The findings, which also recommended the repairing of Lake Denmark to accommodate such small explosives as may be stored there safely, have been approved by acting Secretary Robinson, who announced that immediate steps would be taken to carry out the recommendations.

The damage was placed at \$47.-1000,000 and the value of salvageable munitions at \$10,000,000.

The court expressed the opinion that "in the light of present knowledge the area of the lake Denmark depot is too small and its situation too near inhabited land for the safe storage of more than small amounts of high explosives."

"It is to be noted," the findings said, "that every officer attached to the station was on the reservation at the time of the disaster. The evidence shows beyond all doubt that the navy and the mano corps personnel who were killed met their death while heroically carrying out their duty in the face of peril, of which they were thoroughly congnizant."
