Big Bombing Missions Over North Told

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — The U.S. Military Command today reported a record number of bombing missions against North Viet Nam and threatened to resume bombing of the eastern end of the demilitarized zone unless the Communists stop infiltrating there. U.S. planes flew 171 bombing missions over the Communist north Thursday, two more than the previous record on Sept. 11. No planes were reported last Thursday but an Air Force F105 Thunderchief was shot down today 70 miles northwest of Vinh, the 20th loss reported for the air war against the north. A helicopter rescued the pilot. A U.S. spokesman charged the Communists with military activity in the 20 square miles at the eastern end of the buffer zone between North and South Viet Nam and said if it continues the U.S. and South Vietnamese governments "will be obliged to respond." The spokesman did not spell out what the response would be, but an attack has been the only U.S. action against the zone. Bombing of the eastern end was suspended two weeks ago to allow field teams of the International Control Commission to investigate charges that the force neutral zone was being violated.
