CHICAGO, Jan. 10.—Extra pay for overtime work and eight hour day are the principal points sought by the railroad clerks in the controversies over the rules of clerks of national agreement up for consideration today by United States Railroad Labor Board.

### AUTOMOBILE CAMPS MUST BE KEPT SANITARY

The State Board of Health is determined that automobile tourist camps are operated in strict accordance with up-to-date sanitary teachings. The poorly or half way maintained auto camp is a menace to the people.

A survey of practically every auto camp in the State has recently been concluded by the state health board and the collected information concerning each tabulated. Subsequently a Classification of all camps was made based upon (a) supervision of the camp by the municipality or (b) availability of utilities or conveniences. This classification being transmitted to city clerks, to tourist information bureaus, traveling bureaus, chambers of commerce, and other civic organizations interested in serving the tourists for their proper guidance.

The classification of camps just prepared by the State Board of Health, Bureau of Engineering shows that Bradentown, DeLand, Gainesville, Lakeland, Pensacola, Tampa and West Palm Beach have the best camps in the state, considered from all angles.

### PENROSE'S PLACE

#### MANY HAPPENINGS OF WORLD IN TODAY'S STRING OF PRESS DISPATCHES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Ambassador Harvey enabled the State Department today from Cannes he was only slightly injured in an automobile accident but said he had requested Ambassador Herriek at Paris, to act temporarily as American observer at Cannes conference in his place.

CANNES, Jan. 9.—George Harvey, American ambassador to Great Britain, was injured in a collision between his automobile and another machine this morning was taken to a hotel where his secretary announced he was not badly hurt. Later he announced Harvey would not attend meeting of Allied Supreme Council today.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9.—Senator McCumber, of North Dakota, was selected today by committee on committees as chairman of the Senate Finance committee to succeed the late Senator Penrose. Frelinghuysen, Republican, New Jersey, selected to fill the vacancy on the finance committee.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 9.—George Wharton Pepper, Philadelphia, attorney, was appointed United States senator by Governor Sprout today to succeed Penrose. Under the in w appointment stands until a successor can be selected at the November election to fill the unexpired Penrose term ending in 1927.

### Federal Prohibition Officer Pans Local Officers

#### Majority of County Officials Unwilling to Support Prohibition

TAMPA, Jan. 9.—Assertions that the majority of county offices in the state are not supporting the enforcement of prohibition laws and that many of them are violators of the laws themselves, were made by A. L. Allen, federal director of prohibition in Florida, in a recent statement ramming up the work of his department during the five months of 1921 that he was directing the work.

While he did not feel "jubilant" over enforcement conditions he feels that his men have done exceptionally well, Director Allen said. Increase in his force of 10 per cent is expected to be authorized within a month, he said, and it is his understanding that Federal Prohibition Commissioner Haynes, at Washington, is seeking to obtain an agreement with England looking towards the curbing of the flow of contraband whiskey from Binini.

Seven vessels and 27 automobiles were confiscated as whiskey runners during his tenure of office beginning August 1, he said. Whiskey seizures totalled 26,012 quarts while the quantity of mash taken amounted to 55,777 gallons.

A considerable part of the moonshine industry in the state, according to Mr. Allen, can be traced to the low market prices for cane syrup and the over-production of sugar cane.

"The last year," he said, "our farm crops were small, except for cane crop which was larger than usual. One year ago this month cane syrup was selling at \$1.50 a gallon. This year, with double the crop, people of West Florida have told me that they are offered only 35 to 40 cents a gallon for their syrup.

"Many of those people in those circumstances have found the parting of the ways and have sold their syrup to a bootlegging neighbor or have used it themselves in making moonshine. Only three gallons of syrup are necessary to make a quart of liquor. The market value of the syrup is \$1.05 to \$1.20 while the quart of moonshine will sell for \$5 to \$8."
