### Presence Of Christ

Text: "Lo, I am with you always" Matthew 28:20  
"I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee."  
Hebrews 13:5

One of the real blessings of the Christian life is the realization of the daily presence of Christ. Knowing that He is ever with us gives courage for today and hope for tomorrow. Therefore it is essential for the trusting child of God to practice the presence of Christ daily. When this principle is put into operation it will have the three following effects upon the life of the child of God.

A. There is a challenging effect: I have a son who plays Little League baseball and while he is not particularly outstanding he has managed to make the all-star team for two years. One reason for this is that he always tries to perform to the best of his ability. I can remember one night when he played a great game by hitting safely in four trips to bat and fielding his position flawlessly in the field. The motivating force behind that game was his grandfather sitting in the stands and watching him play for the first time. My son knew his grandfather was watching and he wanted to do his very best. In a similar manner God's children perform better when they realize that Christ is ever present.

B. There is a convicting effect: I was driving north on Park Avenue in the city of Sanford recently when I saw a patrol car parked alongside the curb. I realized that I had entered a zone where the speed of the coming automobiles were being checked by radar. I immediately slowed down and glanced at my speedometer and gave a sigh of relief when I was not pulled to the curb because (confession is good for the soul) I had been exceeding the speed limit. Likewise when we realize that Christ is ever present like an all-seeing radar we tend to watch our daily conduct by living Christ honoring lives.

C. There is a comforting effect: Sir Ernest Shackleton, when on the Antarctic with two companions, spoke of the tremendous loneliness and the feeling of awe from the world. This feeling of tremendous loneliness is not confined to the desolate Antarctic. It can occur in the midst of a teeming city crowded with people therefore there is real comfort in knowing that Christ is near, invisible, but yet very real.

Practice the presence of Christ daily through prayer, reading the Word of God and by having fellowship with those of like precious faith.

## Giving Of Money Part Of Worship

NEW YORK — Why do people give to the church? This turned out to be a \$200,000 question that disclosed that ministers and members of their congregations were in general agreement about stewardship but differed in some significant ways, principally in the areas of social action and ecumenical involvement.

A 20-month study conducted by the National Council of Churches for 21 denominations concerned about a tightening of the purse strings at the local level disclosed that people contribute mainly "out of a sense of gratitude to God and a religious awareness of the privilege of being able to share."

"Further," the findings said, "most feel that giving is an intimate part of religious worship. The placing of cash or a check on a church offering plate is far more satisfying, members say, than signing a pledge and giving by mail."

What do they give money for? So far as most members are concerned, the major function of the local church is "winning others to Christ and providing worship for members."

There are additional reasons for giving, all of them oriented mainly to individuals rather than groups, classes of citizens or organizations. In order of preference the other areas of interest were the provision of

funds for worship for church members for religious instruction, for ministerial services, for the sacraments and for help for the needy.

While the several thousand ministers and laymen who were subjected to three-hour in-depth individual interviews by members of a trained staff of 150 agreed generally on these points, there was one major point of conflict.

The ministers interviewed tended to lean more toward social action than did members of their congregations, perceiving the church as "serving as a social conscience to the community." In fact, they regarded this area as more important than performing baptisms, marriages or burials.

While the clergy tended to feel that social action was "religiously important" to the church, the members considered it to be "unimportant." Among the functions ministers regarded as significant to the local church were support for home and overseas missions administered at the denominational headquarters level.

## Better To Stay Abed New Traffic Acts Strict And Stricter

This uniform law, known as Chapter 316, went into effect Jan. 1, meaning every municipal, county and state law enforcing officer will be enforcing the same law.

Investigations of accidents are taking a little longer now. On the same day the new traffic laws went into effect, the accident investigators also were faced with a new traffic accident form. The form is based on a code system and until the officers are able to memorize this code, it'll take just a little longer than usual to investigate accidents.

A look through the traffic laws shows that most anyone can be found guilty of some offense. Have you ever forgotten and left your keys in the car? Take heed to chapter 316.07: "Unauthorized motor vehicle.—No person driving or in charge of any motor vehicle except a licensed delivery truck or other delivery vehicle while making deliveries, shall permit it to be operated, unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, and removing the key."

