City seeks consistency in historic codes

SANFORD — Vinyl fences or no vinyl fences? That has been the question in Sanford's downtown Historic District for the past 18 months.

According to homeowners within the district, the inconsistent rulings of the Historic Preservation Board (HPB), the organization formed in 1986 to protect and preserve the historical look of the downtown Sanford Historic District, have left them confused as to whether vinyl material, specifically fences, is allowed. As a result, the city commission has seen an influx of appeals

When it comes to vinyl, city board has been on both sides of the fence

regarding the matter. "The series of appeals woke me up to review what exactly is happening with this board," said Commissioner Randy Jones. "In my opinion the board does a good job, but my concern is that it seems to be inconsistent and micro-managing people's lives in what they can and can not do." However, Scott R. Singelsen, chairman of the HPB, disagrees, saying, the board has ruled consistently on the vinyl fence issue,

as well as all other issues related to the restoration of downtown homes. "We used a trial period to educate ourselves about vinyl fences," said Singelsen, who admits that during that time some vinyl fences were approved. "That time allowed our materials subcommittee to research the issue with other historic districts and state organizations." According to Singelsen, the board decided not to allow vinyl fences and has been

moving in the direction of banning them since sometime last year. "You have to balance what works for the residents with what works for the ordinance and the board," he said. "That's what we were trying to do with the trial period. We didn't try to make a decision in a bubble, that's why we researched other organizations." Tony Daniels, a homeowner within the historic district, was turned down for a vinyl fence by the HPB during its April meeting. However, during the same April meeting, Danielle Trent, who originally received

City Hall employees moving up the block

LAKE MARY — City Hall is moving — at least temporarily. Beginning in September,

employees, who currently have offices in City Hall, will move down the street to the police department on Crystal Lake Avenue. The move is required to make room for renovations and construction on the 11-year-old building, which should take about seven months to complete.

"This has been in the planning for years," said City Manager John Litton. "I think, when the building was built, a 10-year window was planned. That's why it was built on a large piece of property — so City Hall could expand."

The estimated \$1.5 million renovation project will include much needed work to the building's infrastructure, including repairs to the roof and creating flexible office space for the city's growing staff. Although the project does not include a major increase in the building's size, the construction will allow for a more efficient use of existing space.

"City Hall's offices need to reflect today's office operations," Litton said. "Currently, we are just

out of room. Our city hall is nice, but it is very inflexible."

In the remodeled version of the building, "portable" workstations will allow for a growing and changing staff. Mobile space dividers, or movable walls, will give city staff the resources to create new or larger space when needed.

Lake Mary building will be closed during seven-month renovation period

Renovation plans also include moving the building's main entrance. Currently, public parking is accessible from Country Club Road with the entryway to City Hall on the side

of the building. Once construction is finished, public parking will be on Lakeview Avenue and a main entrance will be created.

"The Lakeview entrance ties in with the downtown plan," Litton said. "There will be on-street parking, and the building is going to have a rotunda. Basically, it will be a more user-friendly building."

While construction is under way on City Hall, the amphitheater in front of the building will also undergo major renovations due to structural damage. City Commission however still needs to determine the type of construction and design for the facility.

"The amphitheater that we know today will not be there

Commission gives OK to townhouses near UCF

Seminole County commissioners voted unanimously last week to rezone nearly 46 acres near the University of Central Florida, which will allow Centex Homes to build several two-story town-

homes. The 45.95 acres, located on the northwest corner of McCulloch and Old Lockwood roads, was originally zoned university community property. In order for the land to be developed, Commission approved the rezoning of the property to planned unit development.

"If they had built there 20 years ago, they could have put anything on the property," said Commissioner Grant Maloy. "Now the fellow can't put up a tool shed without getting it rezoned."

Neighboring homeowners fought

the decision during a public hearing Tuesday night just as they had a year earlier when developer Philip Emmer proposed to build a 252-unit student apartment complex in the same location. Homeowners expressed concerns that the project would create traffic problems and increase crime in the area.

"This is different," said Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide. "This is not student housing. I don't know how to convince the public that is the case."

The medium density project, known as Hawthorn Glen, will consist of 225 two-story townhomes and several commercial businesses. As a stipulation of the project, Commission will not allow the developer to use the land for gas stations, bars, fast-food restaurants, dry cleaners or a host of other high-traffic businesses.

New Interstate 4 bridge over St. Johns River to open early Saturday morning

DELAND — Florida Department of Transportation officials say the new eastbound I-4/St. Johns River Bridge will open to traffic early Saturday morning, June 28. Traffic will be shifted from the eastbound lanes of the old bridge to the new eastbound bridge sometime after midnight Friday, June 27.

Work on replacement of the four-lane St. Johns River Bridge with two bridges, featur-

ing three travel lanes and ten-foot-wide inside and outside shoulders on each, began in March, 2001. Traffic was shifted to the new westbound bridge two months ago. The \$110 million project includes widening I-4 from four to six lanes from the bridge to Saxon Boulevard in Volusia County, improvements to the U.S. 19/92 interchange in Seminole County, widening of other I-4 bridges in Seminole and Volusia Counties, and replacement of the Enterprise Road Bridge over I-4 in Volusia County. A sepa-

rate \$28 million project to widen I-4 to six lanes from Lake Mary Boulevard to U.S. 17/92 is also under construction. Both projects are scheduled for completion in the spring or early summer of next year.

