If you are one of the many Americans who incurred legitimate medical expenses during 1970 and plan to deduct them from your income tax, you'd better be able to prove it. The Internal Revenue Service, alerted to the possibility of large scale fraud on the part of those who claim medical bills which were in fact paid by insurance companies or other sources, has ordered a nation-wide crackdown on taxpayers who attempt to circumvent the

IRS auditors will demand more evidence than ever before regarding claimed medical payments. Even canceled checks and doctors' receipts no longer will be accepted as bona fide proof of payment. This year's return will ask: "How much of this fee was paid by an insurance company or by a union health and welfare program?"

Be careful how you answer. The IRS will be roing over many returns with the proverbial fine tooth comb in an effort to nip any scheme to deduct insurance covered medical expenses in the bud. So if you had any such expenses, and paid them yourself, you'd best hang onto every scrap of evidence concerning the payment. Otherwise, you could wind up paying Uncle Sam - with interest. - Macon (Ga.) News

A two-way push, pro and con is going for the sale of fish. It is felt particularly in the mealsaway-from-home business. First, heart specialists and nutritionists are urging people. particularly men, to learn to eat and enjoy fish because of its polyunsaturated fat, which is said to help in the prevention of heart disease. More and more men are now following this ad-

Then, out of the blue, comes the removal of millions of cans of polluted tune fish from the market Although the Food and S Drug Administration swears that despite the fact 23 per cent of all samples tested have contained excessive amounts of mercury, there is no danger. It is not a health hazard, they

Even so, the popular tuna sandwich is quickly disappearing from the lunch counter

The frozen Pacific swordfish gets into the mercury act, too. The FDA is withdrawing a large percentage of the frozen fish from the market. So where does that leave our increasing sea-

food restaurants. Edmund Lillys, a knowledgeable judge of fish quality and also owner of the renowned Gloucester House on East 50 Street in New York, is worried about present and future busi-

"So many things today af fect business adversely we can't tell exactly what is happening over this latest fish contamination scare. But we de know everyone seems frightened. They are constantly talking about the mercury in fish." Lillys explains.

Higher prices, economic slowdown and increasing unemploymeni are some of the other adverse circumstances.

"Fish is a nervous business Weather affects it, particularly snow. Right now, besides worry over mercury in fish, we have another problem. Crime in the streets. Our luncheon business is a sell-out. But fewer people are willing to come out at night. fearing muggings and holdups, even on East 50th St., one of the safest in the city." he reports "So we can't tell exactly what

the effect of the mercury scare has on our sales. There are too many other things at the same time. But people keep asking about swordfish, for example, even though ours is not frozen and comes from off Virginia. not the Pacific People fee something is wrong, though they don't fully understand. I think we are now becoming acutely aware of pollution. Pollution of our food. This certainly doesn't help business, not ever ours despite our reputation for the finest fresh fish obtainable." Steadily rising prices for fish in eating places is also hurting

"Prices must go up. There is no greater amount of fish being brought to market. Yet there are many more customers to day because wives are cautioning their husbands to eat fish for lunch. For their hearts sakes, as the doctors warn. So the men order fish at a restaurant. They don't particularly like it. But gradually fish is better prepared and then they begin to enjoy it. So we build up a new line of customers. But there will not be more fish available. So the prices must go up."

Lillys, a Greek born in Istan bul, was raised in the fish busi ness. He sees many changes a head in the American life style. He is active among leading restaurant groups.

"Pollution, of fish, or any thing is something we must all tackle. It will cost everyone a lot of money. But not tackling it will cost us much more money. And probably our health too." he states rather gloomily.

Associated Press Writer When I was in Paris some m years ago, the dining room of the Hotel Meurice attracted food lovers like a lodestone, thanks to the culinary art of its chef, Lucien Chassegnat.

A friend of mine, who recently stopped at the fine old hotel, said Chassegnat still is there supervising seven under-chefs and three assistants in the kitchens where he has reidened for 47 6

When the mood calls, Chassegnat can spin yarns by the hour about the good old days before inflation and other modern ..

He likes to bark back to the era before World War II when the Grand Saile, a stately room ' now only used for private functions, was the gathering place for Europe's "Beautiful Peo

Those were the days when King Alfonso of Spain used to frequent the Meurice. On one occasion, he ordered lamb chops for himself and his guests. he Spanish ambassador to Paris, a Meurice regular. detested lamb and appealed to Chassegnat. The imaginative chef made up the breast of a small fowl to look like a lamb chop and did such a good job it even fooled the king.

The chef also remembers the grim period of World War II when Adolf Hitler's troops occupied Paris and the Meurice was taken over as headquarters for the Nazi High Command. Those were the days when a lovely painting that graced the Grand Salle was covered with a por trait of Hitler.

My friend says Chassegnat is now telling an anecdote about a memorable night when artist Salvadore Dali hosted a dinner at the Meurice and brought along his pet ocelot, a nervous

animai The beast was lying at the feet of its famous master when a waiter brought in a haunch of venison and deposited it in front of the host. The tantalizing odor was too much and the ocelot lunged for the main dish, bringing down table cloth, silverware and glasses with a resounding

The room was a shambles of scattered food and broken china, but the guests found it all very amusing.

"Monsieur Dali has friends with a rare sense of humor," says Chassegnat with a shrug. Chassegnat never tires of rooking, it seems, and spends his days off whipping up experimental dishes for his friends, He also serves longtime favorites like Trout Dauphine, and

here is his recipe. TROUT DAUPHINE Split and bone six trout and saute the filets in butter on both sides, until about half cooked. Use your favorite recipe for sweetened crepes and make 12 of them about the same shape as the filets. Place each filet on a crepe and top each with 4 cup shredded crab meat (if canned, soak crab in cold water for about five minutes).

Make 24 cups of a Sauce Mornay and spread two teaspoons full on each filet. Roll up the crepes with the filets inside and place in a large skillet with remainder of Mornay sauce thinned with some white wine, Cook for 10 minutes over medium heat, stir and add remaining crab meat to sauce. Grate Swiss cheese on top of each crepe and slide pan under broiler for 5 minutes to melt cheese. Serves six persons. Serve with a chilled dry white wine or a
