Briefly Farmer wins lawsuit against Spencer Gifts

DELAND — A DeBary woman won more than \$1.5 million in a jury verdict last week for injuries she suffered nearly four years ago when a light fell on her from a shelf at Spencer Gifts in the Seminole Towne Center. A lawyer representing the New Jersey-based chain said he would appeal the judgment. Seminole County Circuit Judge Seymour Benson signed Monday. The appeal would go to the 5th District Court of Appeals. Janet Farmer, 45, claims that her right hand still tingles and goes numb occasionally since April 3, 1996, when she walked into the Glo Shop section of the store. As she stood looking at the display, a light broke loose and hit her, according to Farmer's DeLand-based lawyers Glenn J. Paul and Michael C. Huddleston. Rescue personnel were called to the scene and found that she had received a concussion. Her lawyers say that months later, a disc in Farmer's neck became herniated.

Teen smoking drops in Seminole

SANFORD — Tobacco use among teenagers is decreasing in Seminole County and statewide, according to recently released surveys. From 1996 through 1999, tobacco use among 8th graders in Seminole County decreased 18.7 percent. Tobacco use has decreased 7.6 percent among 10th and 12th graders from 1996 to 1999 in Seminole County. The results of a survey conducted by the Seminole County school district regarding smoking among 8th, 10th and

Survey shows 18 percent drop among middle school students

12th grade students mirror the results of a statewide survey released this week. The Florida Youth Tobacco Survey shows a sharp decline in smoking among teenagers for the second consecutive year. For middle school students, the most recent data shows a decline in cigarette use from 15 percent in 1999 to 8.6 percent

in 2000. For high school students, cigarette use declined from 25.2 percent in 1999 to 20.9 percent in 2000. Meanwhile, according to a survey conducted by the Seminole County school district, 18.1 percent of middle school students smoked in 1999, compared to 36.8 percent in 1996. At the high school level, 32.1 percent of students said they

smoked in 1999, compared to 39.2 percent in 1996. "All of our numbers are down in middle school and high school," said Michael Mobley, Youth Tobacco Prevention Coordinator for the Seminole County school district. "We were very pleased with the results. Seminole County is ahead of the curve." The Florida Youth Tobacco Survey, designed by the Florida Department of Health in collaboration with the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, anonymously surveyed more than 20,000 public, middle and high

Crowds turn out for festival

LAKE MARY — Gusty winds and the occasional threatening sky couldn't stop festivities held Saturday during the seventh annual Old Lake Mary Days Festival. "The wind did get threatening, but it didn't stop us," said event Chairman Mary Jane Duryea. "It just was really, really wonderful." From festival goers to merchants located in the Downtown District, hundreds of people participated in this year's event. The festival included everything from children's games to Civil War re-enactors.



"The Civil War re-enactors went over very well," Duryea said. "They do a lot of research beforehand, and they really get into it." Saturday's festivities began with an invocation from the Rev. John Montgomery and a flag ceremony. Mamie Lemma sang the Star Spangled Banner with local Boy Scouts leading the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the ceremony, Lake Mary Deputy Mayor Thom Greene officially opened the event by welcoming the crowd to the seventh annual festival. In what appeared to be the only obstacle of the day, problems with the public address system delayed entertainment at the main stage for about an hour. Once the problems were fixed, numerous performers took to the stage, including the School of Dance Arts, the Joyful Noise Chorus, the Sunshine Generation.

Volunteers gather at the river

Fifth annual cleanup of St. Johns River set for March 18

SANFORD — Volunteers will descend upon a dozen different waterfront locations in Seminole County later this month for the 2000 St. Johns River Celebration. The fifth annual cleanup will

be held in 15 Florida counties and two Georgia counties on March 18. In the four previous years of the cleanup, 1.5 million pounds of trash have been picked up by 23,000 volunteers. "This has been an excellent opportunity not only to remove trash from the St. Johns River water system, but also to bring attention to the need to protect our resources," said Jeff Cole, a spokesman for the St. Johns River Water Management District. More than 6,000 volunteers are expected to help pick up litter throughout the St. Johns River watershed on March 18.

