



WINTER SPRINGS Responding to neighborhood opposition, the City Council last night reversed its June 21 decision permitting construction of two churches in a residential zone along Hayes Road in Ranchlands.

On a 4 to 1 vote, the council rescinded its earlier approval of conditional use permits for construction of churches by the Seminole Baptist Temple and Jehovah's Witnesses. Councilman Ernest Hendrix cast the dissenting vote. The council also suspended

Gurney Jurors Deadlocked

After Giving 'Some Verdicts'

TAMPA (AP) - Jurors in the influence peddling trial of former Sen. Edward J. Gurney and three others are grappling with what they claim is an impossible task,

unanimous verdicts on all charges. The jury of six men and six women said Monday that it had reached some verdicts in the 11-count indictment, but it said further deliberation on an unspecified number of charges was pointless.

However, U.S. District Court Judge Ben Krentzman instructed the jury to try again. He sealed the verdicts without looking at them.

Gurney, 61, one-time aide Josph Bastien, 33, and suspended Federal Housing Administration officials Ralph Koontz, 51, and K. Wayne Swiger, 61, are charged with plotting to solicit campaign contributions from Florida builders by promising favored treatment from the FHA. In addition, Gurney is charged with bribery, accepting unlawful compensation and four counts of lying to a grand jury. Bastien is also accused of accepting unlawful

Insurance Rate Hike Probed

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Insuance Commissioner Philip Ashler says he'll make sure expected increases in automobile insurance rates are not excessive or dis-

Companies are expected to raise their rates by an average 20 per cent almost immediately because of skyrocketing costs of accidents, Ashler said Monday, Ashler said in an interview that the increases are expected because the companies are losing money in insuring the state's 5.6 million drivers.

Florida now leads the nation in high-loss ratios, he said. "The loss ratio means that we have gone beyond that point where the insurance companies can recoup from their premiums the cost of doing business," Ashler said.

DETROIT (AP) - A longtime Teamsters union gadfly says Jimmy Hoffa told him last year that Anthony "Tony Pro" Provenzano threatened to kill Hoffa or kidnap his grandchildren if he refused to give up efforts to regain the union presidency.

Provenzano today appeared to be the ky to a widening investigation into the mysterious disappearance of Hoffa, who failed to return home from a luncheon meeting last

A source in New Jersey said the FBI spoke Provenzano on Monday. "When the FBI got through to him, he told them, 'I'll give you guys five minutes, then I'm going to Florida,"

The source said Provenzano, a former Teamsters vice president, then flew to Florida.

Little Phone Calls Told

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) - A Washington, N.C., telephone operator has testified that a woman who identified herself as Joan Little made two collect calls from the Beaufort County jail the morning a jailer was found stabbed to death in Miss Little's cell.

Nancy Lee Hollis related the story Monday in the absence of the jury after defense attorneys objected to inclusion of her testimony. Judge Hamilton Hobgood said he would decide today whether to allow the testimony before

The prosecution has also sought to introduce notes Miss Little made in magazines left in her cell when she fled the jail last Aug. 27.

As Miss Little's first-degree murder trial went into its fourth week Monday, activist lawyer William Kunstler was cited for contempt and jailed for two hours. Hobgood found him in contempt after an exchange in which Kunstler challenged "the quality of justice" in the state.

Covert CIA Acts 'Slowed'

WASHINGTON (AP) — Central Intelligence Director William E. Colby says covert CIA operations abroad are down to "almost nothing" now but that heavy use could be required again some time in the future.

Colby gave the assessment Monday to the Select House intelligence committee, which today questions Assistant Secretary of Defense Albert Hall on defense intelligence

Colby said the CIA is conducting only limited covert operations now both because of the world situation and because of "this present atmosphere of sensationalism"

"Consequentlywe have to restrain ourselves to what would be in the interests of our nation," Colby said.





