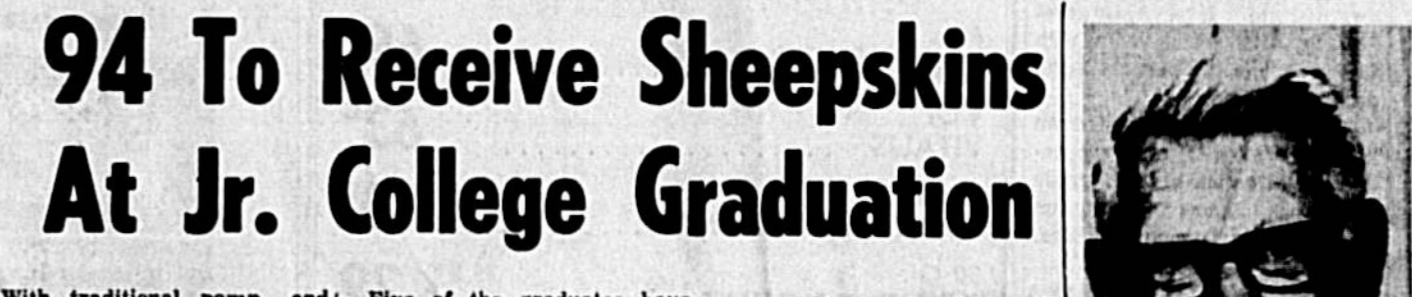

'Too Many Demos,' Says GOP

"I'm running on the record of the Republican Legislature and Republican administration," Rep. E. Pope Bassett declared before a packed audience at a rally held at the Altamonte Springs Community House last night.

"The record was not a perfect one only because there were too many Democrats up there in Tallahassee," Bassett said. "That problem will be solved in the elections this November." He cited as a major accomplishment of the Republican party the creation of the Florida Bureau of Law Enforcement.

Confrontation of the evening was between Sheriff Peter Millitt and his opponent for the party nomination, James P. Avery Jr.

Millitt pledged an all-out effort to continue modernizing his department including new facilities for detention of juveniles. At the same time Avery hit at waste in government and insisted the sheriff's department budget is adequate.

In the only other head-on meeting of opposing primary candidates, H. D. Shinn, of Longwood, seeking the party office for constable, district six, pointed out politics and law enforcement do not mix and stated his record in law enforcement speaks for itself.

His opponent, Robert Jans, of Altamonte Springs, meanwhile, stated he would supply radio vehicles to the sheriff's department and that he was being financially independent and further that he had no need for the salary of the office.

Others speaking were: Henry Schumaker, candidate district 1 County Commissioner; "I can supply common sense, imagination and business-like judgment to the office."

Daylight Time Arrives Sunday

MIAMI (AP) - Daylight saving time, voted into Florida by the legislature last year amid a storm of controversy, rolls around again at 2 A.M. Sunday.

That means that before going to bed Saturday night the hands of the clock should be turned forward one hour.

It also means that you may drive to work in darkness, but when you get home you'll have an extra hour of sunlight.

The arguments against DST aren't heard so much any more, but a lot of people still don't like it. Among them are the mothers who will have to awaken young children when it's still dark and send them to bed when it's light.

DST was invented in England, which gets much more daylight than Florida does because it's closer to the North Pole. Britain's summer sun rises about 4 1/2 hours later than the sun here at 5 A.M. doesn't bother anyone much.

In Miami, DST moves the sun rise up to about 6:30 a.m.

New Lyman High Bids To Be Opened Today

Hugh C. Wheelchel Rites Held Today

Funeral services were held this afternoon for Hugh C. Wheelchel Sr. of Sanford, who died Tuesday.

Considered by many to be Sanford's greatest sportsman, Mr. Wheelchel in his youth was lauded for his athletic abilities particularly in the sports of football and baseball. In his later life, he was an avid hunter, a "good golfer who carried a 13 handicap" and he could also shoot "a mean game of pool."