The volunteers will work on 125 cleanup sites along the St. Johns River. In addition, volunteers will pick up debris along St. Johns tributaries, including the Ocklawaha, Wekiva and Econlockhatchee rivers, and feeder waterways throughout the river system. The St. Johns River Celebration is a one-day volunteer cleanup sponsored by the St. Johns River Water Management District and Keep Florida Beautiful. "This wouldn't be so successful without the hard work of all the volunteers," Cole said. See River, Page 6A


FPL prepares to repower Sanford plant

Contractor hired, 950 jobs available

DEBARY — Florida Power & Light Company has selected Black and Veatch Engineering as the lead contractor for the repowering of the Sanford power plant. An FPL spokesman said the repowering project will use clean, natural-gas technology to double the generating capacity of the existing facility without requiring additional land to meet the growing electricity needs of FPL's customers in Central Florida. "We've worked with Black and Veatch on several other projects," said Rosane Kennedy, FPL plant manager. "We know they will do a great job." FPL estimates more than 950

personnel will be required during the course of the two-year construction period which is expected to begin April 1. "We've encouraged Black and Veatch to recruit as many local personnel as possible," Kennedy said. "For the repowering project, we're looking for welders, laborers, pipe fitters, iron workers, boiler makers, carpenters and electricians," said Jim Watson, project manager for Black and Veatch. Qualified and interested individuals can contact Watson for additional information at 407-575-5170. The repowering project is expected to be complete in 2002. The combined cycle technology being added to the site will run on natural gas instead of oil, resulting in a substantial decrease in air emissions and the need to barge oil from Jacksonville along the St. Johns River. The repowered plant will serve about 486,000 homes and businesses, doubling its current capability to serve customers.




Florida Power & Light is preparing to repower the Sanford Power Plant, a move which will create about 950 jobs.

Sweet memories of a gentle time in the park

From the time I was able to toddle, my favorite place was a park within toddling distance of our home. It was the biggest and best park in all the world. It had a babbling brook, marvelous oak trees, picnic tables and all kinds of places to hide.

As I grew older, the park retained its charm. The U.S. Park Service maintains the park to this very day. Almost everything I knew as a boy has changed but my favorite park will never change. Thousands of children have played in the park. I was one of the first.

My childhood park was a park of many colors. Each season brought delightful gifts. Springtime was like being even heaven — so was fall. The park was a good place to cool off in summer. In winter we went to the park to sleigh ride and to build snowmen.

A good park is a good neighbor. Anyone living in Sanford knows this is true. Many residents speak of Fort

Mellon Park as if it was the Garden of Eden. I can appreciate their fight to save the place. I surely would have fought to save my old park in Virginia.

Now, there's another park controversy. Two county commissioners want to have a community park at WinterMiles in Oviesto. Grant Maloy, the district commissioner, isn't keen on the idea. Mr. Maloy wants a park where children can play on swings and slides. A park with picnic tables, basketball and tennis courts. WinterMiles, he said, would be a horse park. "Most people won't ride a horse in their lifetime," he said.

County planners have a nifty park slogan called Vision 2010. By 2010 they hope that every resident can walk to a neighborhood park and that there will be a community park nearby, also. It's going to take big dollars — as much as \$40 million.

Sanford and Lake Mary are in the community park pic-

ture. The Sanford site is close to Wicklow Elementary School. The acquisition costs would be \$700,000, the development costs \$2.8 million, operating costs \$300,000 a year. The county would help foot the bill and operate the 30-acre park. The city of Sanford does not operate community parks or staff neighborhood parks.

The Lake Mary park, located on Lake Mary Blvd. west of Interstate-4 near the Oakmont project, would cost \$5.7 million to acquire, \$6 million to develop and \$400,000 a year to operate.

