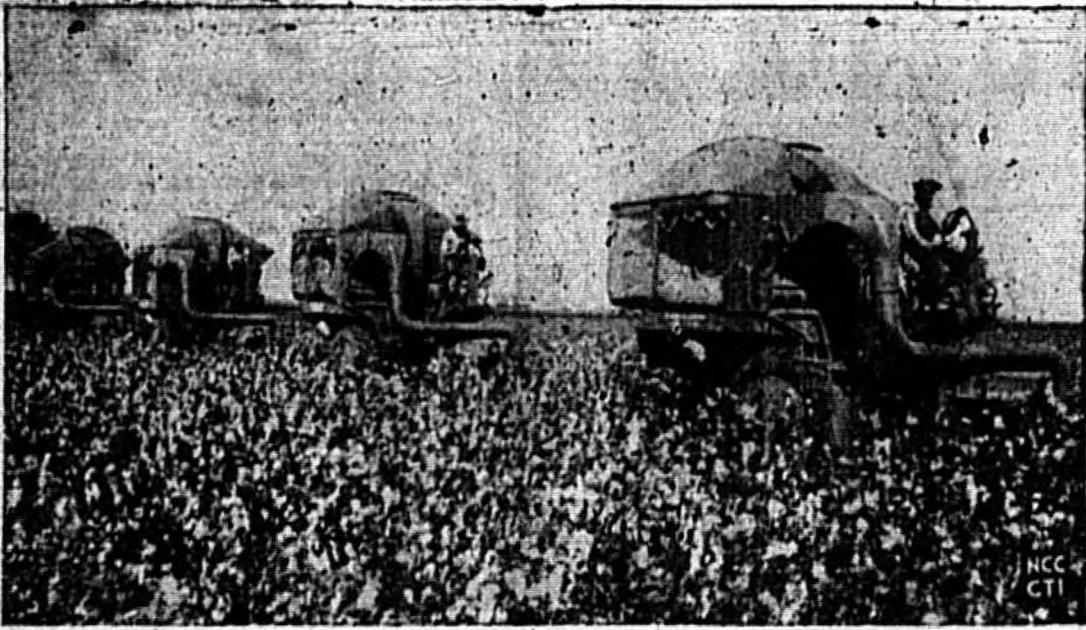

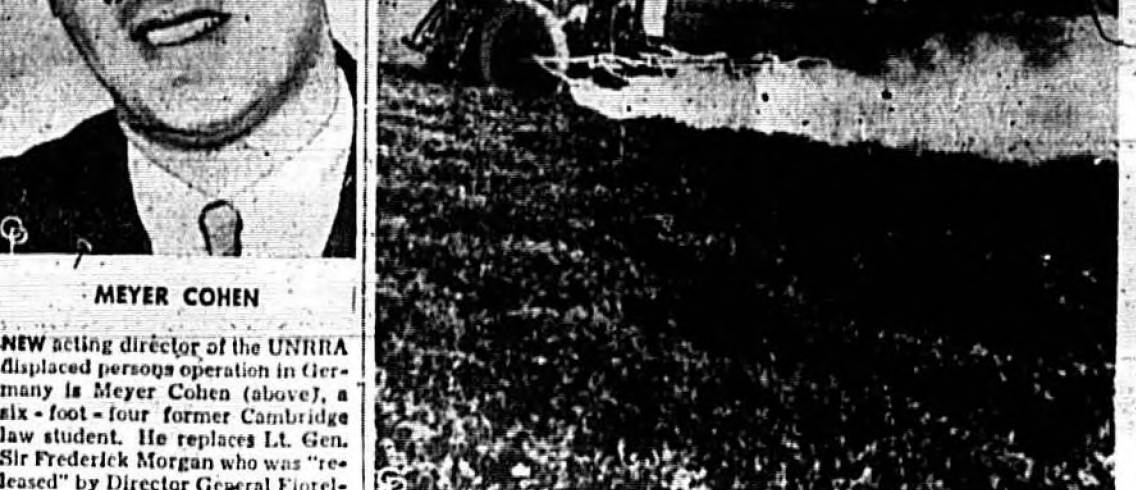