Politics Threaten To Destroy CIA

There are signs that investigations of the Central Intelligence Agency could create an atmosphere in Washington similar to that which prevailed during the Watergate affair. While there is a world of difference between the Watergate scandal and the problems of monitoring in telligence activities, the CIA affair is heading down the Watergate path of reckless rumor and

The facts about Watergate eventually came out - facts shocking enough virtually to bring an administration to a halt and to force the resignation of a president. The CIA investigation is no threat to the present administration, but an orgy of suspicion and innuendo about CIA activities in the past could have as unsettling an effect on our foreign relations as did the long agony of

The facts about the CIA overstepping its bounds in surveillance of American citizens have been laid out by the Rockefeller Commission. putting most of the speculation on that subject to rest. It is the commission's inconclusive report on alleged CIA involvement in foreign assassination plots that has opened the door for the now-familiar process of leaks of confidential information about investigations in progress.

To begin with there is a limit to the facts that can be obtained about discussions that took place among government officials a decade or more ago. Vice President Rockefeller was perhaps too candid in his remarks before a television audience about the inconclusive nature of information on the chain of responsibility for CIA activities during the Kennedy years. As he has learned, to say that a story cannot be proved false is interpreted as saying it might be true.

When President Ford turned over material on alleged assasination plots to congressional committees and the Justice Department, he urged that it be handled with "utmost prudence" in view of its extraordinary sensitivity. It is not surprising that he is already dismayed with the leaks and speculation that have ensued. While a House the acted properly in denying access to CIA material to a congressman who leaked secret testimony once before, there are still many holes in the congressional sieve.


It would be most regrettable if responsible congressional leaders and Justice Department attorneys who, by their oath of office are obliged to exhibit sensitive prudence in handling information. are accused of a "cover-up" - another term familiar from Watergate days. The fact is that there are aspects of CIA operations that need to remain secret - not by any means to protect any individual but to protect the United States of America

Members of the news media need to balance that consideration with their dedication to the public's right to know, and there is the additional point that the CIA investigation may involve people who are not alive to defend themselves. Above all, neither national security nor the reputation of people living or dead should be subject to speculative charges by politicians looking for a cause celebre to make names for themselves.

Food Stamp Monster

The federal Food Stamp program has come to resemble something that escaped from Dr. Frankenstein's laboratory. Sen. James L. Buckley of New York and the 11 senators and 55 House members joining him in sponsorship of a reform measure may have found a way to get the monster back under control. This effort comes not a day too soon. The runaway Food

Stamp program will be chewing up dollars at the rate of \$6.6 billion in the current fiscal year if Congress does not put some kind of rein on its loose standards of eligibility. Some critics say poor families are not getting enough stamps to provide a nutritious diet. If that's the case, Sen. Buckley has pointed out what needs to be cone.



the policymaking process." That phraseology is so sweeping that a government official, to keep himself clean. would have to report almost every conversation he had with his neighbors, or at parties, or at the ball game - which in any way affected government policy. And most conversations do, sooner or later, in Washington.

By another provision, the unhappy official would be required to record all letters from outsiders - and people write into the government by the thousands, usually complaining about this policy or that.

Then take the reporting on investments, as proposed. What we really need to know is 9, the FCC approved nationwide emergency could have been saved. whether someone on a congressional banking committee, or an administration official working significant personal financial interest in banks, direct or indirect. But a major bill now being considered in Congress, H. R. 3249, would require that every member of the Senate and House, every government official GS grade 15 and above and every armed forces officer, colonel or Navy captain and above, disclose any investments worth \$1,000 that he and his wife hold, or any buying or selling of more than \$1,000 hour of your time to listen for someone's call for in securities, commodities or other real property

Now you can't buy a hundred shares of most stocks for \$1,000 - and if we are going to hold investments of this size up as possible conflicts of interest we have lost all sense of proportion. This reporting would clutter up the works and make the law a ridiculous monstrosity.

