Administrator Threat Of Legal Action Is Criticized By Firm As Act Of Injustice

DETROIT, Oct. 27.—(A.P.) -The Ford Motor Company today described as "An act of injustice" a statement of Recovery Administrator Hugh Johnson that he would "Turn the case over to the Attorney-General" if Henry Ford fails to submit figures requested by the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce, under the terms of the NRA auto code.

Johnson intimated that the deadling would be Nov. 7, but he muticined that he was not defioly certain that the date would the one fixed.
