



Presence Of Jap Planes Overt Act

Marshall Testifies U. S. Justified In Bombing Them When InU.S. Waters

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13, (AP)—General Marshall to day expressed belief that the country would have backed the air force had it bombed any Japanese ships appearing in Hawaiian waters before the war began. The former Chief of Staff declared that the presence of Japanese ships in our waters, as well as a flight of their planes overhead, would have constituted an overt act. And he added we would have been justified in bombing them.

The subject came up when Republican Representative Frank Keefe of Wisconsin noted that Marshall's warning of Nov. 27, 1941, expressly told the Hawaiian commander that the United states wanted Japan to commit the first overt act. Murshall said again

that those instructions were sent to Lieut. General Walter Short by President Roosevelt's order. Marshall explained that any sudden unannounced appearance of Japanese vessels or planes could be considered an overt act and that the country would have supported an attack on them.






