New Conditions In The 70s And Manpower Use will continue to rise, with married women account-Effective use of the major human resources of

manpower has always challenged management. In these space-age 70s, the complications of advancing technology, re-structured organizations, and the persistent fallibility of human nature make their own

When light is shed on manpower, there should be an acceptance of the facts and an honest effort to make it practical and usable.

Pertinent to this point of view are recent reports from the U.S. Department of Labor which deal Employers, students, workers, union officials, educators and government officials are advised by

Secretary of Labor J. D. Hodgson, that; "The most dramatic increase in the labor force will be among persons aged 25 to 34, young adults entering their prime working years who will be bet-

ing for the major share of the increase. "White-collar workers will outnumber blue-collar employes by more than 50 per cent in 1978; yet, 31 million workers will still be employed in blue-collar jobs, a rise of more than 2 million over 1970."

Factual information has a way of drying up and being relegated to the shelf. But the very weight of the information supplied by these three paragraphs is such that any ignoring of it by management, regardless of the size or complications of the organization, can only result in a wastage.

There is another aspect which has a very important and useful contribution in a matter which is knocking on the door of management, especially when that management is within the educational tinue at that level.

This was supplied by Brunswick A. Bragdon, Southeastern Regional Director of the department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. It applies to

"The most dramatic change in the college-trained professional labor force in the 70s will be the eversupply of elementary and secondary school

He estimates that the supply of such teachers may be more than three-fourths above needs for the 1968-80 period and points out that about 70 per cent of all college graduates who enter teaching are wom-

Attention to such reports is well worth giving. For instance, the girl student who wants a professional career is advised to look into other professions where the demand is high and promises to con-

Top rating is given to education which leads to the training of chemists, counselors, dieticians, dentists, physicians and physicists with engineers, geologists and geophysicists, and optometrists in welcome and useful!

Thus we believe that the Labor Department has rendered a major service in providing this and more information which shows that the work force will be made up of more youth and more women, with major occupational shifts taking place.


High Jail Pay

In fact, the first impression a visitor gets when passing through the weathered concrete pillars that mark the camp entrance is one of overwhelming. almost erie, quietitude, There is absolutely no noise. Even the dogs are silent.

And there's the Spanish moss. It's everywhere: Hanging it graceful gray swaths from the live oaks, cabbage palms and pines that grow in wild profusion in Cassadaga, Drooping from telephone lines. And even swaying gently from the gables that crown some of the medi-

ums' homes. The moss and foliage is so thick that a perpetual gloom is cast over the shrouded lanes that meander through the camp. The trees grow right to the lakes, that include Spirit Lake and Lake Colby, named in honor of George P. Colby, founder of the camp who named it after