Work continues on the widening of I-4 east and west of the new St. Johns River Bridges so traffic on the new eastbound bridge will be restricted to two lanes until widening of I-4 east of the bridge is completed.

Demolition of the old St. Johns River

Bridge will begin immediately after traffic has been shifted to the eastbound bridge. Volusia and Seminole County emergency service agencies will be conducting training on and near the old structure prior to and during the demolition process.

The ramps from U.S. 17/92 to eastbound I-4, which has been closed since September 2001 (21 months) due to the bridge construction project, will reopen to traffic approximately three weeks after traffic is shifted to the new eastbound bridge.

A GLANCE AROUND OUR COUNTY

Stop the pyrotechnics: Can you host a Fourth of July celebration without fireworks? It's happened before. In 1998 Sanford and most other cities in the region abstained from hosting large fireworks shows because of the wild fires raging through Central Florida. There are no wildfires this year, but Sanford's boomday faced a doomsday from a much more formidable obstacle: the *Orlando Sentinel*.

The *Sentinel's* Sanford bureau is in an office at the tip of the marina island in the "hot zone" where crews will launch the aerial explosives. The Sanford Fire Department notified the *Sentinel* and other businesses that no one would be able to occupy the buildings on the east side of the island between 4 and 10 p.m. for safety reasons.

The *Sentinel* objected. The daily paper has closed its Altamonte Springs bureau and told organizers of the July 4 event that its Sanford bureau must remain open 24 hours a day to file stories. Who knows, there might be an explosive housing authority story that breaks just as the bombs begin bursting in air.

Not to worry, though. The *Sentinel* has agreed to make other arrangements and the fireworks show will go ahead as planned.

Address unknown: Speaking of the housing authority, U.S. Rep. Corrine Brown (D-Jacksonville) is objecting to fellow Congressman John Mica's (R-Winter Park) request that the federal government take control of the Sanford Housing Authority.

Brown's campaign slogan is "Corrine delivers," but residents of the housing authority and the Sanford community at large have to wonder just what has been delivered. The housing authority has seen more than its share of troubles during Corrine's 12-year tenure, so if the Congresswoman has delivered it must have been lost in the third-class mail.

It appears Corrine is more upset that Mica's office didn't consult her regarding the request for a federal takeover. The Congresswoman likes to brag that she and her staff are in constant contact with the goings-on at the housing authority. If that's the case, I'd think she would welcome assistance from the top brass at the Department of Housing and Urban Development unless, of course, she's more concerned with who gets credit for delivering.

Red bull's-eye: Been out on the north end of Rinehart Road lately? Work is beginning on St. John's Parkway, an east-west road that will connect Rinehart with Airport Boulevard. Crews have also begun laying block for the new Super Wal-Mart on the east side of Rinehart.

Nothing has been made official, but the Walton family retail empire will have some competition on the west side of Rinehart. Word Around The Clock is that either Target or Kohl's department store is interested in locating in a retail center just north of the GreaseWay on the largest remaining plot of undeveloped land. Preliminary plans call for a retail center of approximately 700,000 square feet with Target or Kohl's as the anchor. City officials are in the early stages of reviewing the project. Stay tuned.

Holding back

Parents need to be involved in their children's education

As the result of FCAT testing in our schools this year in Florida, we can expect to see the largest number of students in our history held back in third grade. Of course, many will be passed because of summer school or other tests that bring their averages higher, but there will be many disgruntled parents and upset youngsters. The children will be losing schoolmates who pass to the fourth grade and will have to go through school with others who are younger. For many, this will be an upsetting time.

Of course, holding someone back because they hadn't learned sufficiently to qualify for an upgrading is nothing new. When I was in elementary school, (K-8) there was one young man with me in the eighth grade who had failed so many grades, he was old enough to join the Army when he finally got out of the eighth grade—which he did.

What is going to happen with the FCAT results from this point on is still anyone's guess, but there is a number of things we can do to help prevent such a hold-back situation in the future, in ANY school grade.

First of all, there are summer schools. Parents ought to be able to tell if a child can't read or do math. Summer school is one of the solutions. Another is one of those self-help audio or video courses being offered these days. Each of these suggestions would probably work well to help upgrade that youngster.

But the MOST important help is from the parents themselves. I don't mean just demanding they do their homework, but assisting or taking on a separate project—such as reading a book with them or giving them some in-home math project such as adding up the grocery receipt to see if it is correct.

Sure, taking time to work with your youngster may not be the best way to use some of that precious evening, but isn't it better than going through the tears and disappointment when your son or daughter is held back a grade in school.

We can probably bet that our educational leaders will do something to bring about changes in this system — changes that do not result in so many retentions.

Will they change curriculum? Will they change the testing procedures? I doubt at this point anyone can say what will happen.

But the fact remains. No parent wants his or her child to fail a grade—no matter the grade level. Therefore, I believe it's up to the parents (and even grandparents) to do whatever it takes.