And if you like to take rides through the country, watch your car when you decide to park your car. For example, chapter 316.16: "Whoever parks any vehicle within 30 feet of any rural mailbox... shall be fined not more than \$100.00."

It had been expected that Kennedy would head Massachusetts' large convention delegate slate. The senator filed an affidavit disavowing his candidacy.

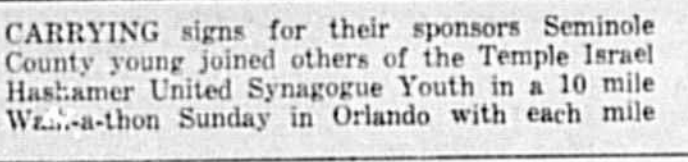


MARCH OF DIMES Poster Child, GIGI

### Pastor Accepts Call To Lake Monroe Church

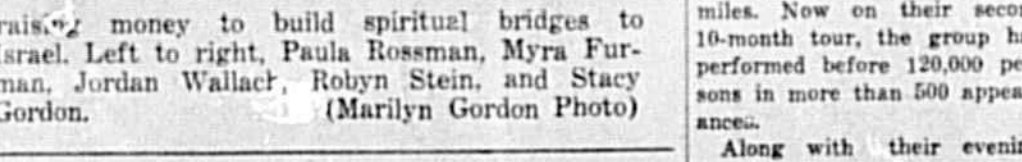
Rev. Anthony R. Bort, of Altamonte Springs, has been called as pastor by First Baptist Church of Lake Monroe.

### Draft Dodgers Gain Support For Stand

NEW YORK (AP) — More and more, they're speaking up. Parents are taking openly of sons who have gone to prison or fled rather than serve in the Vietnam war. These elders no longer are ashamed of their sons. They've decided their sons are right.

"I tried to talk him out of it, for I knew how high a price he would pay," recalls the Rev. Alexander C. Wilson, of Burgettstown, Pa. "I realize now that... I was asking him to refuse, to forfeit his convictions, and he would not do it."

So now the young man is classified a "deserter," a fugitive from his homeland.

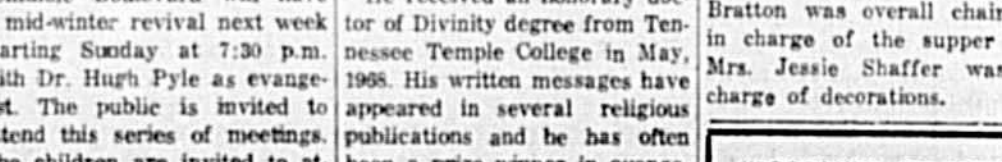
It's the kind of situation about which many parents, some of them clergymen, are increasingly baring their personal feelings, equating teaching of their homes and churches with the stands taken by their young about the war.

"Why speak now?" asks the Rev. Dr. G. Wayne Glick, president of Kenosha College, Kenosha, Wis. "I realize now that... I was asking him to refuse, to forfeit his convictions, and he would not do it."

Although most major religious bodies, Protestant, Roman Catholic and Jewish, have urged draft law changes recognizing the right of selective conscientious objection to a specific war, the appeals so far have gone unheeded.

PARIS — (NEA) — Parisians have gone all "kitsch" — the "locomotives" (French for jet set or anybody with any pretensions of being "in"). And what does "kitsch" stand for here? First of all, a rebellion against the Establishment. A passion for the old five and ten cent store triva, plastic jewelry or anything that comes out of the grab bag.

"Kitsch" is German for cheap stuff, shoddy stuff. Translated into today's French, it means anything purposely lacking in good taste. In other words, deliberate bad taste.

Recently at a "kitsch" party chez Regine, the ultra-chic night spot on the Left Bank, guests were told to come "kitsch." This provided a perfectly awful display of bad taste. A man came in a dinner jacket embroidered in silver motorbikes. Another had his high black suede boots dotted with pale diamonds. A well-known model wore blue jeans turned up over red and white striped football socks, orange eye shadow and a blouse dotted with colored plastic rabbits.