Since they get the big bucks, the county commissioners are to make the call on which properties are purchased and developed as parks. A long time ago some very wise public officials made the call in the area where I grew up. The first shots of World War II had not been fired at the time they made the decision.

Sixty years from now county residents will be grateful that precious land was reserved for children and for families. If Seminole is Florida's Natural Choice, neighborhood and community parks are naturally top priority.

Irish Board promotes food of Ireland to honor St. Patrick's Day

In honor of St. Patrick's Day, the Irish Food Board is promoting both the food and literature of Ireland this year. And it's clear from their promotion that a country that gave us George Bernard Shaw, William Butler Yeats, James Joyce and Frank McCourt also has more to offer, food-wise, than corned beef and cabbage.

The Food Board has come out with a lovely little pamphlet featuring seven easy-to-prepare dishes, peppered with quotes from Irish writers. You can get the free pamphlet by sending a self-addressed, stamped envelope to Literary Irish, Literally Delicious, C/O Irish Food Board, 132 West 37th Street (4th Floor), New York, NY 10018. You can also download the recipes from the Internet at www.askeiland.com.

The recipes include a Custard with Fruit Sauce that James Joyce wrote about in "The Dead," and the kind of potato dish that Frank ("Angela's Ashes") McCourt says has "aphrodisiac" qualities. Likewise, the "try" an Irish breakfast that opens Joyce's "Ulysses," is detailed.

The soda bread is in honor of

George Bernard Shaw, who was an adamant vegetarian. He wrote frequently and at length about diet, and said of Irish brown bread, "remember that brown bread is a good familiar creature and worth more than his weight in flesh."

The recipe for Irish stew is included in the pamphlet with an unattributed quote: "Irish stew? All honor to the land that has brought it before the world."

And all honor to the land that has given us some of the best English-speaking writers in the world.

Perhaps the best way to celebrate St. Patrick's Day is to pick up an anthology of Yeats or Joyce and read or re-read it. If you accompany your reading with a morsel of food or a pint of Guinness, no one is going to complain.

CUSTARD WITH FRUIT

1 cup sugar
3 eggs
3 egg yolks
1-1/4 cups heavy cream
1-1/4 cups whole milk
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 cup Irish preserves (see note) or fresh sliced fruit

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Butter a 1-1/2 quart shallow baking dish or 6 individual 1-cup custard molds.

In a mixing bowl, combine the sugar, eggs and egg yolks, and beat until creamy and pale yellow. Combine cream and milk in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Pour the hot liquid into the egg mixture, whisking constantly. Pour the egg mixture into the prepared dish. Dust with nutmeg.

Place dish or molds in a baking pan. Fill the pan with boiling water to about halfway up the custard dish. Bake until custard is set, 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until a tester inserted in the custard comes away completely dry. Allow to cool before serving.

If using preserves, heat them gently before serving, and serve with custard.

If using sliced fruit, serve on top or alongside of custard. Yield: 6 servings.

Note: Popular brands of Irish preserves include Alexander's, Bewley's, Chivers, Irish Fruits,

IRISH OATY SODA BREAD

1 cup unbleached white flour
1-1/2 cups whole wheat flour
1/2 cup quick-cooking Irish oatmeal (see note)
1/3 cup steel-cut oats (see note)
2-1/2 teaspoons baking soda
1/4 cup firmly packed sugar
1/4 cup butter or margarine, chilled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
1-1/2 to 2 cups buttermilk

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Lightly dust the surface of a baking sheet with flour.

Stir together the flour, oats, sugar and baking soda in a large bowl. Using fingertips, quickly rub in the butter. The mixture should be coarse, but not lumpy.

Make a well in the center and gradually stir in the buttermilk with a wooden spoon until the dough is soft, but manageable. Turn the dough onto a lightly floured board and knead for about 1 minute.

