Marion's Double In 10th Gives Locals Victory By 1-Run Margin

Senators Outfit Sanford Nine In Both Matches But Alex-Men Make Safeties Count, Errors Costly For Orlando

The Sanford Lookouts made it a two-run, both in the time of the week-end Orlando Senators. In both games the Senators out-hit the Lookouts, 12 to 10 in the Saturday night session, and 10 to 12 in yesterday's extra-innings.

The Senators weather twice chased the Lookouts out of the park. In the first game, the Senators collected a brace of safeties before Red Marion, with a long high double to center, got the finishing touch. The game with a three-run margin ending rally that barely beat the "curfew law."

In another close contest at Daytona Beach, the DeLand Reds staged a comeback to the win column by pushing across a single tally in the 10th to break up a pitching duel between Kerr for the Reds and Shroba for the Islanders by a 4 to 3 score in favor of the Red Hots.

At St. Augustine, the Gainesville G-Men bunched most of their 11 hits off three Saint hurriers in the first and the seventh frames to defeat the ancient city crew handily by a score of 7-3.

The G-Men scored four runs in the first inning on six hits and three more tallies in the seventh on three hits and a walk. The Saints collected one run in the second and two more counters in the last of the seventh for their tally. Three tossers for the deaths gave up only three safeties to the Saints.

Sid Hudson To Hurl For Locals Against Palatka Here Tonight

Sidney Charles Hudson, top mound hand of not only the club but of the League as well, will head the line tonight when the Palatka Azaleas land here for the initial row of a two-till series.

The positioners are temporarily under the management of Backstop Jeff Emerson, following the suspension of Herb Letitz, formerly playing manager, who will be replaced by a Texas athlete expected in Palatka sometime this week to take over the managerial reins of the team which to date has a record of 10 wins against 25 losses for the far-from-impressive percentage of .286.

Sanford's league-leading team, on the other hand have piled up a 28-4 record so far this season to give them a season percentage of .875.

Hudson has a record of seven wins in seven starts and no losses. Three of the wins have been shutouts, with one of those only a four-hitter.

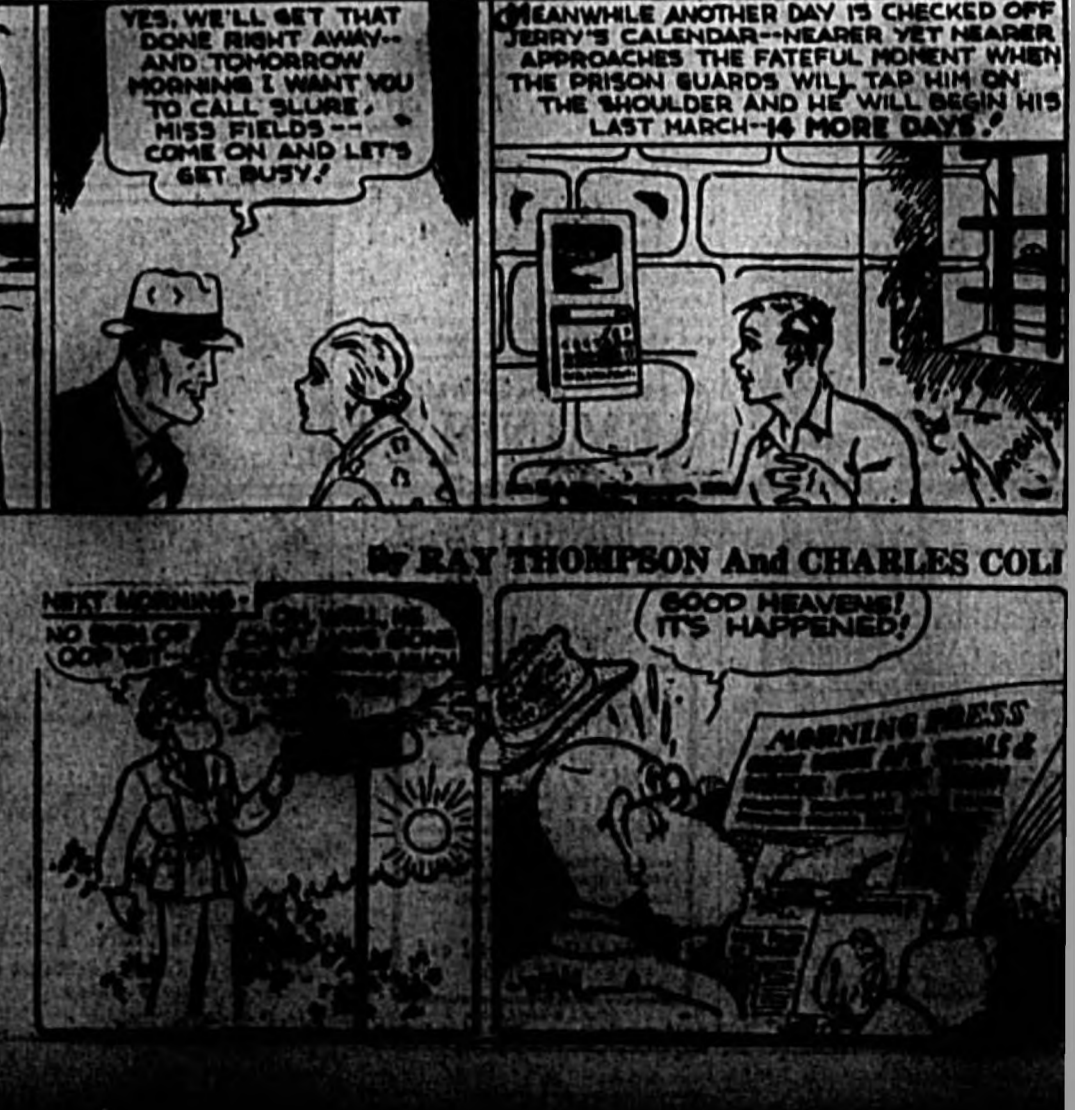
