Seminole County economy remains strong

SANFORD - The newly-identified nationwide recession did not stop the Metro Orlando Economic Development Commission Tuesday from detailing Seminole County's bright economic growth to county commissioners.

Graded with three economic indicators primary job creation, office and industrial space rates and export sales growth - MOEDC president Ray Gilley said Seminole is in the midst of strong economic growth.

Seminole is having its best year ever for cent in the county since last year and up

Primary job creation up 8 percent from last year local economists say

primary job creation, said Gilley. An 8 percent increase from last year has created 1.520 new jobs in the county — 500 in software and programming jobs with an average salary of \$64,000.

We've had great success in the region attracting high-wage jobs," Gilley said. Office space value is up roughly 19 per-

Industrial space is also up with an 11 percent increase over the last year and nearly a 50 percent increase from five years ago. The U.S. Department of Commerce has also identified the Orlando metro area as the fastest growing export market in the state the last three years, said Gilley.

End of an Era

Son of inventor of Snappin' Turtle mower sells business

SANFORD — A local man closed a chapter last month on one of Sanford's most heralded

Mike Smith, son of the late Snappin' Turtle Lawnmower inventor Alexander "Smitty" Smith, sold the family business in October, but the memory of Sanford's claim to fame in the lawn grooming industry will never fade.

In the middle 1940s, Alexander Smith built the first prototypes of the revolutionary awnmower that was shaped like a snapping turtle. With dia-mond-plated steel, self-propulsion and the head of a turtle at the front, the lawnmower prototype quickly became a popular

"He built the prototypes right here in Sanford," Mike said. "They sold out the patent rights to McDonahue Power Company of Georgia around 1950. It was actually easy to use. You could fight it, but if you let it go, it would do a beautiful job."

That first line of Snappin' Turtle lawnmov/ers conceived in Sanford became the national brand known as Snapper. McDonahue Power Company still produces a Snapper line of yard equipment, which includes lawnmowers and snow blowers. Like his big time Georgia buyer, Alexander also dabbled with different equipment other than the lawnmower.

During the lawnmower inventions, Alexander also maintained a Sanford factory, B

& S Manufacturing, of about 25 employees, which primarily built edgers, Mike said.

"Then he got into the citrus equipment with the under-thetree hoe," his son said.

The mechanical cultivator would till the ground underneath orange trees, preventing weeds to grow. The machine was adapted for the grape vines in California and the apple trees in Virginia, but the machine's popularity died with the introduction of herbicides.

"All of that was made here in Sanford until the early 80s," Mike said.

Mike and his wife, Connie, bought Smitty's Lawnmowers from Alexander in 1981, but the factory ceased operations after his death in the early 80s.

"One of the things I remember most is he would come

home with a new lawnmower and I would mow the lawn with it," he said. "He was always bringing something new home. All it took was for someone to say they had a need for something and he would make

With more than 100 patents to his name, Alexander Smith could possibly be the Alexander Graham Bell of Sanford. Other inventions include a 60-foot long, 8-foot tall, huge bucket cit-rus field irrigation ditch cleaner and WWII government patents for engine assembly of war crafts. However, like all great inventors, some projects were left unfinished and some just didn't cut the mustard. Mike said he distinctly remembers his father's work on developing an

orange picker. "Some worked, but never

well enough to market," he said.

After he got out of the business, Mike said his father continued his thirst for inventing as he remembers one working model; a parking structure conveyor that would stack cars in a parking garage without actually diving them up all the ramps.

"It takes a special kind of erson to become an inventor it consumes just about all of

your thoughts," he said.
"A lot of these old-timers would come in and still remember my dad," he added. "He was a well liked man in the city. We've dealt with a lot of different people and generations through the years."





sion plans to help Seminole, Orange, Lake and Osceola continue to diversify their economy by maintaining a strong workforce in new areas such as technology and continuing to seek private funds for economic development. Over the past year, MOEDC has doubled private capital to reflect 59 percent of its total income, said Gilley.

In addition to the strong ecoriomic figures, representatives of the MOEDC also announced Tuesday that several more companies are considering Seminole County a place to call home. Included in the list is a pallet making machinery company considering Sanford and Lake Mary, a technical support center eyeing Lake Mary and a plastic bag manufacturer weighing the opportunities in Sanford.

Commissioner Randy Morris said he was pleased the MOEDC honored a commitment they made to the board a year ago to have a larger percentage of funding from the private sector.

"I hope next year's report will

include the Sanford International Airport and 17/92," Morris said, "Those are the two number one priorities of this commission."

"We are looking for good things from the EDC in assisting us in those two areas," said Commissioner Daryl McLain who was also elected by commissioners as the board's newest chairman Tuesday.

amount of citations: 95 speeding citations, 31 moving violations, 108 non-moving violations and 28 criminal citations. Approximately 80 of the non-moving violations were for no seat belt, said Guildford.

"We do a survey before the operation and about 65 percent were wearing seatbelts," Guildford said. "[After the operation,] another survey had about 70 percent, but most drivers will just go back to not wearing it. The only way to really prevent it (drivers not wearing seatbelts) is to make it a primary violation."


Florida is one of the few southeastern states that requires law enforcement officers to cite another violation before issuing a safety belt citation.

According to Buckle Up

Florida, the state is currently at a 69.5 percent usage rate, while the national average is 73 percent. By climbing to the national average, an estimated 83 lives, 1,740 injuries and approximately \$150 million could be saved in just one year, states the safety belt lobbying group.







to support a project, Walter was the man you wanted to talk to," Moore said. "If you needed to get something done, you went to Walter."

Jack Horner served as executive director of the Chamber of Commerce for 13 years and worked closely with Gielow. He noted that Gielow's activism and that of his wife, Winifred "Bill" Gielow — was honored with the presentation of the Chamber's Topper Award.

"Walter Gielow and his wife, Bill, were a part of almost every major community project in this town," Horner said. "I'm talking about the creation of the Port Authority, Holiday Isle and the creation of the Golden Age Games. We couldn't have done any of it without Walter's help. Sanford owes him a great debt of gratitude."

Wayne Doyle was named publisher of the Herald upon Gielow's retirement on June 2, 1974. Doyle said there was

never any doubt about Glelow's

newspaper philosophy.
"What was good for the community was good for the news-paper," Doyle said. "He very much believed in this communi-

Born in Michigan City, Ind. on May 30, 1911, Gielow moved to Florida when he was a teenager and graduated from Orlando High School in 1929. His news paper career began when he delivered newspapers and worked his way up the ladder, starting at the Orlando Sentinal and the Evening Reporter Star.

His musical aptitudes prompted him to play the table. in a boy's band sponsored by the Evening Star. His love of adventure led him to tour with the band including playing at the inauguration of President Herbert Hoover in Washington, D.C. The same band of 100 boys eventually grew to 400.

and later bought the Mertinsville and later bought the Martinsville (Virginia) Bulletin where he employed Walter as mechanical superintendent. Promotions to advertising manages and assistant to the publisher followed.

After Haskell purchased the Sanford Herald, he promoted Gielow to publisher in 1958 where he remained until his

where he remained until his retirement in 1974, for a total of

16 years of the 50 years he spent in the newspaper business. Gielow considered one of his major accomplishments, was the planning and building of the new Sanford Herald on French Avenue that is now the Seminole Herald. The building was first occupied in July, 1966 and newspapers were delivered six days weekly.

Doyle said during the 1960s as Gielow was making plans to expand the Herald operations, the Navy was closing the air sta-

"Sunland was practically empty," Doyle said. "You'd drive out 20th Street and all those homes were for sale. Did Walter cut back his plans to grow the Herald? Absolutely not. He had faith in the commuhity. He finished the new Herald building and put in bigger

Frank Voltoline, a 42-year vet-eran at the Herald, remembers when the newspaper moved from its 1st Street offices in July

"When Gielow put that press in, that was a big move for us," Voltoline said. "Up to that point, we could only print one 12-page section at a time. Our annual Progress edition was 140 pages, so you can imagine how long it took to print. With the new presses, we could print 40-someodd pages in three sections at one time.

After his marriage to his wife, Winifred "Bill", in the First Presbyterian Church in 1959, Glelow hired her as the newspa-per controller. Together, there was no stopping this unbeat-able team. They promoted the chamber, the Salvation Army and dozens of other organiza-tions including the Seminole Mutual Concert Association.




But the rest of the 10-man squad has no varsity experience.





r vv C addresses marine-illefeeding and manatee issues

TALLAHASSEE - The Plorida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) voted Thursday to ban marine-life feeding by divers and dive tour operators.

