Regulation of stock exchanges to prevent speculation is a line thing and may prevent many a Toolish husband from losing the little savings accumulated by his own hard abor and his family's pinching, but most of those who gamble in Well Street can well afford to lose, perhaps not as much as they have in recent years, but as much as they ordinarily lose in normal times.

Slot machines and lottery tickets, however, appeal to different class of citizens, The instinct for gambling is as prevalent in the day laborer and his children as it is among hose who fullow the races or engage in stock market pools. but those who buy lottery tickets or work the machines are mulliy these who need their money for the ordinary necessition of lifer whe need thus

The slot machine is systematic robbery, nothing else, says Arthur Brisbane. "Every intelligent person knows to the owners! Yet, millions throw away their money in these neetrings: "An occasional winning, allowed as 'bait,' is known to everybody "Losses are not known.

"Commerican respect for law and American power to enforce law are at such a low ebb that apparently this crude stealing from people of small means cannot be stopped. and Another mickel' for public robbery is the 'number lottery! Which takes millions a week from the poor and ig norant. Trails shown by Florida's state racing commission that one "mutuel' betting system is manipulated in order that the number desired by the owners of the number lotteries may 'come out.' The robbers give the gambler one chance in 10 to win, then take the one chance.

"Are you betting on horse races, using your magnificent judgment, carefully studying past performances, pick- BY THOUSANDS mobile selzed by the federal authorities, loaded with narcotics used for doping horses, and your pocketbook."

Governor Sholtz has rightly started a campaign against the lottery and slot machine rackets. There is no excuse for their existence in haw-abiding communities. They are against the law of the state, and against all moral and economic law as well. They are damaging to business and to man's consciences. And they keep men broke who might therwise be able to save something.

### . The Home Of The Aged

We have always liked to think of Florida as a haven of efage for all those who have crossed the threshold of middle life and are trying to eke out their four score years and ten by bathing in some Fountain of Youth, but according to the United States News, New England is the best slace to grow old, cold and unweatherly as it is.

"Curious facts are learned," the News says, "by mullng over the number of persons 65 or over, by states. For ustance, six states have the highest percentages of elderly olk, a percentage of 7 or better in comparison to the total tate population. They are New Hampshire, Vermont and Maine, holding up the New England banner, and Iowa, Inflana and Delaware. Oregon, in the Northwest, also does well by its aged.

"Then again, there are fewer aged in the South, particuarly Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi, North and South arolina. In the West, Arizona and Wyoming have a relativev small number of elderly folk. In general, the ratio of literly folk increased during the 1920-30 decade, particulary in the West. Eastern galus were conspicuous only in Disrict of Columbia, Delaware, Massachusetts and New Hampshire. North Carolina is the only state showing a de-'reand."

There may be some dispute over Walter Pitkin's theory hat "Life Begins at 40;" but work-day life is still going on or three-fifths of American men who have reached the age of 65. As for women, just one out of 12 can be classed as ainfully employed in the upper age group Analyzing census figures on the elderly segment of the ics, rinus that, taking both men and women above 65, one iut of three are gainfully employed. This is an average, but he rate varied from 27.7 percent employed in Nebraska to 6.8 percent in Mississippi. "For the most part, rural conditions in farm states ffer more work opportunities for the aged." the Name sys."In urban sections, on the other hand industrial conlitions offer's smaller chance for work to those of advanced cears. This is shown strikingly by an analysis of states where at least two-thirds of the aged men are employed. Such states are Mississippi, North and South Carolina, Arkansas, Georgia, Alabama, New Mexico, Tennessee, Kentucky, Virginia, Louistana and Idaho. The total number of persons 65 and over in this country is 6,500,000 or 5.5 percent of the entire population.






