The Big Trial

There are some unfortunate features about that historic trial of the German war criminals at Nuernberg. According to the radio reports, especially those of the American news commentator Baukhage, while the trial is conducted honestly enough, it is handled in such a routine way that it becomes dull and uninteresting.

Here is one of the greatest international court trials of all modern history, dealing with facts, problems and principles of incalculable importance to the whole modern world.

It is not by such dullness that the world is to be waked up and brought to realize the perils this modern world has suffered, and their causes and cures.

Debt Cutting Begins

Debt reduction has begun. This good news will surprise many taxpayers who know that the federal government plans to reduce its huge debt, but have not heard of the process starting.

Every state in the Union, according to a Commerce Department report, lowered its gross debt in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1945. The total reduction was \$321,000,000, bringing the gross debt of the states down to \$2,471,000,000.

The upsurge of business has been the main reason for the states' being able to do this. Sales taxes, which many states have enacted, and license fees, have lately brought huge sums into state treasuries.

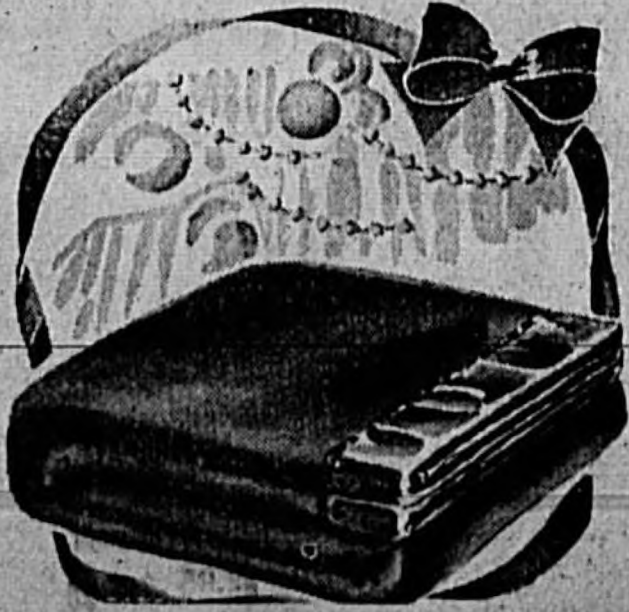

will be delayed because the 800 defendants have not yet been notified of the charges against them. Those who are held, however, are suspected of mistreating Allied war prisoners. At Nuernberg, American prosecutors piled up evidence of one Nazi violation of international law after another. A secret S-S order was produced showing that the German high command directed that escaped war criminals who later were recaptured should be thrown into the Mathausen Camp. And their fate was to be kept secret from the International Red Cross.

The dossier on Nazi crimes against humanity also was thickened by an affidavit from Rudolph Kastner, a Zionist leader in Budapest. His statement charged the S-S troops abducted almost half a million Hungarian Jews in 1944, alone, and sent them to the Reich in death trains. Those who were too young or too old to serve as slaves in the German war plants, he said, automatically were consigned to death in Nazi concentration camps.

NUERNBERG, Dec. 13. (AP)—American prosecutors at the Nuernberg war-crimes trial produced documents today to show up the Nazis in another violation of international law -- the use of prisoners of war to work in munitions factories.

The documents named one of the 21 top Nazis on trial -- slave labor boss Fritz Sauckel -- as having announced at one time that prisoners formed a large part of the 800,000 slave workers in German munitions plants.

Another defendant, Nazi Munitions Minister Albert Speer -- was named also as having been involved in the flagrant breach of international law. He recommended at one time that prisoners of war who escaped and were recaptured be sent to arms factories as "convicts."

The prosecutors also opened their attack on the German concentration camp system. And assistant United States prosecutor Thomas J. Dodd declared the camps represented what he called the "commission of crimes against humanity on a grand scale." Said Dodd:

"The Nazi realized early that without the most drastic measures to repress opposition they could never consolidate their power."

The Nov. 27 warning also told the commanders at Pearl Harbor that while they were to wait for Japan to take the first step toward hostilities, they were not bound to jeopardize their own defense.

This is General Marshall's seventh day on the stand. It was also brought out that Cordell Hull may have met with the Jap envoys, Nomura and Kurusu, without knowing that they were instructed to tell him that the negotiations were off.

