

Few young Americans get this chance to be an intimate part of their nation's government. Those who do get the sort of training in politicial science that no school can offer. While they serve they are paid good salaries and provisions are made for them to keep up their school work.

Fiction And Fact

Horatio Alger Jr., one of the most widely read authors of his day, was born on July 18th, 1899, in Natick, Massachusetts. From a literary standpoint he was not a great writer but few have done more than he did to influence the reading babits and the attitudes of an entire generation of

The Alger stories followed a familiar pattern. His heroes always began life in humble positions and by dint of courage, industry and honesty they rose to places of honor and trust. His books, while they are still read today, do not attract as many boys as they once did.

The strange thing about the Alger stories was that despite their contrived plots they had a firmer basis in truth than even the author realized. Many of the boys who read of the bootblack who made good went on to greatness in their own lives. Each year there is an award to men who have succeedvd in the Alger tradition.

Perhaps this is the only country in the world where the stories told by Horatio Alger Jr. could come true. It is a comment on America that as a matter of fact his stories were often understatement rather than ex-