Shape the dough into a ball and place it in the center of the prepared baking sheet. With the palm of your hand, flatten the dough into a circle that is about 1-1/2 inches thick. Using a sharp knife dipped in flour, make a cross (do not cut too deep) through the center of the bread so that it will easily break into quarters when baked. Bake for approximately 30 minutes, or until well browned.

Serve with butter, preferably Irish butter. Yield: 1 loaf.

Note: The most easily available brand of Irish oatmeal (and steel-cut oats) is McCann's, sold in most supermarkets.

IRISH STEW

8 potatoes — 4 sliced very thin, 4 cut in half
4 medium onions, peeled and thinly sliced
6 carrots, scraped and sliced
salt and pepper, to taste
1 pound of Caltee/Searson traditional Irish bacon, chopped
1 to 1-1/2 pounds of tender lamb chops, about 1 inch thick, trimmed and cut into small pieces
2 to 2-1/2 cups of water (about 1/2 from chopped fresh parsley, to taste

In a medium-size pot put down a thin layer of the thinly sliced potatoes, onion and carrot,

using about 1/3 of each. Top with a layer of the bacon and lamb. Sprinkle liberally with pepper and salt. Continue building in this manner until all the ingredients are used. Add the water until it barely covers the ingredients. Arrange the halved potatoes on top of the stew but not in contact with the water, so they steam as the rest is cooking. Simmer over a very low heat for about two hours.

Serve in shallow soup bowls and sprinkle liberally with parsley. Yield: 4 to 6 servings.






Top Left: Brooke Hall after receiving her crown.

Lack of competition hampers early races

Boring NASCAR officials and Winston Cup tour drivers may shudder at the word, but forget the rain that shortened Sunday's Carol Street event at Las Vegas Motor Speedway, and forget all that Ford Chevy-Pontiac hickering.

NASCAR officials may have another problem on their hands — a lack of good, hard-core competition.

There was little up front Sunday, where race leaders played follow-the-leader in what may be smart strategy but boring as entertainment. Is NASCAR racing in danger of becoming as boring as Indy car racing? Perhaps that don't tell that to Mike Helton, NASCAR's senior vice president, or Winston Cup drivers.

"I still take exception to anyone who refers to it as boring," Helton said. "There was a lot of moving on today that went on. That doesn't necessarily mean that the guys leading have to be the only guys putting on the show. There are 43 cars out there, and a lot of those guys were putting on a heckuva show."

"No I take exception to anyone who calls it boring. I don't think that is fair to the competitors, and I don't think it's fair to the sport in general."

"What happens in a situation like today, when it's rain-obsessed, is you don't know how it might have played out. We only got to run 145 laps."

Gary Nelson, the Winston Cup director, said that the term "boring" should be put in context. "I was a crew chief, and I remember winning Dover by leading 450 miles, and I remember winning Atlanta by leading 325 laps. When you say the good old days, I remember some of those good old days."

Jack Roush, the owner of Sunday's winning car, also disagreed with any complaints about another boring race.

"You heard what Mark [Martin] said, when Jeff [Burton] asked him if he was frustrated with Ward Burton holding them up," Roush said. "Mark said he was getting ready to take care of business, and he went down there and took care of business and passed him."

"There were a number of passes for the lead. Dale Earnhardt Jr. led, Mark led, Jeff led. Bill Elliott was coming good. This race was shaping up to be very competitive. I believe Tony [Stewart] had something for Jeff. And with one more change, Mark would have improved his car. It was going to be a jump ball for the second half of the race with at least three cars in contention."

"So if Roush had been sitting in the grandstands would he have gotten his money's worth? I don't think if I was sitting in the grandstands I would have gotten what I expected coming to Las Vegas in the wintertime when you'd expect the climate to be fairly mild and dry," Roush said.

But Michael Waltrip said that NASCAR could make some changes to put more excitement back into the sport.

"The situation you have in the guys up front got there because their cars are better," Waltrip said. "And when they get there, not a whole lot is going to happen or change. But in the middle and the back of the pack, there's a lot of stuff going on. People bumping into each other and cutting each other off, trying to make something happen."

"So what could NASCAR do to help make racing more exciting?"

"What they need to do, in my opinion, is lay a wind shield in 'em about like the trucks (almost vertical), and make these cars a lot slower and a lot dirtier aer-wise," Waltrip said. "These cars are too slippery aerodynamically, and they're too fast to have great races."

"I'm of reasonable intelligence, and I look at the trucks and say, 'What great racing.' And these people in here haven't gotten it yet. That just trips me out. I think they ought to look at the trucks and say, 'What do we have to do with these Cup cars to make them exciting, too?' Well, it's the fact the trucks are bricks going through the air, and cut a big hole, and therefore people can draft up on them. It would make our jobs more difficult, but it would make it a lot more fun for the fans."

Dueling DALES

Dale Earnhardt Jr.'s quick start pleases and frustrates his famous father

He still sometimes gets confused by what's expected of him. There's his team owner, asking for perfection and demanding he always put his own finish first.

Then there's his father, yelling in frustration when he won't concede position to dad on the track.

Unfortunately, they're the same person.

As Dale Earnhardt Jr. tries to build on an outstanding start to his Winston Cup rookie season, he'll be dealing with increased media and fan attention.

So far, he's handled himself with grace and style. And he's doing it under the watchful eye of his father, seven-time Winston Cup champion Dale Earnhardt Sr.

For this son, pleasing the fatherly and business sides of Dale Earnhardt seems impossible at times, especially when the two are pitted against one another on the track.

When these two run together, blood ties cease to have an effect.

In years to come, epic battles between the pair could become common. Surprisingly, they're happening already.

Earnhardt Jr. is competitive. He is fresh off his first top-10 finish of the season (10th at Las Vegas) and has climbed to 14th in the points. The owner is thrilled, the father is proud. The father also blames his son for costing him a shot at a win earlier this year.

■■■

It's tough on both of them.

In the Daytona 500, Earnhardt Jr. held off his charging father late in the race. Earnhardt couldn't get around his son's car and fell behind the lead pack. By the time he won the battle with his son, Earnhardt had lost his shot at victory.

"Daytona was pretty interesting," Earnhardt Jr. said. "He was pretty happy with the way we were testing and practicing, and I think that was team owner there, being proud of his car. When we got to racing, he was protecting his position and his finishing and his bravado and his lifestyle."

The two cars touched a few times during their Daytona battle.

Earnhardt Jr., flushed with excitement, talked about the thrill of racing his father. Earnhardt's comments were less complimentary.

The dual nature of the situation can be baffling.

"When we're battling for position and trading paint, then it's a father," Earnhardt Jr. said. "Like I need to step out of the way or something, like I'm holding him up or slowing him down."

Otherwise, it's an owner encouraging the driver.

Perhaps some part of Earnhardt Jr. knew it would be this way. The lessons learned on the track, the public fawning, the constant criticism or praise. It's all there in his name.

But he seems surprised by the somewhat public reprimands he's receiving.

There aren't that many 25-year-olds being scolded in front of their peers these days — Earnhardt Jr. is being called to task in front of thousands of spectators.

"One instance was pretty funny," Earnhardt Jr. said of a run-in with his dad at Rockingham.

"With the in-car camera footage, I get these guys to give me the tape after the race. I take it home and watch it."

He was running inside Jeff Gordon and almost spun going into a turn. As Earnhardt Jr. regained control, he banged into the side of Gordon's car. Earnhardt was two cars back.

"I was like, 'I'll just get the heck out of the way here because I'm getting ready to wreck everybody,'" Earnhardt Jr. said.

