



MISSOURI PACIFIC RAILROAD STRIKE?

Over twenty years ago, the Congress of the United States passed the Railway Labor Act. It was hailed by union leaders as a model for the settlement of labor disputes.

TER LEADERS of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, Order of Railway Conductors, and the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen on the Missouri Pacific Railroad have refused to avail themselves of the peaceful means provided by this Act for settling their dis-putes. They insist that they be the sole umpire of their own disputes over the meaning of contracts.

There is No Need for Strikes

With all of the available methods for the interpretation of contracts, there is no mand for a strike or even a threat of a strike, but the leaders of those railroad unions have ignored the ordinary procedures established by law and insist upon

meaning their own interpretations of their sentrates by means of a strike.

What Are These Strikes About? These strikes and strike threats are not about wage rates or hours. They result from disputes over the meaning of exist-ing contracts. They cover claims for a full day's pay for less than a day's work, or for payments for services performed by others who were fully paid for the work done.

President Truman's Board Condemna Strike

There is an established legal method for handling disputes involving existing written contracts—just as there is such a method of settling any contract dispute

which you may have in your daily life.

The President of the United States appointed a Fact Finding Board to investigate and adjust the Missouri Pacific dispute. This Board reported, in part, as follows:






