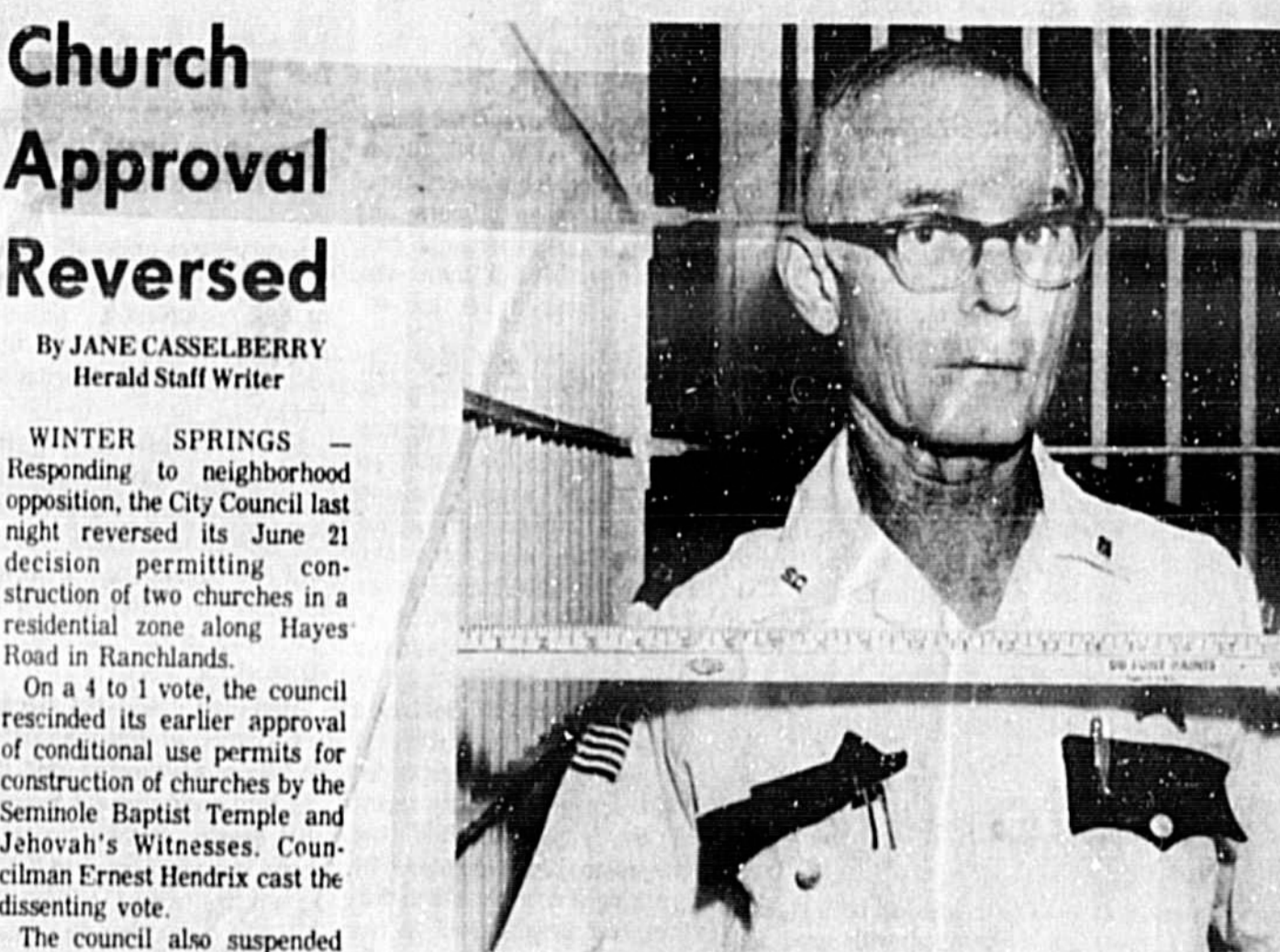

## New Offer Slows Final Decision Casselberry Sets Special Meeting On Utility Purchase

CASSELBERRY — The City Council will decide at a special meeting tonight whether to approve a \$2.2 million contract offer for purchase of General Waterworks Corp., according to City Attorney Ken McIntosh.

McIntosh told the council last night that officials of the Winter Park-based firm have offered the city a contract with only "minor" changes from the initial contract offer made last week by city officials.

McIntosh suggested to the council that a decision be postponed until 9 tonight to allow council members time to study

City officials last week approved a \$2-million bond sale. Proceeds are slated for purchase of the utility, according to city officials.

The purchase would provide an additional 2,600 connections in the Seminole Boulevard corridor, which is south of the city.