"About a straightaway and a half later, dad went by, and he was shaking his finger out the window at me. You don't see that on television. The fans don't get to see that part of it. I guess that was where the father was going. 'You'd better watch it. You'd better straighten up.'"

He just shakes his head and thinks about racing.

■■■

It's nothing new.

For years Earnhardt Jr. has dealt with speculation and sensationalism concerning his relationship with his father. In many ways, this is just another layer of the public interpretation of their lives. He's used to it.

It doesn't seem to faze him anymore.

These days, his thoughts center on Dale Earnhardt the owner and performing in his car. It no longer matters that he's a two-time Busch Grand National Series champion. It just matters what he did yesterday.

It's a bit intimidating, no matter who you are.

He tries not to think about it. Right now, Earnhardt Jr. is concentrating on learning the tempo of the schedule and the races.

Challenging his father on the track is fun, but that is way down the list of things he wants to do right now.

After all, he's like everybody else — he has an owner to keep happy.

"There's a pattern, but I don't know it," he said of Winston Cup racing. "It's going to take a while to find the rhythm."

ORLANDO - Local high school talents Amanda Sidor (Seabreeze High School) and Lauren DeBellas (Lake Mary High School) along with Georgia State ODP member Lindsay Mair (Atlanta/Chattahoochee High School) have signed national letters of intent to play soccer for the University of Central Florida, joining three elite seniors who committed to UCF in February.

"All the women coming in have amazing skills," said head coach Amanda Cromwell. "Sidor has great speed and left foot striking capabilities. DeBellas has an excellent defensive mentality and a great work rate and Mair has a nose for scoring and is versatile at midfield and up top."

Her defense won Lake Mary High School two regional championships and two district runner-up titles. She also carried the Rams to two Class 6A Florida State finals, helping to capture the championship in 1998.

Mair, a 5-foot-7 forward/midfielder with Atlanta's Stone Mountain soccer club, has been a member of the Georgia State ODP team and regional camp since 1995. Last year she was chosen to play for the ODP European tour in Italy and Germany and she will represent the team again this year in England.

A four-year starter at Chattahoochee High School, Mair has helped her team post 40 wins over the past three seasons. A natural leader, Mair's team voted her captain for the upcoming season, having finished her junior year with 11 goals and 13 assists and performing well enough in the classroom to receive the Scholar-Athlete award.

"The whole class is very talented and capable of contributing to the team right away," Cromwell said. "I really enjoyed recruiting them because they are not only great players, but great people. They will have no problems fitting into the team chemistry."

Hayles on a Vance & Hines Ducati (1:51.635).

John Hopkins, a 16-year-old from Ramona, Calif., topped 750cc SuperSport practice with a time of one minute, 54.943 seconds on a Valvoline Suzuki. Shawn Higbee, of Waterford, Wis., led the Pro Thunder bikes with a time of one minute, 58.234 seconds on an American-made Buell, and after a two-year absence from the class, Rob Oliver rode his Yamaha TZ250 to a time of one minute, 57.482 seconds, fastest of the 250 Grand Prix bikes.

POOVEY STARTING 25TH SEASON OF AMA GRAND NATIONAL RACING AT DAYTONA

DAYTONA BEACH - Racing veteran Terry Poovey is preparing to begin his 25th year in the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) Grand National Series this weekend at Daytona Beach Municipal Stadium.

The 41-year-old rider from Garland, Texas, has been a perennial favorite on the chal-

lenging short track at the stadium. Over the years, Poovey has won a total of 19 regional and national races during Bike Week.

The soft-spoken Poovey has become one of the crowd favorites on the AMA Grand National circuit. He started his professional racing career as a 17-year-old in 1976 and made an immediate impact, winning in his rookie year on the short track in Talladega, Ala.

Poovey improved steadily during the late 1970s. In 1979 he won two nationals, both on half-mile tracks, one in Columbus, Ohio, and the other in Meadow Lands, Pa. By the early '80s he was considered one of the top riders on the national circuit. His highest

ranking in the Grand National Series came in 1982 when he finished the season as the fourth-ranked rider.