Oil Wastes Polluting The Oceans

Despite the publicity that inevitably surrounds such spectacular oil spills as the well blowout in Santa Barbara Channel in 1966 or the breakup of the tanker Torrey Canyon off the coast of England in 1967, it is not these fortunately rare accidents that pose the greatest threat to the world's marine ecology.

Rather, it is the deliberate, routine, day-in day-out use of the oceans as a dumping ground for oil wastes. The practice of flushing out tanker holds at sea after unloading their cargoes ashore contributes far more to pollution than all the spectacular spills put together.

Normaily, this practice goes unnoticed, except by the coastal dwellers, human and otherwise, directly affected. The tarry blobs of congealed oil that swept ashore in a 25-mile front along the lower Florida Keys just recently were an exception only because of their magnitude. In this instance, an estimated 85,000 to 120,000 gallons of crude had been dumped by some unidentified

There are laws against this sort of thing. The trouble is that in the heavily traveled shipping lanes it is almost impossible to connect any particular oil slick with any particular vessel. Ship owners and ship captains know this, and thus they continue to use the ocean as a convenient sewer.

If the laws against oil dumping cannot be it more convenient - and profitable - for tankers to dispose of the residual oil in their holds in port. There is supposed to be an energy shortage, after all. And with foreign crude seiling for more than \$13 a barrel, the thousands and thousands and thousands of barrels of it being wasted in this manner must amount to a considerable sum.

In the meantime, it is a little ironic that the residents of some eastern states remain adamantly opposed to drilling off their coasts, that if you ever have an emergency you'll get while these same coasts are daily subjected to pollution by oil that was pumped from fields

Japan Frees Red Guerrillas

To Save Terrorist Hostages

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP) - An airliner carrying five Red Army guerrillas freed from Japanese prisons headed for the Malaysian capital today, meeting the demands of terrorists holding up to 50 hostages in the U.S. Embassy. The captives include the American consul, A party of Japanese officials accompanied the guerrillas aboard the Japan Air Lines DC8 jet on its 61/2-hour flight. Among the five released were two deported from Sweden last March after being accused of plotting an attack on embassies there. The gunmen originally demanded the release of seven imprisoned members of the Japanese Red Army. After lengthy negotiations, the Japanese government agreed to the demands and freed five

Parliament Backs Gandhi

NEW DELHI, India (AP) - Shouting its acclamation, the Indian Parliament today rewrote the law to free Prime Minister Indira Gandhi from her embarrassing conviction of corrupt electoral practices. The retroactive amendments to India's electoral code passed the lower house by voice vote with only one dissent. They were scheduled for immediate consideration in the upper house where passage also was assured. Mrs. Gandhi's move took the edge off a Supreme Court battle due to begin Monday in which she was to fight to overturn the conviction and its mandatory penalty of a sixyear ban on holding elective office. With the laws changed, the offenses no longer exist.

U.S. Household Goods Draw

MOSCOW (AP) - More than 100,000 Muscovites have flocked to the exhibition hall in Luzhniki Park over the past two weeks for the most popular show in town - a modest display of American household goods. "I'd say about 80 per cent of the questions I get are personal or at least have nothing to do with the exhibit itself," said Lisa Archipow, of Buffalo, N.Y., one of 22 Russian-speaking guides. "They just don't seem so impressed with our technology as they once did."

Israel Attacks Lebanese City

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - The Defense Ministry claimed today that Israel attacked the coastal city of Tyre, 12 miles north of the border, with gunboats, killing four Lebanese officers. Palestinian guerrillas said they retaliated by rocketing the Israeli border settlement of Qiryat Shmona, and Israel said one person was wounded at the village. An Israeli spokesman refused to confirm or deny the reported gunboat attack.



