UAW 'Goals'

DETROIT (AP)-The executive board of the United Auto Workers would like to settle the last of its domestic Big Three auto contracts before Thanksgiving and has set a Nov. 19 strike deadline at the General Motors Corp. Meanwhile, the UAW Ford Council voted Tuesday to recommend that UAW Ford Motor Co. employes rarify a three-year agreement reached last week. The union negotiated its industry pattern contract with Chrysler Corp. after striking the company in September.

U.S. Steel Earnings

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (AP) — U.S. Steel says federal price controls have hampered it even though thirdquarter earnings are up \$56.4 million from last year Tuesday, the firm reported third-quarter profits of \$87.3 million, or \$1.62 per common share, on sales of \$1.8 billion. It said earnings for the first nine months of 1973 were \$221.3 million, or \$4.09 per share, on sales of \$5.1 billion. During the same 1972 period, earnings totaled \$102.3 million, or \$1.89 per share, on sales of \$3.9 billion. However, Board Chairman Edgar B. Speer said the profit return on this year's sales has been only 4.3 per cent.



## County Board Actions

By CHRISNELSON Herald Staff Writer

Commissioners set a February public referendum target date for the controversial impact zoning ordinance after a three-hour hearing Tuesday night showing that schools are the major cost of impact development

The latest in a series of hearings and work sessions on the ordinance, sponsored by Commissioners Dick Williams and John Kimbrough, saw an economic impact report by the Environmental Design Group (EDG) reveal that, as written. the ordinance will have the opposite effect intended by the

EDG economist Mike Brophy dismayed commissioners with his findings in that Chairman Sid Vihlen called a "live test . . . a dry heat" of the proposed ordinance, showing that single-family dwellings will be hit the hardest, while highdensity apartments will suffer the least.

Brophy recommended commissioners revamp the ordinance to plug in economic data allowing for depreciation of capital investment costs prompted by impact development, such as school buildings and roads, which will be used for years by many county residents.

Noting that schools apparently constitute 85 per cent of impact costs, rated at \$2,200 per new pupil, Brophy and ssistant County Atty. Howard Marsee were directed to prepare a revised ordinance in eight weeks. Marsee and county planner Roger Neiswender warned

commissioners faulty economic impact analysis would result in an unenforceable law, noting the recent case in which Breward County was forced to repay in 20 days all money collected under an impact ordinance.

Vihlen noted \$4.5 million in school cost offset money alone has been collected since the commission initiated its current program of voluntary contributions to cover impact

The state had the home's unprotected electrical outlets "cleaned up" in three weeks, but no action has been taken, Vihlen said Tuesday, adding "I am personally alarmed for the safety of the family."

Vihlen and Zoning Director J. B. Williams said the electrical practices plaguing Mrs. Geiger are "typical of the sort of thing the governor's task force on mobile homes is investigating."





SANTO, New Hebrides - - Remember "Base Buttons?" If you were one of a few million miscellaneous GIs who fought the long World War II route across the Pacific against Japan you probably do. But, you wouldn't recognize it

Santo is the main city on the island of Espiritu Santo and it also goes by the name of Luganville. It is sort of the left "finger" of the 73 y-shaped islands of New Hebrides stretching a north-south distance of about 500 miles from a point 1,100 miles northeast of Sydney, Australia. It went by nic code name of "Base Buttons" in the war days of 30 years ago.

New Hebrides is unique in many ways beyond the Stone Age mode of life in many areas and the friendly charm of its mostly Melanesian

lesson in bilateral cooperation.

New Hebrides is administered jointly by the French and the English and despite the in-born hostility people of those two nations "enjoy," the system works here.

The formal system was set up on Feb 6, 1906, and it experienced a long period of trial and error. A protocol was signed in 1914 and the mutual interest of Britain and France fighting the Germans in World War I produced a degree of togetherness to the end that since 1922 the condominium system has prevailed reasonably

**How Soviets** 

Affected War

WASHINGTON-The story is now leaking out of the strained, secret diplomacy that followed the outbreak of hostilities in the Middle East.

In one secret report, the Central Intelligence Agency suggests that the Soviets actually orchestrated the Arab attack. It was part of a desperate maneuver, the CIA quotes an informed source as saying, to hang on to their beachhead

Before the attack, Egypt had thrown out Soviet military advisers, tightened its ties with Saudi Arabia and shifted toward the West. Even in Syria, which had been the most Moscow-minded of the Arab powers, the Soviets had encountered growing hostility.

Other intelligence reports raise doubts about the precise Soviet role in planning the surprise attack. But the Kremlin clearly had advance knowledge that it was coming.

It has also been established that Soviet military shipments, both by air through Yugoslavia and by water through the Black Sea, started on their way before the guns began

Immediately after the outbreak, President Nixon appealed to Soviet party chief Leonid Brezhnev for restraint. Both the superpowers, urged the President, should keep hands off the Middle East war.

recapture their lost lands and, therefore, that the Soviets couldn't withhold military supplies. Nixon responded that the United States was equally justified in helping Israel repel

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger stressed to Soviet Ambassador Antoly Dobrynin that the United States was quite capable of matching Soviet shipments and maintaining the military supply balance in the Middle East.