But what started as a snob thing seems to have caught on. There are traces of kitsch in fashions, in interior decoration, in the art of living. One ho-ho-ho no longer ago served cranberry jelly with smoked eel and cabbage stuffed with mussels, something to send a shudder through all the chefs in this capital of cuisine.

The past summer's ready-to-

wear shoes had some "kitsch" touches, such as naive prints and fabrics, soft lines everywhere, lashes of cherries or flowers in the hair, pastel platform sandals, Shirley Temple curly wigs, boss and fussy gloves.

Parisians are combing old trunks of town apartments and attics of country homes to unearth all those "atrocities" so fashionable in the '20s and once the pride of their parents. Anything in the way of furniture and bric-a-brac circa 1925 to 1945 is fetching comfortable prices. This also includes souvenirs from seaside holidays, plates and mugs decorated with seaside or country views, sets of flying china ducks for the living-room wall, art nouveau vases. All are grist to the mill of the Flea Market, as well as bric-a-brac shops.

In great demand too, are sofa dolls, tasseled lame cushions, dressing-table sets, bonbonnières, Dresden china shepherdesses and other figurines, glass trays, bookends to go along with occasional bits of furniture, such as tables with highly veneered surfaces, glass trays and even those atrocious china umbrella stands once the feature of an entrance hall. All these and myriad other things which the bright young set thought completely lacking in beauty and artistic value are snapped up by the snobs.

At the Flea Market there is no special "kitsch" stall but it is not difficult to unearth the absolutely ugly piece — at a price.

