HUPMOBILE SALES CONTINUE AHEAD OF ALL EXPECTATIONS

As in many ways the most gratifying month in all Hupmobile history, according to figures just released by the Sales Department of the Hup Motor Car Corporation.

At this writing, the company has already exceeded the sales and production quota set for the year ending December 31, 1922, and is starting in the current month with an October output schedule at least 75 per cent greater than the most optimistic plans called for early in the year.

The confidence attached to the situation is pointed out, lies in the fact that the definitely scheduled program for the year called for not less than a 100 per cent increase in the domestic sales over last year.