Marine-life feeding by divers surfaced as a concern two years ago when a south Florida group told Commissioners divers who feed sharks and other marine species may pose a public safety hazard. Numerous environmental groups believe the practice could alter the natural feeding behavior of marine species.

After two years of study and five public hearings, Commissioners concluded the practice of marine-life feeding is not in the best interest of marine life or the public and adopted the new rule, which takes effect

jan. 1. Commissioners also directed staff to investigate the merits of petitions to reclassify the West Indian manatee from endangered to threatened and the Panama City crayfish from species of special concern to threatened. Criteria for listing under the three classifications include population levels, confinement to a limited range, probability of extinction within the next few years and other factors. Petitioners believe the manatee may no longer meet the criteria for listing as endangered, and the crayfish may warrant a higher level of protection than afforded under the species of special concern classification.

After FWC staff completes preparation of a biological status report, a panel of scientists from outside the FWC will review the staff's conclusions and make recommendations. Staff will then create a management plan for the affected species. The full process may require up to two years to complete.

Commissioners also passed a rule to reduce the daily bag limit on snook from two fish to one and add May to the summer closed season on snook on Florida's Gulf Coast, effective Jan. 1. The new rule does not apply to snook fishing on the state's East Coast.

Snook on the Atlantic Coast are faring better under current management practices, but high fishing pressure on the Gulf Coast has held the population below the desired level.

In other marine fisheries action, the Commission voted to extend the current moratorium on the issuance of marine life endorsements (permits for commercial collection of ornamental

fish) through June 30, 2005. In addition, Commissioners

reviewed and discussed their artificial-reef-ship policy and various federal issues, including a proposal to require persons selling swordfish in Fiorida to have a valid federal permit and to specify a minimum size limit of 47 inches lower-jaw fork length for any swordfish harvested from state waters or possessed in Florida.

The Commission directed staff to develop a proposed rule to allow commercial fishermen to possess 50 undersized lobsters (shorts) plus one short per trap on board a vessel to use as attractants to harvest legal-sized spiny lobsters. Commissioners also directed staff to conduct additional research and work with the lobster industry to develop appropriate specifications for wire used to construct traps. The FWC will schedule public workshops and develop a proposed rule to allow the sale of imported spiny lobster in Florida during the closed sea-

The FWC directed staff to draft proposed rules to establish a sponge-harvesting endorsement on the Saltwater Products License, and prohibit harvest of any commercial sponges measuring less than five inches (measured crosswise from the top of the sponge), and allow harvest of bay scallops between the Suwannee and Weeki Wachee rivers during the 2002 open season, and prohibit harvest of bay scallops west of St. Joseph Bay.

Commissioners also directed staff to hold a final public hearing in January on a proposed rule to reduce the statewide requirement for bait shrimp live well tanks in wholesale or retail dealer storage facilities from 64 cubic feet of water to 32 cubic feet of continuously aerated. saline water. Commission staff will prepare final drafts of rules to address federal and local issues and consider them for final action after public hearings at future meetings.

Regarding inland issues, Commissioners voted for reestablishment of the Upper St. Johns Marsh Type II Wildlife Management Area (WMA) adding 2,733 acres, and the Lake Wales Ridge Wildlife and Environmental Area (WEA) adding 319 acres.

Land acquisition items approved by the Commission included: the 2,121-acre Pal Mar Tract adjacent to the Hungryland WEA, a nine-acre addition to the Little Gator Creek WEA and three parcels, totaling 54 acres, as additions to the Yucca Pens Unit of the Babcock-Webb WMA. In addition, Commissioners approved the addition of two tracts for addition to the FWC Florida Forever acquisition list so purchase negotiations can begin. The tracts include two billboard easements totaling 0.21 acres on the Chassahowitzka WMA and 7,068 acres adjacent to the Aucilla WMA.

Commissioners also delegated authority to the FWC's executive director to approve future additions to the FWC Florida Forever acquisitions list. The Commission would have the opportunity to continue or to terminate acquisitions at the next meeting.

Commissioners also delegated to the executive director authority to approve land acquisitions of less than \$250,000 after notice to the individual Commissioners. Any

Commissioner could, however, elect to have the approval decision brought before the Commission.

Staff reports to the Commission included: minimum flows and levels for Florida river systems, a marketing plan for Florida Wildlife magazine, a strategy for positioning Florida as the fishing capital of the world and a report concerning Lake Trafford restoration.

