



God's Whisper

I Kings 19:11-12: And he said, "Go forth, and stand upon the mount before the Lord." And behold, the Lord passed by. and a great and strong wind rent the mountains, and broke in pieces the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; after the fire a still small voice.

We live in an age of speed, outstanding events, big noise, big bombs, and we have come to expect things to happen as fast as lightning and with a big disturbance like thunder. It is difficult to find anything to hold our attention because we are so used to big "happenings" that we can't even be entertained inexpensively anymore! But how does God do

Fearing Queen Jezebel, Elijah the prophet fled to Beersheba, sat down under a juniper tree, and wished that he were dead. God decided to teach this discouraged prophet a lesson: Elijah was shown the wind, earthquake, and fire, but God was not speaking through those cataclysmic events. Then Elijah heard a whisper, a "still small voice," barely discernible - and it was the voice of God! Elijah wanted results in a big way; but the big way is not always God's way We also often shout for miracles, make big demands, and become impatient not realizing that God is answering prayer, whispering, grinding slowly.

President Nixon said in his 1968 inaugural speech that we are "shouting at each other so loudly that we can't hear what is said!" We must all learn to listen for the whispered message - especially for the whisper of God!

In our dealings with others, we would be impressive, powerful, noisy as thunder and bright as fire, but God whispers to each man or woman he speaks to.

In college, the big men often failed, while the little men, the workers, succeeded. All the big money, popularity, and fame go to movie and TV stars, big-name athletes, etc., but relatively few of these people have ever used their fives to save a soul; many of them, by their ungodly influence, have helped to condemn souls. But the unsung men and women through whom God whispers are doing God's work.

Obeying God's whisper may mean that we will have to sacrifice. John Evans, a professor at Lincoln Christian College, told of how, during his trip behind the iron curtain, he saw 20,000 Christian preachers who had no Bibles, but were still clinging to their faith, and leading others at the risk of punishment, all because they had heard God's whisper. We never know where God's whisper might lead us.

But obeying God's whisper always means victory. Elijah wanted either a miracle or death; he heard God's whisper instead, and Ahab and Jezebel were defeated. The Devil is loud and screams; but we can defeat Satan by following the whisper of God.

God's whisper reaches into our future lives. There is not a person reading this article who has not thought and worried over tomorrow. When our lives are confused and in despair. we need God's whisper. And when we will "be still and know that He is God," that whisper will become like a shout: "In this world you will have tribulation; be of good cheer, I have overcome the world;" and, "If any man will follow after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow me. Do you hear God's whisper in your life?



Editorial Comment

The Complicated Eagleton Issue

Seeking clarity, distortion has resulted Indeed, the selection and nomination of Senator Thomas Eagleton of Missouri by Democratic presidential nominee Senator George McGovern as his running mate has produced an issue which could and should have been avoided.

But it exists. It has to do with the 42-year-old Missourian's physical ability to withstand excessive pressures - both physical and mental As clearly stated as it is now possible with the information available, Senator Eagleton had been forced to seek hospitalization and psychiatric counsel and shock treatment in the 60s. Since 1966 he has been in fine shape.

But — and this is a big BUT — he did not advise Senator McGovern of these facts when he was offered the nomination at the Miami Beach convention. If - and this is an equally big IF the Democratic nominee had known them, would he have selected Eagleton?

Characteristically the McGovern answer now is "yes." With his own life-long character of seeing things clearly and speaking out without subterfuge, no other attitude could be expected.

Extreme pressure is now being exerted on the McGovern managers, as well as the Senator, to re-evaluate the Eagleton nomination. For the Democratic drive to oust President Richard M. Nixon from the White House by popular vote in November permits not the slightest weakness in

Fortunately or unfortunately, depending on the point of view, the American voter demands that the men or women seeking these high offices be, like Ceasar's wife, "above suspicion."

Especially is this true when those who are heading an effort, which the Democrats have initiated to bring self-government back to the grass-roots, are concerned. For confidence is the cornerstone on which all such reform movements either survive or fail.

Whether or not the current Eagleton issue will become a liability to the McGovern ticket, already confronted with the biggest challenges which even the usually diversified Democrats have ever faced, as some believe or an asset as an example of full honest, exposure, as others are beginning to conclude, time (and there is not much of that) will determine.