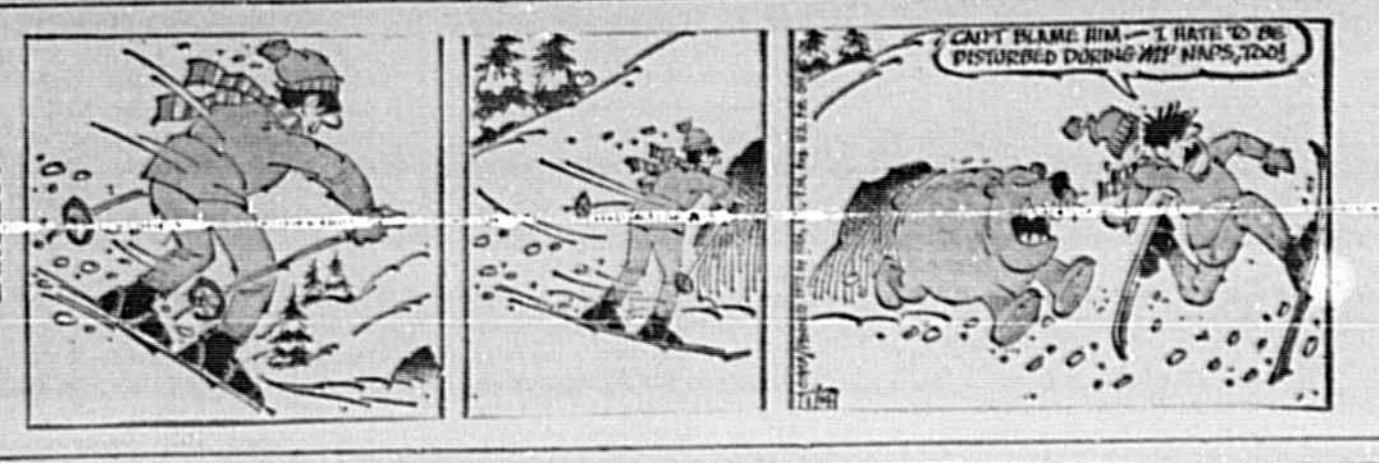

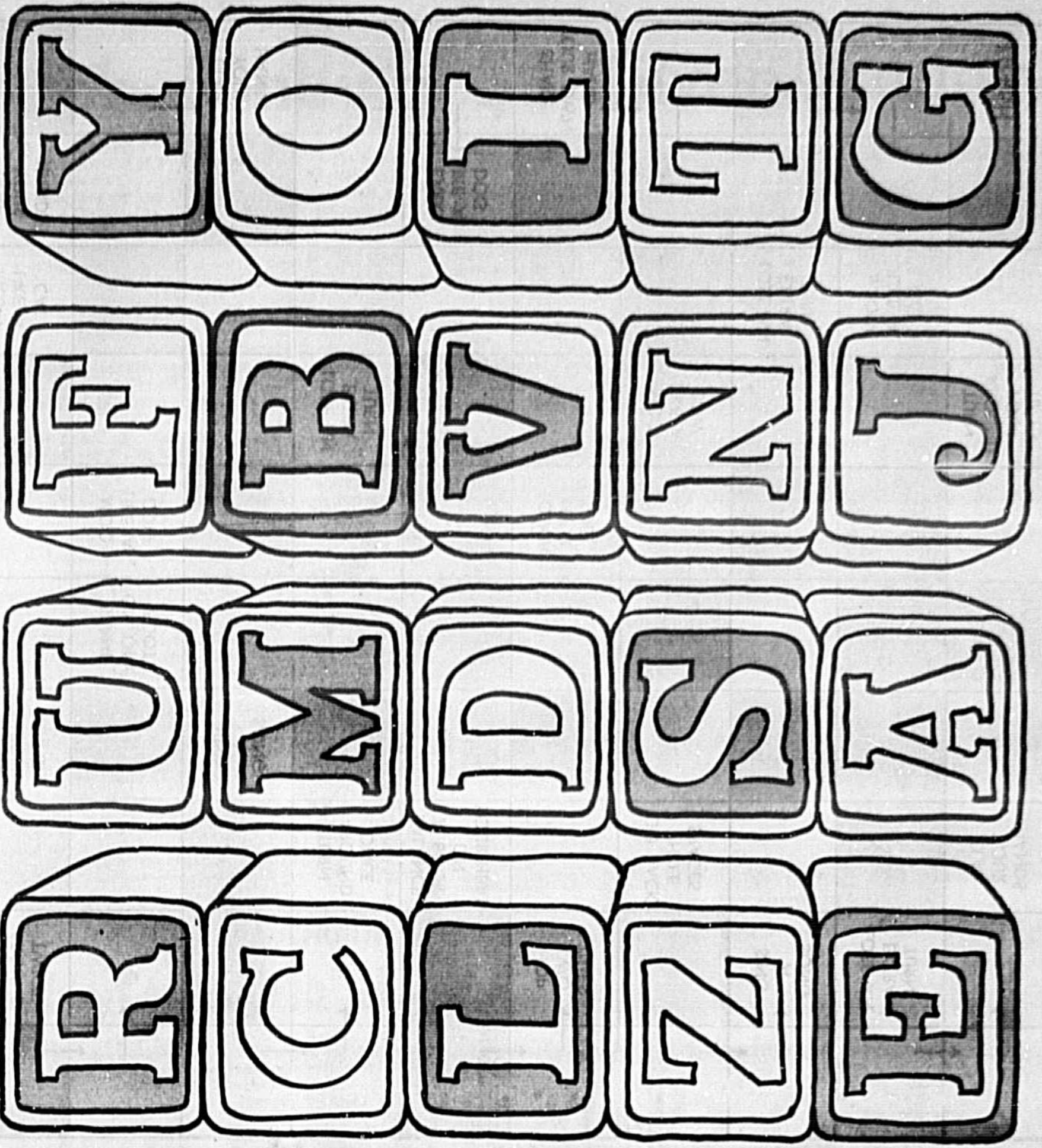

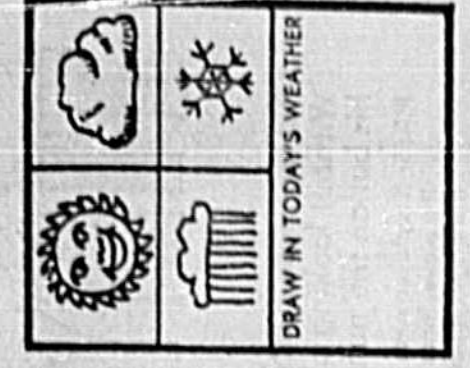