HELD BACK For four days, the United States held back military shipments to Israel while Kissinger tried to persuade the Russians to exercise similar restraint. However, the Soviet tonnage not only began to pour into Egypt and Syria, but the Russicas also beefed up their naval strength in the

In response, the United States used its superior airlift capacity to catch up with the Soviet shipments. This apparently surprised the Soviet strategists, who had thought the United States wouldn't risk an oil cut-off to support the

Intelligence reports claim, meanwhile, that the cautious Egyptian commanders wanted to consolidate their hold on the Suez Canal's east bank but were goaded by the Russians

Brezhnev also brought personal pressure, according to one report, on Jordan's King Hussein, Morocco's King Hassan and Tunisia's President Habib Bourguiba to join in

When the Israelis outmaneuvered the Egyptians by moving across the Suez and cutting the Egyptian supply lines, the Kremlin began showing signs of panic. Another Arab humiliation could backfire on the Soviets, whose role in the debacle could bring them more blame than praise from

Suddenly, Brezhnev sent President Nixon an urgent

President Nixon rejected the idea of direct superpower involvement in the Middle East. The Scriets apparently mistook this as a delaying tactic and sent a bristling note to the President, threatening to send its own troops to the Middle East to keep the peace.

The President reacted by placing the U.S. armed forces on a military alert. Then both of the big powers wisely backed away from a confrontation.

GRIZZLY REPORT: A secret Interior Department study warns that the nation's grizzly bear population is in danger of extinction because their food supply has been suddenly closed down.

In Yellowstone National Park, the last major stronghold of the big beasts, the grizzlies have fed for years on campers' garbage. Six years ago, a study urged that the dumps be closed gradually so the bears could return to their old eating

Instead, the National Park Service has shut down the dumps abruptly, thus driving the panicky bears into campsites and off-park lands, where they have been shot.


The new secret study, done by Interior consultants, warns: "The grizzly bear population in Yellowstone Park and surrounding areas has declined rapidly and will continue to do so if conditions remain unaltered."





NEW YORK (AP) - Alabama's Crimson Tide continued to swell their offensive statistics last week and, in the wake of its 77-6 deleat of Virginia Tech, leads major college football teams in rushing and scoring statistics released today. Alabama had 748 yards rushing and 833 yards total offense Saturday, setting major college records. Even its reserves are doing exceptionally well. The reserves are averaging 249 rushing yards a game. That's a higher average than 105

entire major teams have managed. Alabama's 398.3 rushing average per game barely leads UCLA's 398 average and Oklahoma's 397.3 mark.

Alabaria and UCLA also are one-two in scoring, with the Crimson Tide averaging 45.7 points per game to UCLA's 44.6. Despite 'Alabama's explosive performance against Virginia Tech, Arizona State continues to lead in total offense, averaging 532.4 yards per game, compared to

Alabama's 518.3. Oklahoma is third with 493. Tulsa stayed on top in passing offense statistics with an average of 264.9 yards per game, followed by Brigham Young with 249,3 and Arizona State with 248.7.

Karate can be traced back to the ancient Chinese form of boxing, from which kung fu is also derived. Introduced to the Inited States in the 1950s, it is iolent and aggressive of the Oriental fighting ars, using kicking, punching and blocking techniques for self-defense and

there were 164,800 karate practitioners in the United States in 1972, a jump from 148,000 in 1971, Kung fu practitioners are included in that

JUJITSU

Jujitsu is a method of selfefense using kneeing, striking, olds and chokes, as well as oint-locking techniques. It has seen traced back to 16th Cenury Japanese warriors.

Judo, the "gentle way," was derived from jujitsu in the 1880s by Dr. Jigoro Kano, a slightly built man who developed it in order to subdue larger opponents. It uses holds, boneand throwing echniques. There were approximately 40,000 pracitioners in the United States in 1972, a marked decline from earlier years.

KUNG FU

Kung fu includes all form of Chinese boxing. It has become very popular as a result of the TV series by that name and a number of movies, though no one knows how many of the kung fu schools springing up around the country have dojos (teachers) who really know the ancient art. It employs punching, kicking and blocking

### Civilian Defense Growing

In Wisconsin it's called the Division of Emergency Government, in Washington it's called the Department of Emergency Services, in Delaware it's called the Division of Emergency Planning and Operations, and in California it's known as the Office of Emergency Services. What is it? It's Civil Defense. And along with the new names have come new and broader

"Since 1965 our duties an responsibilities have really changed," said James A Gruentzel, president of the National Association of State

Civil Defense Directors. "Civil Defense programs now encompass such things as natural disasters, the energy crisis, mass population events oil and chemical spills, in addition to nuclear attack preparation," Gruentzel said in

an interview. "We aren't playing down our nuclear attack," he said, "but these other disasters encompass many of the same conditions and our preparations for them will be invaluable if this country is ever attacked." The turning point in the thinking of Civil Defense authorities about diversifying their organization's duties came following the devastating outbreak of tornadoes in the Midwest on Palm Sunday, 1965. According to Gruentzel, state

Civil Defense organizations can step in and supply assistance. leadership and direction anytime there is a pending emergency and there isn't a state agency to handle it. "The backbone of the Civil Defense program in the United States is at the community level," he said. "It is our ob-

jective to have people respond

DEAR HOLE: Of course, one never knows, but I doubt if nose rings will ever catch on in the States.



In Finland, registries for heart attacks, stroke and high blood pressure have been set up. Doctors, newspa-pers, radio and other sources will emphasize publicly the risk factors. Pamphlets are mailed by doctors to opinion eaders such as teachers and union officials. Although the task of changing public taste is staggering, current spot checks indicate much progress has so far been made. In five years, the government, sponsors and the public itself will know how totally effective their efforts have een. Have they been able to nduce the group to stop smoking, decrease reduce high blood pressure. A decrease in the number of heart attacks will be the final

The people of North Karelia will have to make socially acceptable the habit of no smoking anymore, to eat and serve to guests meals with fewer saturated fats in them, and far more vegetables. The new way of life - a wise one and decidedly full of health and promise. Can Americans follow the Finnish lead?
