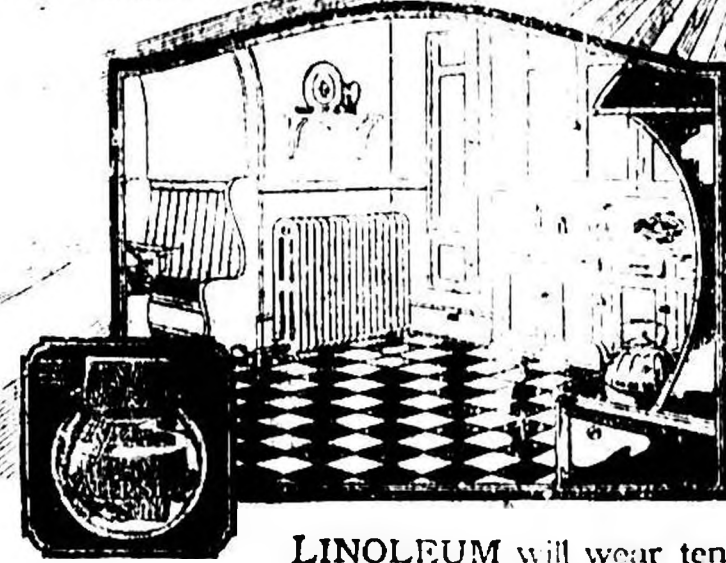

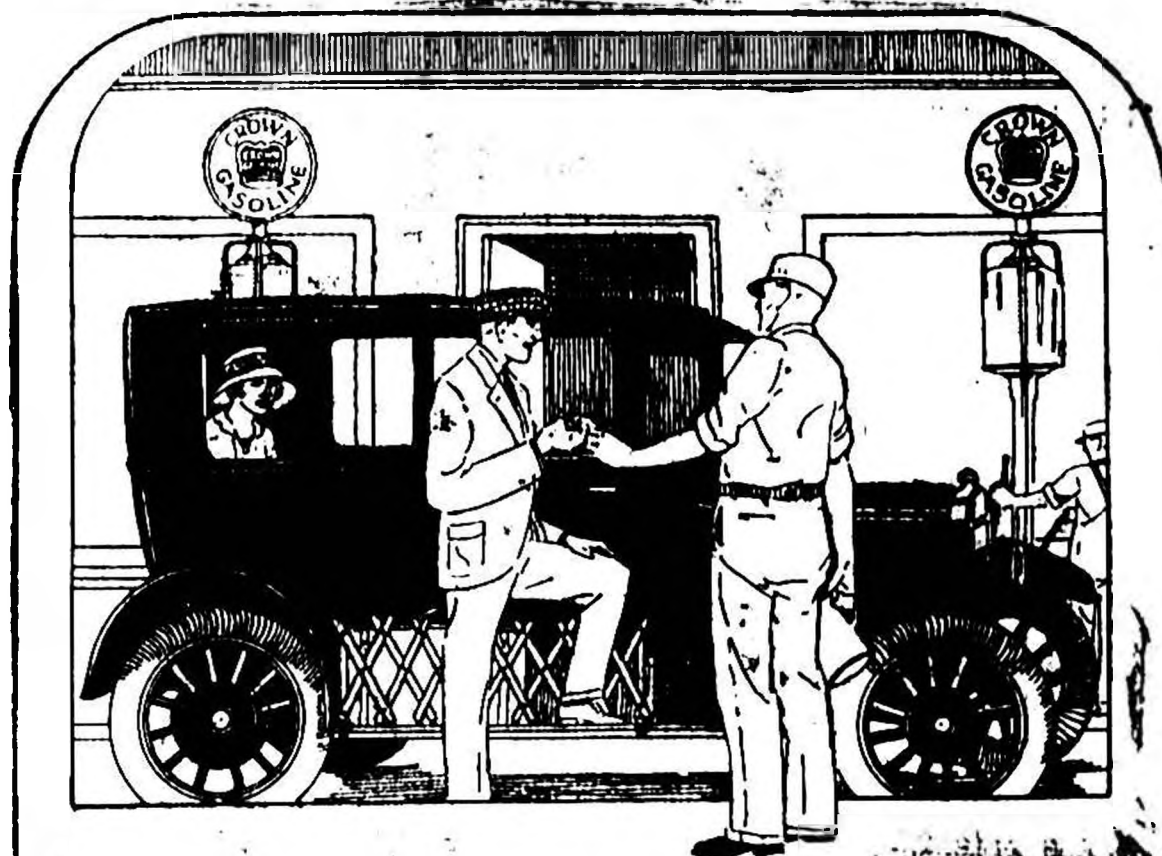

Medical Superstition Still Exists Despite Progress In Science

NEW YORK, Aug. 4. (AP)—Medical superstition, almost as old as civilization itself, still persists in America despite the advance of sciences and in some cases constitutes a real menace.