Commissioners elected John Rood to serve as chairman and Edwin Roberts as vice-chairman for 12-month terms. Also, they recognized two-term Commissioner Julie K. Morris, whose term expires in January.

Former Commissioner and president of the Wildlife Foundation of Florida, Dr. C. Tom Rainey, announced that Dr. Karen Steldinger, of the FWC's Florida Marine Research Institute, is the winner of the 2001 Louise Ireland Humphrey Achievement Award. The award recognizes FWC employees for outstanding achievements in fish and wildlife conservation.

The next Commission meeting is tentatively scheduled for Jan. 23-25 in Tallahassee.





Local lots see a growing business in real Christmas trees

Vacant lots turned into small pine forests last week when trucks from the North began unloading their Christmas cargoes in

Seminole County. Christmas tree lots began dotting the landscape the day after Thanksgiving, e traditional beginning of holiday season. Various types of freshly cut pine trees imported from North Carolina, Michigan and other northern states are

now available throughout Seminole. Orlando-based Sieffert's Nursery has operated the annual Christmas tree lot on West Lake Mary Boulevard for more than a decade. Since Thanksgiving, the lot has sold about 200 trees; and by Christmas, more than 1,000 Douglas, Frasier, blue spruce and Scotch pine and fir trees will be taken to local homes and businesses and

decorated for the holidays.

"Everybody has their own preference when it comes to what type of tree to buy," said Brian Hoffman, manager of Sieffert's Lake Mary Christmas tree lot. "But, we've sold more Frasier firs by far. They seem to last longer, and they smell good."

Although Christmas is still a month away, Hoffman said it's not too early to buy a tree that will last until the end of the holiday season. As long as the tree is fresh when it is purchased and receives between a gallon and a gallon and a half of water within the first couple of days after it leaves the lot, it should remain green until after Christmas.

When purchasing a tree, Hoffman said, there is a simple way to determine if a tree

Seawall funding safe for now

As holiday shoppers spend the first weekend of December searching for bargains, state legislators are haggling over \$1.3 billion in cuts to balance the budget.

Those cuts don't include \$3.8 million in grant money to replace the seawall in Sanford. As of late Friday, both the House and the Senate included the funding in their respective bud-gets, but the appropriation could be cut as conference committees from both houses try to reach an agreement this week-

The legislature is still here, so anything can happen," said former Lt. Gov. Bobby Brantley, the city's lobbyist. "So far, both houses have left the money in the budget, but there are still disagreements on a lot of differ-ent issues. I'll feel much more comfortable if the seawall money is still in the budget when I see the taillights of their cars leaving the capital."

The committees are expected to finish their negotiations sometime Sunday, Brantley said. The special session ends Thursday, and under state lav the budget bill must be printed and available to legislators for 72 hours before it can be voted

"It depends on how much they get done over the week-end," Brantley said, "but if end," Brantley said, "but if they'll be voting on it Wednesday or Thursday, they'll need to finish their negotiations late Sunday night."

Reno touts education at Seminole County Chamber event

ORLANDO — Former U.S. Attorney General and gubernatorial hopeful Janet Reno spoke to the Professional Women's Network of the Seminole County Lake Mary Regional Chamber of Commerce Thursday at Church Street Station in

Reno focused much of her speech around building Florida's future, particularly a stronger education system and economy. She called on chamber members to lead the way in these two areas maintaining the excellence we had hoped to achieve on a continuing basis."

"You have an area (Seminole Conty) that represents much of what Florida has been and what Florida can become," she said "It is a wonderful area of old Florida. When you read and see some of the high-tech development in the Seminole County, you see what Florida can be."

A decline in education funding and high school graduation rate in Florida the past decade is a reflection of the state now being ranked 40th out of 50 states in local and state education funding,

Her solution to these problems - "making early investments in people that can help save dollars down the road."

"If we don't make an investment in our people, the people of the state of Florida, we are not going to have a workforce that can duplicate what you have done in this high-tech area," she said. "Make the state competitive in a world where informa-

tion technology is a premium."

She suggests the "building blocks of a strong, vibrant Florida" lie in a better pre-kindergarten system, prenatal care, preventive medical care, lead-free housing for children and appropriate daycare where children actually learn.

"The truth is there are too many children alone

and unsupervised during the critical ages between zero and three," she said. "This state has got to build an educational system and reweave the fabric of the community around those children or we will not have the strongest workforce possible."

Reno said the state has to put the "teachers back in the priorities of this state" and also needs to