He was the only man in history to make All Southern four years in a row at the University of Georgia and the only southern football player that Grantland Rice ever mentioned on his All American team. He placed Mr. Wheelchel on his All American second team but recognized four years afterward that he had not listed him with the first team. Mr. Wheelchel was further recognized as the best farm boy in the state of Georgia in 1921.

Of his noted accomplishments with the University of Georgia team was his blocking 11 punts in one football game and the fact that he never took time out one single time in four years of play.

Newspaper accounts at the time of Mr. Wheelchel's fantastic football career said, "In four years he blocked 11 punts. I've never heard of anybody else doing that. Wheelchel went through that snap like an enraged buffalo and his flailing arms beat the ball to the ground. The ball would hit Wheelchel's hands which were like peanut-rod hams."

Known affectionately as "Tiny Puss" Wheelchel, some said he was "the dirtiest, mean-

U. S. In Fog On Air Defense Against Reds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Air Force and civilian analysts still sharply in a Pentagon intelligence dispute already casting a shadow over U.S. plans to defend against Soviet bombers of the 1970s.

Recalling at issue is the soundness of a national-level assessment that the Soviet will not develop a super-sonic strategic bomber with far-reaching range during the next few years.

Gen. John P. McConnell, Air Force chief of staff, thinks they will and argues the United States should build some new 2,000-mile-per-hour interceptors able to shoot them down.

But Robert S. McNamara, just before he left office as secretary of defense, decided indications were that the Soviet bomber threat actually would decline. He rejected the Air Force's requested interceptor, the F12.

Instead, McNamara went along with his civilian planners who figured \$1 billion could be saved if the Air Force put a new missile system in an existing fighter, the F106, part of the present air defense network.

Although this plan was developed in the 1950s, cost-effectiveness studies showed that the souped-up version known as the F106 would be just as good as the Mach 3 F12. If a few hundred miles an hour slower, McNamara also based his thinking on the National Intelligence Estimate (NIE) of what the Soviets might be expected to do in the area of strategic bombers between now and 1970.

Landmark 121 Years

NEW YORK (AP) — The city's only living official landmark is an immigrant, a tree brought here in a floppert in 1847 from Europe.

The tree is a 60-foot-tall Weeping Beech, which stands on its own city park in the Flushing area of Queens.

In 1966 the newly established Landmarks Preservation Commission proclaimed the Weeping Beech an official city landmark.

The living landmark grew from a shoot purchased in 1847 by Samuel B. Parsons, a Flushing nurseryman, while he was touring Europe looking for rare plants.

The city's landmark tree is rare almost a grove by itself. In summer, its pillar-like, olive-gray trunk is hidden inside the green cavern formed by the drooping branches. Where the branches have touched the ground they have taken root. The outer perimeter of the tree is more than 80 feet in diameter.