Miami:

Rape Center Sets Precedent

MIAMI — Contrary to the popular notion some way "asking for it," the fact is that a woman need not be young, attractive or dress seductively in order to be a victim. She only has to be in the wrong place at the wrong

"Rape is a crime of violence - not a crime of sex," says Dr. Dorothy Hicks, director of the Rape Treatment Center at Jackson Memorial Hospital here. Profiles of rapists arrested in the Miami area show that most are married, some attack women as often as three times a week, and many have no idea of what their victims even look like.

"These men are hostile. They want to hurt women," the doctor states. She said the interviews show rapists use sex as a weapon to get back at some woman. Many were themselves sexually molested in childhood While rapists may not physically harm their first victims, violence often increases with repeated assaults.

The Miami treatment center, like several around the country, was set up last year in response to citizen demands. This year 1000 women are expected to use its services. The primary aim is to help the victim - not catch the rapist. "We forget that this crime often takes a woman who is psychologically intact and literally destroys her," Dr. Hicks points

A team of doctors, nurses and social workers is constantly on call. When a victim

mediately to a special "quiet room" where she is examined, treated, and later counseled. Dr. Hicks explains "some women have committed suicide following rape and some husbands have killed themselves. Often engagements are broken or marriages end up in divorce." Counseling for both the women and her family eases the trauma and helps

them adjust. Although the doctors, counselors and police all pledge confidentiality and files are locked, an assault victim is encouraged to make a report to protect herself and other women. "The police have statistics to show that if a victim reports, it's unlikely the rapist will return. But if she doesn't, he may feel he has a 'patsy' and come back again. "Like other criminals, the rapist usually

has a pattern that police can use to identify him. The only way to get these men off the street is to apprehend and convict them." hit by a car," Dr. Hicks urges every woman to take some precautionary measures.

"Don't be overly friendly. The rapists we've talked to say the 'friendly puppy' approach indicates a woman is vulnerable,' warns Dr. Hicks, adding that she herself seldom smiles at strangers or voluntarily offers advice or directions to men. This mature physician drives at night with her German shepherd beside her in the car, has keys ready so she doesn't have to fumble for them, and even walks against the flow of pedestrian traffic so someone doesn't come

New Treatment Center Opens

This month, Orlando joined a growing number of cities around the nation taking a more compassionate approach to the problem

The program, similar to the Rape Treatment Center at Jackson Memorial Hospital, Miami (see related story) was instituted at Orange Memorial Hospital, Orlando, several weeks ago, according to Dr. Thomas Hegert, Orange County Medical

"It came about primarily through the Mental Health Unit here at the hospital," says Dr. Hegert. They had become aware of Miami's program and how it had been

"These cases have been sadly neglected in the past as far as treatment is concerned,' says Dr. Hegert. Now, at Orange Memorial, a rape victim can be compassionately treated for the emotional as well as the physical trauma of the crime against her.

If a woman has a private physician he can be contacted or one of the hospital physicians will give the victim treatment for the possibility of venereal disease and pregnancy. But additionally, if the woman emotional problem associated with the at-

victim seeks to press charges against her attacker, then the medical examiner's office becomes involved in the case. A more thorough examination must be given for the purpose of gathering vital evidence to arrest and prosecute the attacker.

There is no similar program at Seminole Memorial Hospital, Sanford, and apparently no plans to institute one, according to Robert Besserer, administrator. At Seminole, like Orange, the medical examiner's office only becomes involved in a case to gather evidence for the police investigation. However, Associate Medical Examiner Dr. S.H. Irrgang says that if a woman shows signs of extreme emotional stress she would be referred to a physician or treated in the

The legal procedure (along with fear of repercussions) is unfortunately a rather degrading experience that often deters a woman from reporting a rape. To prosecute, she must first convince the investigating officers that she has indeed been raped, according to Sgt. William Hogan in charge of rape investigations for Seminole County

After a thorough examination she must then relate the experience in detail to the investigating officers of the case, a conversation which is taped then later condensed to a written statement which must be signed