General Marshall got his dander up at today's hearing of the congressional inquiry into Pearl Harbor. The former Army Chief of Staff was being asked repeatedly about warning messages sent to Hawaii in the last few days before the disaster. Flushing with anger, Marshall told the investigators that the Army commander in Hawaii was given a definite alert order before the Japanese attacked. And said Marshall, he had counted on that order being carried out.

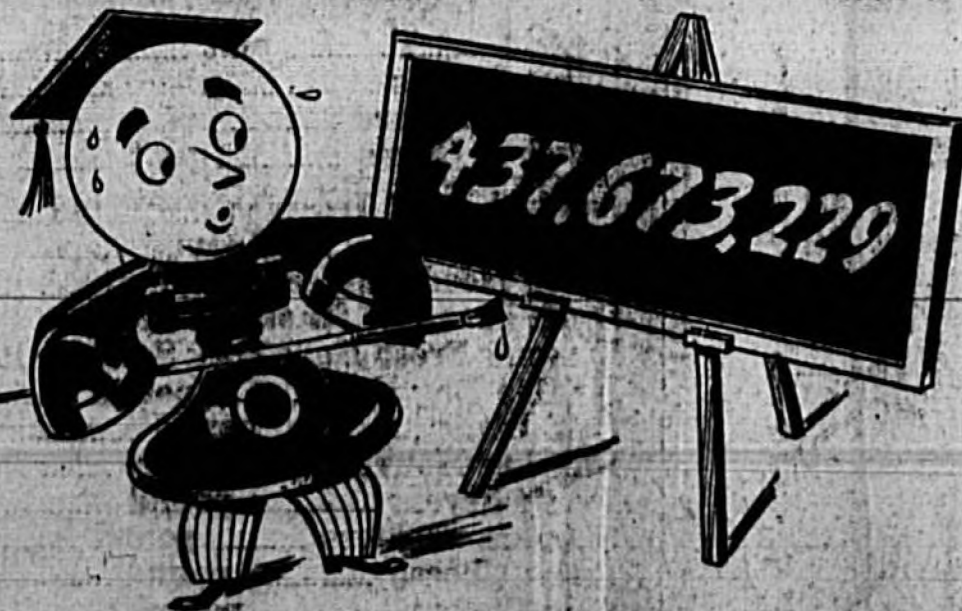

(Continued from Page One) medical care, financial aid and welfare services for the unemployed. MacArthur told the Japs that

when their plan is ready, it must be submitted in detail to Allied headquarters for approval. Meanwhile, MacArthur's headquarters has issued an explanation of the current controversy over the destruction of five Japanese cyclotrons. The statement said the scientific instruments were destroyed on direct orders of the War Department in Washington. However, MacArthur said

a few days after the order had been received -- and after the cyclotrons had been destroyed -- his headquarters got an inquiry from Washington as to the feasibility of shipping one of the cyclotrons to the United States. Scientist-critics in the United States have compared the destruction of the cyclotrons in Japan to the Nazi book-burning and similar curbs upon the quest for knowledge in Europe. The Japanese diet continued its special session today and heard Premier Kijuro Shidehara promise a reformation in the upper chamber of the Japanese parliament -- the House of Peers.

Postmaster Urges Early Xmas Mailing

Mail your Christmas packages early in order to avoid the "bottle-neck" holiday jam, and to insure packages arriving in time for Christmas, today advised Postmaster Joel S. Field. The following mailing instructions were given by Mr. Field: Postage should be fully prepaid on all mail matter. Addresses should be complete, in ink, and the sender's name and address should be written or printed in the upper left hand corner.

Packing and wrapping should be given careful attention with the use of strong, durable containers and secure wrapping. Parcels should not be sealed except when they bear a printed endorsement reading, "contents merchandise, Postmaster. This parcel may be opened for postal inspection if necessary." Special delivery envelopes mail to the most expeditious handling and also entitles it to special delivery at the office of address.

TIENTSIN, China, Dec. 13. (AP) Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek appeared today in the ancient Chinese city of Peiping for the first time in many years. Dispatches received in Tientsin disclosing Chiang's surprise visit to Peiping made no mention of the Nationalist or Chinese Premier T. V. Soong being present.

However, it was known that the commander of the United States Third (Marine) Amphibious Corps -- Major General Keller Rockey -- has been in Peiping for several days. Presumably General Rockey has been meeting with Chiang and his party.

Two of the Japs have been sentenced to death by hanging and three others were given prison terms, ranging from ten years to life. A third death sentence has been commuted.