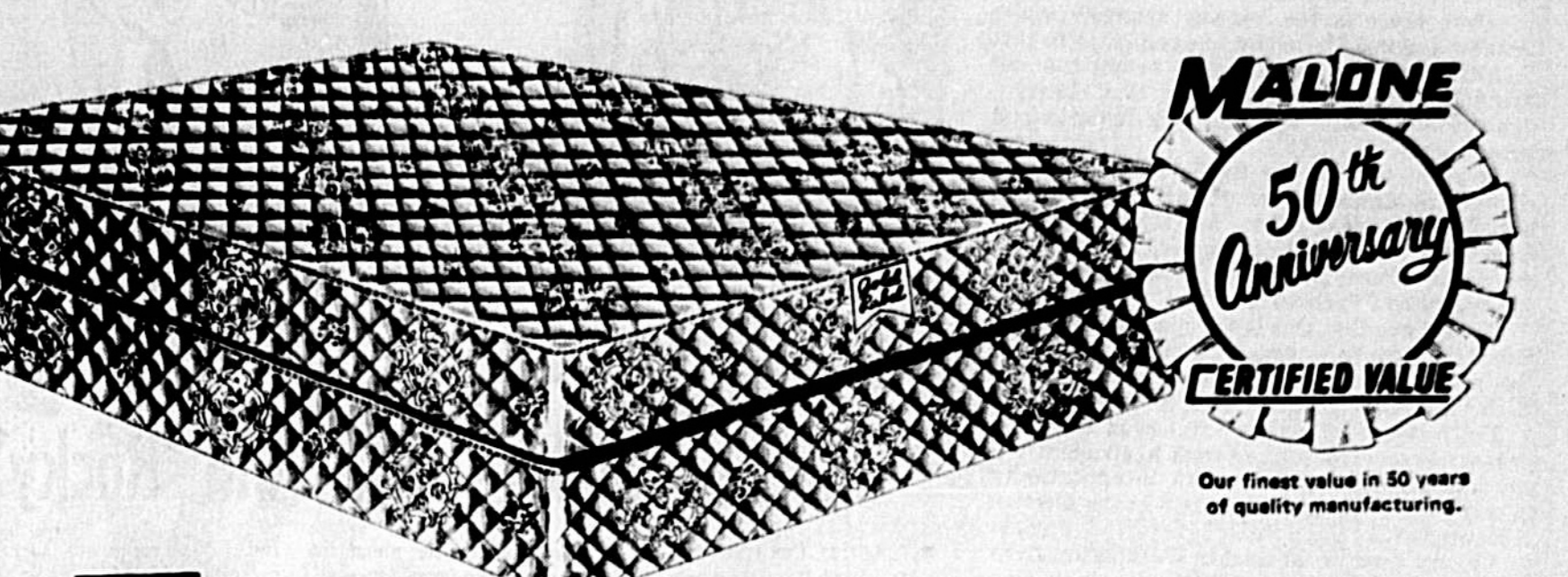

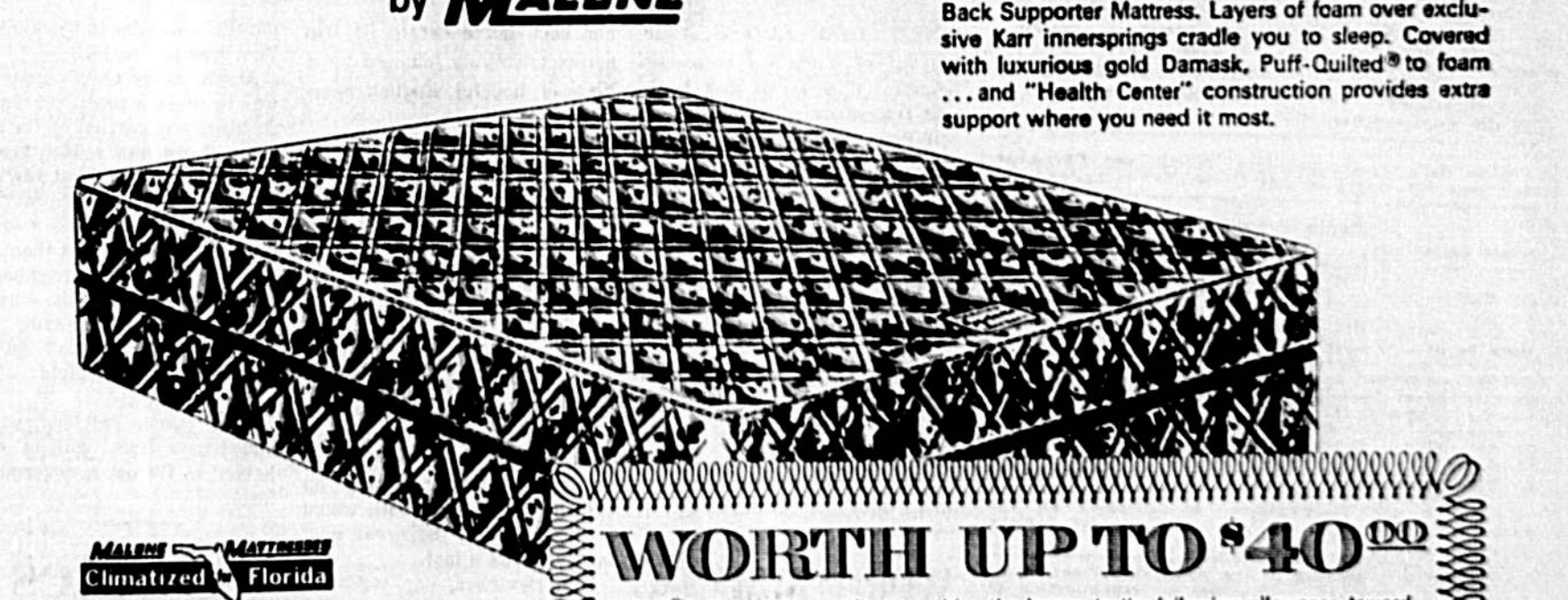

S. Viets Act To Cut Off Reds

SARON (AP) — South Vietnamese paratroopers have moved close to the A Shau Valley in a new operation to cut off North Vietnamese supply and infiltration routes, military officials said today.

The move could be the start of a major allied push against the North Vietnamese supply route along the border of Laos in the north-west part of South Vietnam.

Allied forces have not moved into the valley in force in the two years since North Vietnamese troops overran the U.S. Special Forces camp at A Shau and turned the valley into their biggest supply base in South Vietnam.

After a week-long search of the valley by U.S. 101st Airborne Division paratroopers, nearly 2,000 South Vietnamese paratroopers launched Operation Lam Son 719 in the valley last week. The operation was aimed at cutting off the supply route from Laos to the A Shau Valley.

