Complain More Than Irish WEST HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) - Jewish and Italian patients complain more about pain than Irish patients.

according to nationwide studies of patients at hospitals and clinics described in the book. "Jewish and Italian patients react to pain with louder complaints and make more demands on their doctors. While Italians want pain stopped immediately, Jewish patients are less prone to accept pain relievers to mask the pain," explained Dr. Matisyohu Weisenberg, assistant professor of behavioral sciences and community health at the University of Connecticut School of Dental Medicine.

### Fire Deaths Decline

BOSTON (AP) - Fire deaths were down and property damage up in 1974, according to the National Fire Protection Association.

The association said during the weekend that about 11,600 persons died in 1974 fires, down about 100 from 1973. Property damage, however, grew faster than inflation to \$3.7 billion, up 22 per cent over 1973's \$3.02 billion. A discotheque fire at Port Chester, N.Y., killed 24 on June 30, making it the deadliest fire.

A forest fire at Cloudcroft, N.M., on April 9 destroyed property worth \$32 million, including part of the town, making it the costliest fire.



### Kissinger Not One Man Show

The widely held impression that Secretary of State Henry Kissinger is a one-man show does a disservice both to him and the the depth of the American approach to foreign affairs.

Kissinger's top aide on Asian affairs is Philip Habib, assistant secretary of state for East Asian and Pacific affairs.

Habib's methodical, professional approach to the conduct of foreign affairs is the antithesis of the style of Kissinger, the virtuoso - at least in outward appearances.

But everyone should realize that Kissinger, for all his talents and abilities, owes a lot to men like Habib for his successes. Kissinger's high-powered ego does not allow him to tip his hat to these valuable assistants in public. But in private, he is always ready to compliment them on their often brilliant work.

Much of the substance of the November presidential trip to Japan, South Korea and Vladivostok — and especially the Kissinger spin-off to Peking — was handled by Habib.

He directed the nuts-and-bolts negotiations with Chinese Foreign Ministry officials on the matter of outstanding claims held by both countries against the other. Settlement of this issue will allow trade between the two countries to expand

Habib was very definitely the key man in the U.S. talks with Korean President Chung Hee Park during the visit of President Gerald Ford to Seoul. The serious, bespectacled Habib was ambassador to Seoul from September, 1971, until he

was nominated to his new post in August of 1974. But his acquaintance with Park and the complicated Korean situation goes back to 1961 when Habib was political officer at the U.S. Embassy in South Korea at the time Park led a coup d'etat against the government of Prime Minister

Habib, 54, played an important role as a top Kissinger adviser in the U.S. negotiations on

For his Vietnam role, he was selected as one of the seven winners of the 1969 Rockefeller Public Service Awards for "distinguished service to the government of the United States and to the American people."

Many Korean officials, journalists and clergymen will tell you that Habib had a better understanding of that country than any envoy that Washington has sent to Seoul in a long while. Despite such compliments, there is never any doubt in anyone's mind that Habib is representing the United States and its national interests.

He began his foreign service career in Ottawa as assistant agricultural attache. Later assignments included economic officer in New Zealand, political officer in both Saigon and Seoul, and several posts at the State Department.







A Seminole County Courthouse "tenant" was evicted Monday night after he was discovered "strolling" corridors and stairwells. Cleaning crew members abruptly met the "tenant" coming down stairs from the second floor near State Attorney Abbott Herring's first floor offices.

The womens' screams brought Supervisor Sarah Smith running and she in turn called for a sheriff's deputy from the third floor communications center. Sheriff's Complaint Clerk Doug Jurss cornered the unwanted visitor-a 30 inch red rat snake-and herded him

into a cardboard box. The snake spent the next few hours, until Jurss' shift ended, in the box on a complaint desk-the box top securely weighted with a stack of books. Jurss said the nonpoisonous reptile would be turned

over to the Central Florida Zoo today. The snake's gone but courthouse personnel are wondering how long the colorful "tenant" had been slithering along carpeted hallways and stairwells and where he secreted himself during the days while hundreds of people busily worked in the \$4 million building.
