



War End Not Deserving Of Celebration

The immense private thankfulness felt by Americans at the coming of peace in Vietnam only serves to underscore the absence of public

Saturday, Jan. 27, 1973, will not be remembered as "VV Day" - Victory in Vietnam Day - the way we proclaimed VE Day and VJ Day in World War II or Armistice Day in World War I.

The Vietnam war was just not that kind of war; the world is not that kind of world any

Americans will never again experience the crazy exhileration and joy that drove them into the streets in the spring and summer of 1945 when the news came that the last Nazis had surrendered and later that the Japanese empire had capitulated.

It was Korea that taught us this in 1950-53. The war there never really had a definite end; nothing was really definitely settled. In fact, the war was never really declared. Like Vietnam, the fighting continued unabated while the peace negotiations dragged on endlessly

Yet even Korea was different from Vietnam. There was no withdrawal of American troops prior to a cease-fire, no disengagement of them from ground combat.

But Korea gave us new definitions of "victory" or "peace." No longer did it mean that your troops paraded down the streets of the enemy's capital, merely that the enemy's troops did not parade down your streets, or those of your ally. That was the most you could settle for. Even today, 50,000 American troops guard

the 38th parallel in Korea, which tens of thousands of men died trying to obliterate and other tens of thousands gave their lives to

There will, thankfully, be no American troops in Vietnam or elsewhere in old Indochina, according to the peace terms hammered out in Paris-though no doubt Thailand will now

Sales Are Hitting A New High

Copley News Service In the good old days, if you were in the retail music business the band instrument was king. Shiny cornets, throaty saxophones and slide trombones were what every kid wanted to play and there was a big market.

The potential customers among young people did not just happen. Indeed, it may be said that the American school band movement was more the result of careful promotion and development by band instrument manufacturers and their retail outlets, than it was the studied invention of music teachers and curriculum experts.

By the 1930s, virtually every city and hamlet in the country had a school band with flashy uniforms, prancing majorettes and a booster club of admiring parents. Meredith Willson, who grew up in a small Iowa town, wrote "The Music Man" with obvious personal knowledge In his popular musical it is the unmusical character of

Prof. Harold Hill who sells band instruments in tiny midwestern villages with the premise to teach the local kids how to play them. As we know, it was his practice to skip town with the money before the lessons had to begin. Salesmen and customers are more sophisticated today

but school bands continue to occupy a place on curricula. Bandsmen also remain an important consumer group for the

Times change, however, and some music educators have begun to question just how culturally enriching big football marching bands really are. The quality of concert band literature is also a matter of question in the minds of some

For their parts, young people seem to be shifting their musical interests, or, if youthful interests are not actually changing they are at least expanding. The representative of a music store put it this way, "Our band instrument sales have remained much the same as always in recent years, but we have had a revolution in sales for all kinds of guitars and amplifying systems. The growth has been phenomenal."

The revolution spoken of began with the Beatles almost a decade ago and has gained momentum annually. Pops and rock concerts are more popular than ever and, of course, instrument makers have been quick to cash in on the wave of

In 1960, for example, 420,000 fretted instruments (guitars and banjos) and amplifiers were sold. Last year this number had increased to 2.6 million units amounting to a dollar value of more than \$200 million.

According to the American Music Conference president Ted McCarty, sales of all types of musical instruments hit an all-time high in 1971, with a total volume of \$1.1 billion. McCarty believes that total volume this year could rise by as much as 12 per cent.

Nixon Flexes His Muscle of Office

People in this town seem absolutely obsessed with President Nixon's behavior since his re-election. Yet, with all the reporting and all the comment on his isolalation, his failure to consult and explain, there is something elusive here.

Maybe the mystery is that there is no mystery. We may simply be witnessing a coming together of elements about Mr. Nixon, and about the presidency, which are highly familiar both to the professional White House watcher and the average American. If this is so, then it could be that the only really new thing is that these elements somehow are reinforcing each other as never Let's look at some of them, one by one.

