Rapprochement With Cuba Dubious

A rising chorus of voices, in the United States and abroad, is calling for rapprochement between the United States and Cuba. The calls have come from the political left and the political right, from publications as well as individuals.

Most of these parties seem to feel that the United States is at fault for the failure of the two countries to move toward accord. Overlooked is the fact that Cuba has shown no interest in rapprochement and, that Cuban propagandists rarely pass up an excuse to assail the United States, and specifically President Nixon.

The latest political figure to speak is U.S. Senate Democratic Whip Robert Byrd who said, "If talks can begin with China, a nation which we fought on the battlefields of Korea not too long ago, then we can begin to talk to the Cubans."

Even Costa Rican President Jose Figueres, who was once publicly assailed by Premier Fidel Castro at a moment when he was Castro's guest, has offered to serve as a mediator between Cuban exiles (and presumably the United States) and Castro.

Much, Much Good From Satellites

Every day, the nation's earth resources satellite, called ERTS, makes 160 orbits of the globe—4 of them crossing parts of the United States. Its photographic mapping of the world may produce a quantum leap forward in our understanding of resources at a time when the use of space seems to be approaching critical limits.

There have been a few fairly detailed news stories about some of the findings of ERTS, but they have hardly scratched the surface. Out at the Goddard Space Flight Center in nearby Maryland, more than 35,000 color prints have already piled up as results pour in from the tireless ERTS. The accumulation will soon be mountainous.

It is no exaggeration to say that, with the swift aid of computer analysis of ERTS pictures, we are in process of learning more about every patch of the earth's surface than has ever been known before.

Every acre of presently used farmland, whether cultivated or in pasture, can be studied. The photographs, taken from a height of 570 miles, detect the kind and condition of crops and the types of pasture grasses. They show, of course, where crops are failing because of disease or unfavorable weather.

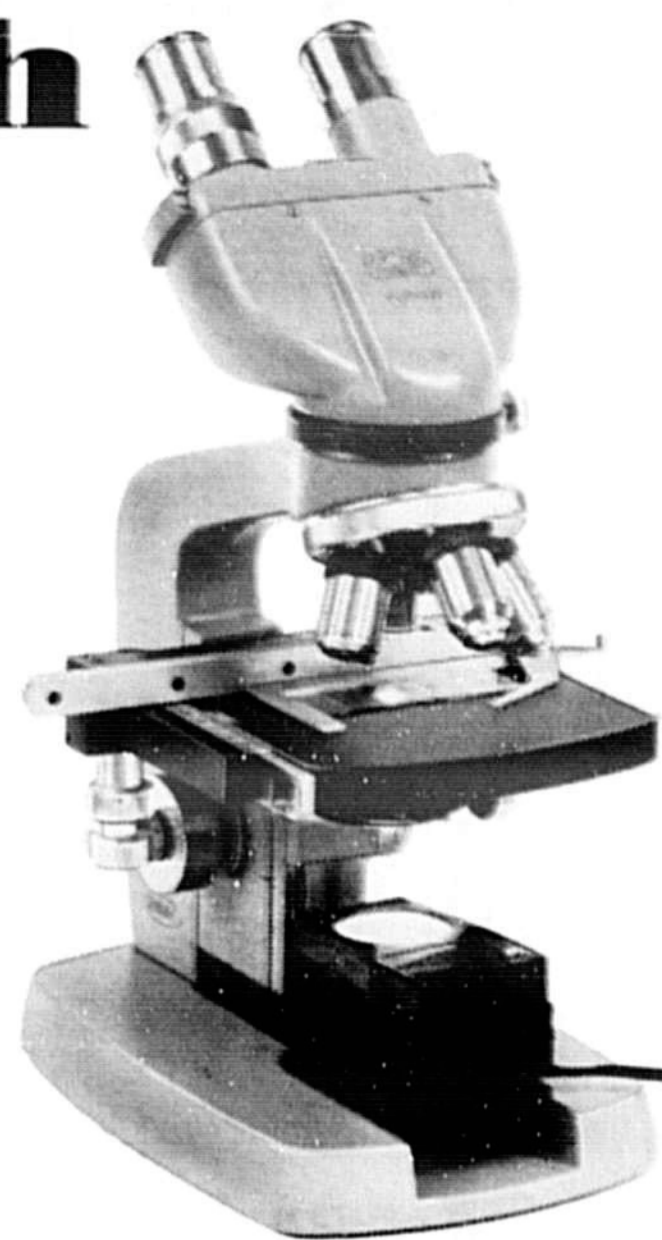
