WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. Everett M. Dirksen is on his way toward becoming one of the most widely viewed commercials of the congressional election campaign.

Dirksen, the Senate Republican leader, already has taped 30 television and radio spots, ranging in length from 20 seconds to five minutes, and has a score more to do before he makes his painful way to Walter Reed Army rospital next week. Each of these is an individual
