

A 30-year-old Sanford man has been charged with murder in the beating death of his father and attempted murder in the shooting of two sheriff's deputies early today. 



Officials said the juvenile, who was before Circuit Judge Tom Waddell Jr. in juvenile court on a failure to appear charge stemming from traffic citations, had been returned to the adjacent jury room where six other juveniles were also being held pending appearances before the court when the dark-haired youth made his bid for freedom by climbing through the asbestos ceiling

When Mike Galloway, transportation officer at the Seminole Regional Juvenile Detention Center, discovered the 17-year-old was missing he climbed above the ceiling to go after the juvenile, court officials said. Huth was goint to assist when he fell, striking

Bad Publicity Fuels Reforms

News about congressional hanky-panky, drones on the payroll, extravagant expense accounts and other scandal under the Capitol dome is embarrassing to Congress as a whole, and hearing it inspires neither pleasure nor pride in the American people. The silver lining is that bad publicity is the fuel of reform.

But unhappy headlines from the House of Representatives must inspire more than blushes if the corrective system is going to work. A 15-month effort by a House committee on reform went out the window when a majority of representatives obwindow when a majority of representatives objected to one thing or another in its recommendations for change. The net result, then, is one more scandalous failing — the inability of the House to put itself in order.

This has been an uphill struggle all along. Though members of Congress are either Democrats or Republicans, most of them lean toward absolute members when it are not to the struggle and the struggl

oward absolute monarchy when it comes to the prerogatives of their Washington jobs. Almost any reform putting a tighter rein over an individual member's power to run his own office and staff as he sees fit must overcome a built-in lethargy.
Resentment toward yielding any personal
prerogatives could be expected; but the public has
a right to expect a sacrifice of those prerogatives

when they are being abused.

Rep. David R. Obey, the Wisconsin Democrat who headed the reform group, says many members of Congress are piqued at the news coverage which resulted when the House decided recently to make olic record of expense accounts. This has made vious that some lawmakers are straining the ition of official business to justify expenses. So what? The purpose of going public with such records was to put people on the spot when they went ludicrous explanations for spending the

Publicity can't hurt Congress or any public hody if the facts brought to light show that elected officials are being prudent and judicious with the powers they exercise. If Congress favors an open government, and we think it does, its responsibility is to make sure there is nothing to hide in the back rooms of congressional suites.

Speaker Tip O'Neill is upset at the 252 to 160 vote that seems to have blocked action on the

reform proposals for the current session, and he ought to be. "The public wants this place cleaned up," he declared. So it does, and the approach of an election year should be making members of Congress nervous.

Most Americans would like to believe that the

man or woman who represents them in Congress is not keeping a double set of books and is sincerely interested in creating an efficient lawmaking body. Indeed, the majority of the 435 House members doubtless fall in that category. What that majority must come to realize is that the abuses of a few are going to hurt everyone until the rules and procedures which permit those abuses are



It was a battle of former Alabama quarterbacks — Todd, 23, a relatively untried successor to Joe Namath, playing with a ragtag second division team, and Ken Stabler, 31, and eight-year veteran barking signals for the best club in pro football.

"A"A tremendous athlete, "The Big Bear said of young Todd "Strong as a horse. Tought. Good football mind. He led our wish-