# Ali Conversion Spurred Others To Follow Black Athletes Practice Many Faiths

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Not since Joe Louis did a black man so obviously carry a banner for a faith. Cassius Clay, upon beating Sonny Liston for the heavyweight championship of the world, announced the following day that he was a Muslim, more popularly known as a "Black Muslim," and would henceforth be known as Muhammad Ali.

This shocked a nation. And in certain ways the tremors have not subsided.

When Joe Louis fought Max Schmeling, it was a clear-cut case of good fighting evil for all to see. That is, Americanism and its attendant virtues versus Nazism and its obvious and vicious "evil."

other than Allah. Ali, confined to the Phoenix Sun to the Boston Celtics, and criticized Phoenix as a "white conservative city," was "thrashed by the Muslims." Moore-Rasheed's agent presumably told him that if he changes his name it would "kill him commercially."

Less sinister to the general public is the tendency for some blacks, along with some whites, to adopt more apparently "individualistic" and "meditative" philosophies rather than the more missionary-like sects. Wheat Takes Jump

Soviet Purchase Raises Price

By JOHN CUNIFF AP Business Analyst NEW YORK (AP)—There is little doubt anymore except perhaps in the Agriculture Department that Soviet grain purchases will have an adverse impact on U.S. consumer prices.

Prices of grains for future delivery have jumped in response to the Soviet market activity. Farm prices rose 3 per cent for the month ended July 15, with one of the biggest increases being in wheat.

A year ago wheat brought farmers about \$1.04 a bushel. By June of this year the price was down to \$2.52. But in the latest report, for mid-July, prices had rebounded to \$3.23 a bushel.

Increases of that size cannot be absorbed by processors and retailers. Neither can they be absorbed by red meat and poultry producers, who will have to pay higher prices for their feed.

The almost inevitable consequence: Higher consumer prices.

The situation could be made even worse if growing and harvest conditions deteriorate. Heavy rains or prolonged drought have in the past upset some of the most confident forecasts.

A lot of people, including the so-called experts in government and private industry, were surprised to find the jobless rate continued to fall in July, reaching a low of 8.4 per cent of the civilian labor force.

Some analysts would, in fact, have been less surprised if the rate had jumped to 8.4 per cent, or two-tenths of one per cent

above the figure for May. The June decline to 8.5 per cent had been termed an aberration.

There is an economic school, however, that discounts the unemployment rate as an accurate indicator of economic health. It used to be, they say, but no longer is it so. And 8 or 9 per cent rate doesn't scare them at all.

Albert Cox Jr., a former White House economist in the Nixon days, and now executive vice president and chief economist for Lionel D. Edie & Co., is one of the more outspoken of this group.

Cox maintains that some people still seek a goal of only 4 per cent unemployment, which was indeed the standard set back in the 1960s. But such a yardstick, he maintains, is obsolete.

Most recently he put forth his views at the annual meeting of the Midwestern Governors' Conference in Cincinnati two weeks ago. This is what he told them: "The composition of the labor force has changed substantially over the years, toward more teenagers and married women, most of whom have advanced their breadwinners in the household. Thus a given unemployment rate implies less hardship, even in the absence of government assistance."

"But government assistance and union assistance to the unemployed has grown sharply over the years, again blunting the social hardship that a given unemployment rate implies. In fact, we may now be at the point where the levels of unemployment and welfare benefits actually contribute to unemployment."

