Also dropped from the revised hymnal is another old-timer long on the theological hit parade: "From Greenland's Icy Mountains." The literary adviser for the new hymnal felt this one had "imperialistic connotations."

A third old standby, "I Want to

Be Like Jesus," also was scrapped. Without presuming to secondguess the experts on the theological reasons for killing these old favorites, many of us who have sung them so often cannot help but feel that many a troubled soul may have derived fresh courage and comfort from their words and music. It is to be hoped the hymns which replace them will be as effective.







Not that we feel the season went out with the 19th century. We are sure the bounds of apring are fast on winter's traces. Somewhere a barrel organ's caroling across a golden street, and somewhere the voice of the turtle is heard in the land.