· First, the growth in the use of presidential power relative to congressional power has been going on a long time. Historians mark its beginnings with Abraham Lin-coln and the Civil War, find it got a huge boost with Woodrow Wilson in World War I, then another with Franklin D. Roosevelt in the depression and World War II. From that time forward, the progression has been steady, moderated only slightly by Dwight D. Eisenhower's more limited concept of his office. Wars showed presidents - and people - how the presi-

which the president acted both with speed and great constitutional freedom. · Second, this entire trend was quickly recognized as peculiarly suited to the interests and the special make-up

of Richard Nixon. The foreign field is his great love. In it his feeling is one of confidence both in his knowledge and in his capacity to make decisions. He wants expert counsel, as from Henry Kissinger, but not too much. Whatever Mr. Nixon's insecurities, they do not extend to this realm. Furthermore, in an office where "loners" are not uncommon, he is the loner almost without parallel. He is not a man who consults widely, nor one who ever feels easy with many people. His instinct is unmistakably for isolation and withdrawal. He always found campaigning personally distasteful, and now he is free of it forever.

· Third, Mr. Nixon over the years could watch a Congress losing strong leaders, falling into disparate parts, not using its powers. Once in the White House, it was an irresistible temptation to underline congressional hieffectiveness by pressing ever harder with presidential initiatives - not just in the foreign field, but against the glacially immobile federal bureaucracy.

· Fourth, he has just won an overwhelming re-election verdict. One could argue that it was basically a default victory over an ineffectual opponent. But its magnitude also gave it the ring of an endorsement. You could say this vote is a "new element," but there is another way to Presidents before Mr. Nixon have won smashing tri-

umphs and history advises that such victors-especially when they do not have to run again - often feel emboldened to use their powers to the fullest, even to the point of overreaching. If Mr. Nixon is now doing that, as even some of his friends believe, it is not, then, altogether a new phe-

The perplexity arises, I suggest again, from the way all these things have combined. President Nixon, holding the world's greatest public office, seems on his way to stamping his second term as the era of the private presidency. And in the strange blend of trends that lead him this way, there may be grave danger for him - and the

A Good Word Put In for Medication

One of those truths we take for granted these days is that we live in a drug-oriented, overmedicated society. Deluged with drug advertising on television, watching their parents pop aspirins and tranquilizers, it's only natural that kids - who are apparently incapable of independent, rational thought - stick needles in their veins. Or so it is explained by many experts.

But while an undetermined number of people use medications excessively, "at the same time, another undetermined but certainly greater number of people who should be on medications ignore them because they don't get medical attention, can't afford it, refuse it, fail to get prescriptions filled, endure pain needlessly in accordance with the Puritan ethic, or are being educated to equate drug use with personal failings."

So writes C. Joseph Stetler in a letter to Science, submitting the novel conclusion that "on balance, then, we are probably an undermedicated society.'


He adds that critics give little attention to the present gains drug therapy affords society in lives saved, illnesses aborted or relieved, hospital stays shortened or prevented entirely, time saved on the job, etc.-all of incalculable human and economic benefit.

Stetler writes as a representative of the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association, a fact which in some eyes will cast suspicion on anything he might say about drugs. It is always useful, however, to question accepted wisdom, if only to keep the wise men in touch with reality.

Decision Expected On Bell Rate Hike

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP)—Public Service Commissioner William T. Mayo says a decision on Southern Bell Telephone Company's request for a hefty \$32.8 million emergency rate boost can be expected within six weeks. But first, the commission will consider a motion by Atty. Gen. Robert Shevin to

Shevin appearing at a public hearing here Tuesday urged the commission to refuse the "interim" rate hike, labeling it a" "piecemeal" increase that is "patently unfair and unreasonable.

Southern Bell, which serves about 70 per cent of the state, wants to boost in stallation fees for business and home phones to bring in an immediate \$32.8 million. The request actually is part of a \$106.8 million rate hike —the largest ever sought by a Florida utility.

Mayo said the overall request will involve six to nine months investigation, further hearings and

Calvin Greene, physical plant director at the University of Florida, testified that the proposed installation hike would cost the university an added \$2,025 a year. The centrex tariff increase, he said. would cost another \$22,500.

Gary MacDonald, president of a Memphis, Tenn. Utility consulting company, told the commissioners that some rates imposed by Southern Bell in Florida are higher than similar categories in other southern

He called the company's request "excessive and

Defending the rate hike, southern Bell vice president James Brown stated, "the company urgently needs this rate increase. We cannot wait.'