More than 250 telephone counseling services to help troubled people have sprung up, in every state in the

"Crisis intervention centers, telephone counseling serv ices, hot lines, help lines, lifelines-by whatever name, the procedure of counseling the troubled by telephone is flourishing across the country," says Edwin Kiester Jr. reporting on his study of the new development in a recent issue of Family Health magazine. Many provide specialized help such as drug counseling. advice on youth problems, companionship for the elderly.


suicide prevention. Others do no counseling but tell callers

where they can go for assistance. Originally intended for teen-agers, the first hot line was started by Children's Hospital of Los Angeles to enable oung people to talk anonymously with sympathetic adults when they felt cut off from their own parents. Other agencies quickly saw the technique as a way to combat drug usage and drug hot lines were soon operating in many metropolitan areas and university towns. providing the names of rehabilitation services and other

At Stony Brook, Long Island, the human-to-human hot line is called "Response" and is sponsored by the United Ministries of Suffolk County. In Philadelphia, "Help Line" was organized at a "street people's" headquarters to help teen-agers with drug-

In New York City, another "Help Line" is operated by Marble Collegiate Church and is one of 24 such church sponsored services in the nation.

"We don't have barn-raisings and other events to help each other any more," says a volunteer at "Response, The hot line is one way we can show people they do have friends, that other people really do care about them."

Everytime we stopped for lunch our daughter Theresa fed Tweetie his bread and milk and he was perfectly contented.

The beautiful hills in Mississippi and Alabama faded into absolute flatland in the section of Louisiana we went through. Incidentally signs advertised Texas real estate for sale at \$233 per acre. The landscape changed from a beautiful green to a red stark appearance between Wichita Falls and

New Mexico near Albuquerque was very mountainous and looked somewhat like North Carolina and Pennsylvania. We were disappointed in our crossing of the Rio Grande in New Mexico. It was completely dry there and its red clay bottom was cracked open.

Indian Territory

Further west in the state we saw the impossible conditions under which the Navajo Indians live on reservations in adobe houses nestled in groups along the sides of rock mountains. There was no body of water anywhere and it would be impossible to grow anything in the desert soil. The mountains looked as though a giant hand had carved them in layers from rock. Near the reservation area where we stayed overnight, we saw two elderly women in native garb with long skirts to the ankles walking home from church. It sprinkled rain for just a few moments and an older Indian couple settled beneath a tree to wait out the welcome rain.

Going through the Mojave Desert into California was a nightmare of heat. Theresa cooled Tweetie's cage by covering it with a wet towel and continually rubbing ice over

We finally got to our son and daughter-in-law's home on the edge of the desert near Edwards Air Force Base. While there we went into Los Angeles briefly. It was 112 degrees that day. We got to see Grauman's Chinese Theatre and a wax museum and were grateful to get back to Tracy's home and the air-conditioning. We also went for a picnic on Crestline Mountain in the San Bzrnardino National Forest and on a shopping excursion.

Great Expectations

We found our daughter-in-law, Christine, to be an exceptionally good cook and homemaker and also to our delight that we can look forward to our first grandchild come late fall

We left California at night to escape the heat of the desert, but it didn't cool off until we were out of California, Nevada and a good ways into Utah. Las Vegas was one of the prettiest sights we have ever seen. At night it looks like a giant Christmas tree. Then on to Wyoming, Nebraska, Iowa where corn was growing everywhere, Illinois where we went through Chicago, Indiana, Ohio and to Pennsylvania at last. In Pennsylvania we found a heat wave and air pollution

in abundance. We also found my father in the hospital. He had flown from Miami to McKeesport when he became ill. The air pollution readings there were 126 and person's





city in increased revenues over expectation. Klosky was told to have the packer checked out mechanically and to report back to Council its condition as well as where the funds can be obtained to pay for the truck. A new truck of this sort would cost \$8,000 to \$13,000, Fisher

Construction is expected to begin Monday and be concluded in a month to five weeks on the expansion to the west of the city hall to provide office space for the mayor, building inspector and water clerk.

Council last night on recommendation of architect Richard Bennett accepted the low bid of the Richardson Company of Longwood for the expansion at \$7,200 contingent upon the company acquiring a city license, posiing performance bonds and meeting liability insurance requirements and the successful completion of changeorders to expand the addition another five feet.

Donation Pledged

Following a 45-minute presentation on drug problems with young people in the area, City Council approved donation of \$500 to the Seminole Drug Action Committee last night to become the third city in the county to give funds for the committee. Last week Casselberry approved donation of \$800 while Winter Springs approved \$500.

According to Mayor Kenneth Brown, City Atty. S. Joseph Davis Jr. ruled that the city can legally denate the moneys. In the past, Davis has ruled against donation of moneys except for advertising purposes. Some months ago he have the opinion the city could not legally fund the city's junior

Sheriff Trial Opens;

(AP) - As the second-degree murder case of suspended Lake County Sheriff Willis McCall goes to trial, the news media is under a court warning that an editorial campaign to convict the defendant could lead to a contempt citation. Florida Supreme Court Justice James C. Adkins, assigned to preside over the highly publicized trial, was scheduled to consider motions in a hearing here today. One motion expected was a change of venue request to try the sheriff outside his rural home county

County jail inmate.