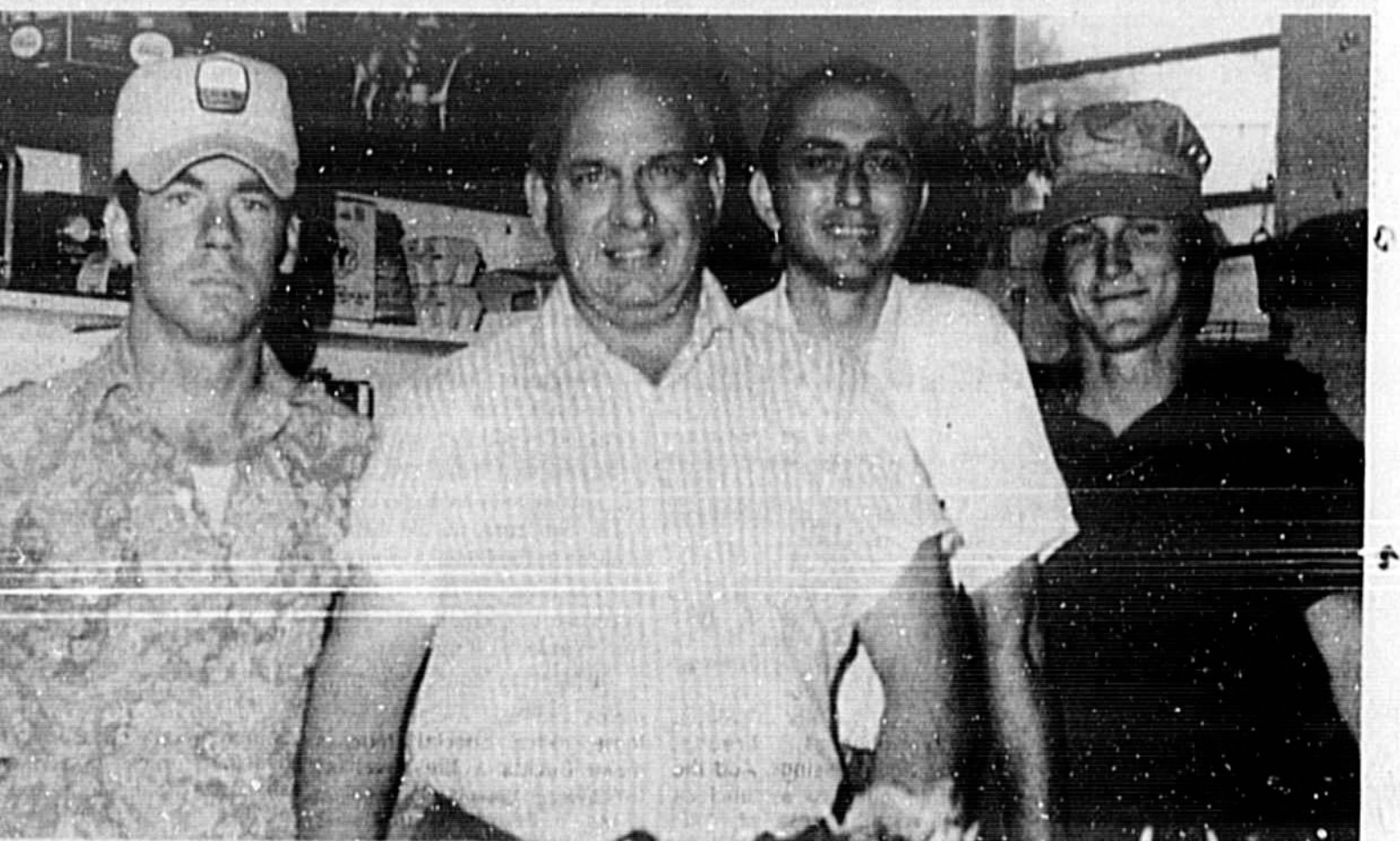

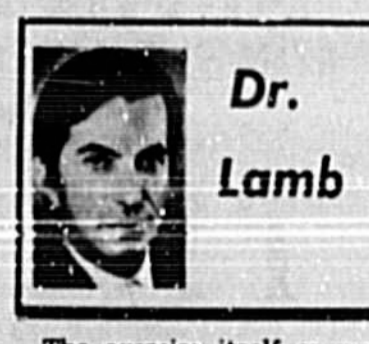

## Board, SEA Await Arbitration Salary Dispute Halts Talks

By ED PRICKETT Herald Staff Writer

More than 160 hours of talks between representatives of the county's 1,462 teachers and the School Board came to a halt Tuesday after the Seminole Education Association (SEA) rejected the board's top offer of \$8,100 salary for beginning teachers.

"The board feels it can only afford \$300 on the base, and we're compromising and putting it on the base. The board instructed us to make this last and final offer," said Harry Pelley, the school board's chief negotiator.

SEA spokesman Steve Rosenthal turned down Pelley's offer and stuck to his demand for an \$8,800 starting salary for teachers who now earn \$7,000 in their first year.

This morning, Pelley informed the Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) that talks are at an impasse and renewed his Monday request for a special master, or arbitrator, to come in and resolve the issue.

Pelley had no idea when the arbitrator—Jerome G. Greene of Miami—will arrive when the final contract will be ratified. Ten of SEA's 24 articles (proposals) remained on the table. It is these items the arbitrator will try and resolve.

"We can play games as long as the board wants to play games, but we need the financial expert from the board's team here at the table."

Ernie Cowley, a Pelley team member, pointed out a teacher may double his or her salary in 10 years—if that teacher earns a doctorate between his first and tenth year of teaching.

Harris, the county's top financial officer, said this morning his budget will contain the \$8,100 starting salary offer. "The way I understand it I have no choice," Harris noted. "I'm preparing a budget containing the \$8,100 offer—let the chips fall where they may."

Yesterday Pelley changed course and said the \$300 final offer will be added to base salary. Under the present scale pay for a teacher with a master's degree is \$13,965 after 10 years. Before the increase, that salary was \$12,870.