"It's hard to believe that I've been racing this long," said Poovey in his slow Texas drawl. "Daytona has always been good to me. I feel like I have a good chance to win every time I come down here."

The fans seem to really be behind him at Daytona and that makes a big difference.

Poovey continues to be competitive even though he races a limited schedule. Last year the veteran nailed down five top 10 finishes. The well-liked rider should again be one to watch Friday and Saturday night at Municipal Stadium.

Win at Bridge: Pull out her left hand

Bluebird was a British wartime spy who lived in the first century. For a while, she was successful in battling against the invading Romans, but eventually suffered a major defeat and committed suicide by consuming poison. In Britain, children learn a verse about her that includes the line "she put out her left hand and turned to the right."

At the bridge table, sometimes you need to try to mislead an opponent. In this deal, you reach six spades. West opens with the heart king. Thinking you have missed an easy grand slam, you cash two top trumps. But when West discards, you realize that even so is in jeopardy. If East has at least three clubs, you can get rid of your heart loser on dummy's last club, even if East ruffs it. However, as you can see, East has only two clubs. He can ruff the third round and take a heart trick. Is there no hope?

Well, there is a faint chance. After two rounds of trumps, East's club ace has been led. The club king is still in your hand. Call for the club jack. You know East can ruff with effect, but does he? If you shuffled with a 4-2-3-2 distribution including the diamond queen, he would not. The slam home by ruffing because you would discard your heart loser and claim. But if he carries diamonds, you would be sunk. Here, of course, if East does discard, you win with the club queen, cash the third top spade, cross to dummy with a red, West should play high low in clubs to show an even number, but East might not be watching.

Children react to abuse in many ways

DEAR DR. GOTT: Perhaps the child you wrote about who insisted on wearing tight pants was a victim of child abuse. When my daughter was 7, she was molested by a 15-year-old neighbor boy. Thereafter, for months, she insisted on tight waist bands for her clothing in an attempt, I suppose, to protect herself from further injury. She didn't have the ability to tell me what had been done to her, so much to my grief, I remained clueless until, in her early 20s, she put herself into therapy.

Your advice should have included a physical exam to check for sexual abuse.

DEAR READER: You are absolutely correct and I thank you for stating such a personal and devastating experience. Children respond to abuse in many ways, some of which are difficult for adults to interpret. And I am grateful to be reminded that the despicable crime of sexual molestation should be aggressively investigated in any youngster whose behavior seems odd or out of place.

DEAR DR. GOTT: You often respond to elderly readers with poor circulation, failing hair, deteriorating vision and splitting nails. All symptoms that used to bother me. However, once I began a multivitamin supplement, my problems disappeared. It worked for me. Perhaps some of your readers might be helped, too.

DEAR READER: Most adults obtain sufficient vitamins and minerals from a well-balanced diet. However, in some cases such as yours, nutritional supplements may provide striking health benefits. The rationale for this is unknown. Perhaps many seniors are simply not absorbing the vitamins that they need or, for some reason, they merely require more. This is why I routinely suggest multivitamin/mineral supplements for elderly patients, especially during the winter months. Although this practice is far from being accepted by all nutrition experts, it may do a lot of good and certainly can't harm. Be careful not to overdo, however, because overcalled "megavitamin" therapy can cause serious health problems. DEAR DR. GOTT: What do the initials MD and DO mean? Would I have a problem going to a DO for my diabetes?

DEAR READER: MD means doctor of medicine. DO means doctor of osteopathy. Although MDs and DOs receive slightly different post-graduate training, most states consider the two disciplines to be equal and subject to the same licensing requirements. Therefore, I believe that you would be perfectly safe to trust your case to a well-trained osteopath. The caliber of treatment offered by such a practitioner should be identical to that supplied by an MD.