The U.S. Command said U.S. paratroopers in the valley have destroyed 10 North Vietnamese trucks and 100 tons of supplies. They also destroyed 10 North Vietnamese trucks and 100 tons of supplies.

Two U.S. helicopters crashed in the northern end of the valley. One, a U.S. Marine chopper, crashed at Phu Bai while landing. Two of the crew were injured, and some nearby aircraft were damaged.

A U.S. medical helicopter sent to evacuate wounded from the A Shau valley crashed near the demilitarized zone and two crew members were killed. The evacuation flight was ordered after 30 rounds of enemy artillery fire hit the hospital.

North Vietnamese were seen in the valley on Wednesday night. A U.S. spokesman said the shelling caused light casualties and light damage.

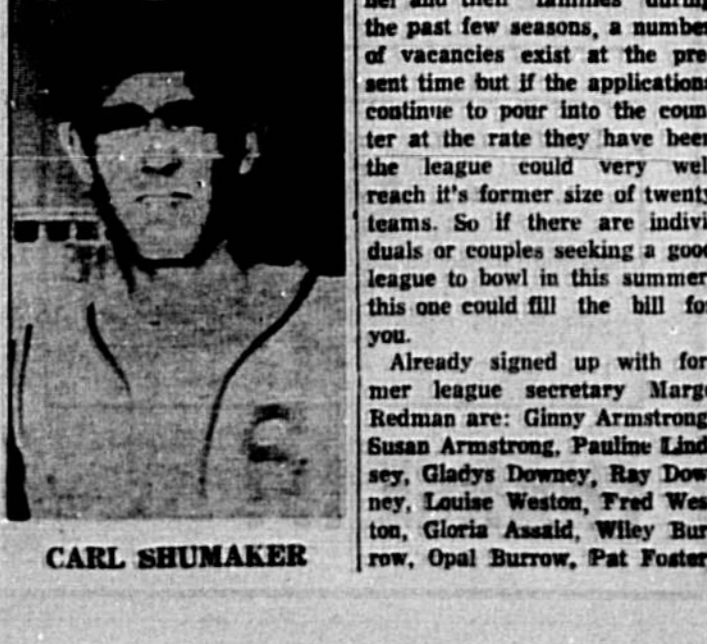