Religious superstitions of men of letters, combined with the middle class faith in cures and bottled cures, hold back the health of today, the city health commissioner and two physicians of Bellevue Hospital told the Associated Press.

Among the amusing superstitions recalled by Dr. Louis L. Harris, health commissioner, are the use of bread and butter poultices for boils, the tying of a piece of pork about a sore throat, and the many weird Chinese mixtures, made of bugs, herbs, weeds and small animals.

"Babies of Asiatic mothers come in with their eyes heavily ringed with a thick, black substance, rather like graphite," said Dr. J. E. Sutton, of Bellevue Hospital. "On inquiry, they tell us that it is a mysterious mineral that is obtainable only in Beirut, and it makes the babies' eyes strong."

Man Takes Girl From Hospital For Insane

QUINCY, Ill., Aug. 4. (AP)—Headed westward in a dilapidated automobile purchased especially to carry off Bent L. Kitchen, 16-year-old patient from the Jacksonville State Hospital for the Insane, on Monday, David Cooper, 33, got as far as Marble Head, nine miles from here.

Two constables took Cooper, an ex-convict, and the girl in custody as they rattled into town last night. Once in town at the hospital, Cooper had announced he had intended to marry the girl.

The negro has been convicted and sentenced to death Sept. 9.

Bandits At Large; Hunt Reported Better

The negro bandits who held up the U Drive It garage of Reed and Son, and shot R. T. Hut, Saturday night, were still at large today. Several suspects have been detained and held for investigation. Hunt was reported as improving at the Fernand Loughton Memorial hospital.

Approximately \$100 was taken from the cash register by one of the bandits, while his partner in crime held a gun over Hunt and two companions.

Retired Navy Officer Succumbs At DeLand

DELAND, Fla., Aug. 4. (AP)—Dr. E. O. Huntington, 57, retired naval officer with the rank of lieutenant commander, died suddenly in a local hospital early this morning.

Dr. Huntington served in the Spanish-American war and up until 1910, when he was retired. He re-entered the service during the World war. Burial probably will take place in Massachusetts.

Coolidge Wants Arms Parley To Be Successful

PAUL SMITHS, N. Y., Aug. 4. (AP)—President Coolidge was said today to be desirous of doing all possible to assure the success of the General Conference for Arms Limitation.

Asserting that his position was unchanged in favoring arms reductions, officials said he would consider unfortunate any action that might be taken now looking toward any other limitation conference which might become a detriment to the success of the Geneva conference.

Mexican Police Asked To Solve "Miracle"

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 4. (AP)—The police, who have had their hands well enough filled with earthly affairs of late, now have been called upon to investigate a "miracle."

EXPERIENCES OF 1ST TRIP THROUGH EVERGLADES ARE GIVEN HERE

To get beyond this first wall of fire was our objective, and edging up to where the saw grass was thinnest we waited until the wind lulled a little and then with one dash went through it. We now pushed our way toward the island, fighting fires every hundred yards or so, knowing that if the wind held and the saw grass burned with its usual fury there would soon be behind us a clear path to our boats.

I was very weary after building fires and forcing my way through the underbrush for a mile or so my strength completely gave out. I stopped in a lagoon where the water was nearly waist deep, while Mr. Newman went on making fires toward the island. On all sides the grass was burning with a fury that I have never seen equalled; to my rear the smoke and flames completely hid the boats and the men attempting to bring them forward. Then the fires knifed ahead swung toward me and but for the buoy in which I stood would have burned me up.

I thought little of the fire but of the dreadful fatigue, a sense of faintness came over me, and the saw grass went round and round in the most strange fashion. I felt that I could stand no longer and wading toward where the water should a little I sat down. Oh how good it was to rest. The severe exertion I had undergone was too much for me and the faintness was succeeded by a deathly sickness, and made me feel I would have to stretch out full length in the mud. After resting in the mud the best part of two hours my strength somewhat returned, and the clouds of smoke having rolled away, I could see that the men had abandoned the boats and were struggling on each with a pack on his back.

Nothing but stern necessity could have compelled me to move, but realizing that I must reach that island before night I gathered up my strength and crawled slowly on. Never did I shrink in a manner eye the distant land with more pleasure than I looked at that island. The smoke had cleared away and there it lay in front of me, not more than a mile away.