Playful otters could also be often found darting back and forth like ~~shaky~~ pinballs but then suddenly vanishing once they laid eyes upon the little boy observing their game of tag. I learned to also respect the dangerous currents at certain locations and was warned daily about possible sinkholes and previous drowning of those who did not adhere to elderly advice.

An infinite number of broken seashells layered the hilly banks, reminding me of Florida's prehistoric underwater past. Long, creepy Tarzan-like vines fell from antebellum oaks, which brought life to our games of Jungle Jim as we swung from branch to branch. My grandparents James and Rossie Bradwell purchased several acres of wooded land after World War II and along with this purchase came the Eden-like environment

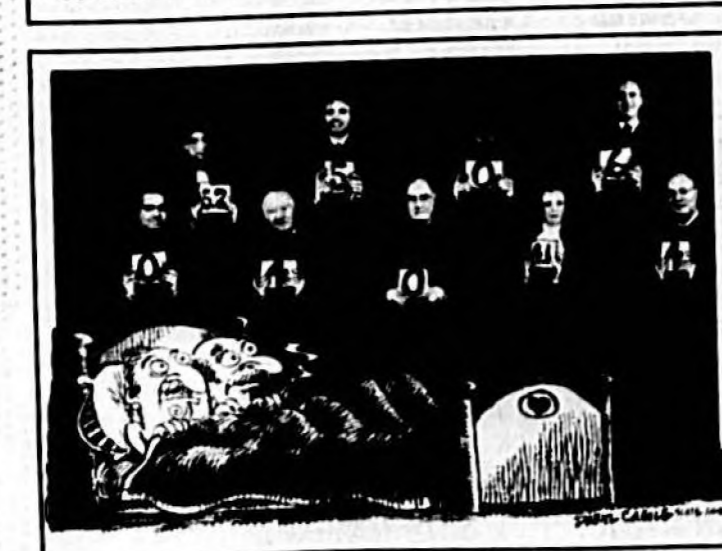
of the Lockhart-Smith Canal, which divided property symmetrically in the middle. Only a few families lived along the banks of the canal, therefore, the children of the community, especially little boys, found it to be as mysterious and compelling as a new Harry Potter novel. We caught cranky old crayfish and made hats from gargantuan-sized elephant ears. Our vast imaginations also allowed us to become the Lone Ranger, Zorro, Superman and all the superheroes of the 1960 era. This was my playground of dreams, hopes, solitude, adventure and finally my paradise. As for little girls, my aunt, how fifty-three years old, lived out her childhood fantasies along the banks of this enchanted canal. While the world's largest Chevrolet dealership, and the beautiful Lake Forest community are less than a mile away from our hidden paradise, it has remained one of the best-kept secrets in Seminole County until recently. It is truly the best of "Old Florida."

Now the few families who still live along the banks of this enchanted place are being faced with change. This change is being called a "Resolution of Necessity" which should reconstruct the channel, stabilize the banks reduce potential for flooding and provide access for regular maintenance to the canal. The Board of Seminole County Commissioners has authorized their staff to proceed with the project and purchase of the needed Drainage Easement. The elimination of flooding hazards and the improvement of water quality are matters of

great concern to the people of Seminole County and are necessary to insure quality of life within the county.

Growth! Growth! And more Growth has brought us to this destructible resolution. We need more apartment complexes like I need another hole in my head, but developers keep building and wildlife keep losing their precious paradise. There is no monetary value that any organization can place upon my memories and joy that I discovered as a mere country boy growing up along the banks of the Lockhart-Smith Canal. My plea to the Seminole County Commissioners and their staff is to please adopt my paradise as theirs and respect this ecological paradise as their own. Replant the trees that must be destroyed and add new ones such as palms and weeping willows. Keep your promise of regular maintenance and replace the old wooded footbridge for my handicapped aunt to cross daily. With this promise, change could be good for all parties, and maybe someday I will be able to walk hand in hand with my little girls along the old banks of the new tropical haven that was made better by the Board of Seminole County Commissioners and their staff. My grandparents had a saying, "It's a poor frog that doesn't praise his own pond." Well, this frog's pond is leaving but the praises will forever be entrapped in my memory of the precious moments I spent upon the banks of the Lockhart-Smith Canal.

Black professionals aren't limited by critic's prejudice

Occasionally, critics of affirmative action will try to persuade me to drop my support for affirmative-action programs, contending that such efforts taint me and other black professionals with assumptions of incompetence. No matter how talented or accomplished I may be, they say, some will always wonder whether I was given good jobs simply because I'm black.

With the Supreme Court's recent ruling backing affirmative action in college admissions, that argument is once again making the rounds. Indeed, Justice Clarence Thomas, who disagreed with the court's majority, holds the view that affirmative action taints its beneficiaries.

In his dissent, he quoted black abolitionist Frederick Douglass to make the point: "And if the negro (sic) cannot stand on his own legs, let him fall also. ... Let him alone! ... Your interference is doing him positive injury."

Thomas is a complicated man. He was admitted to Yale University's School of Law with a boost from affirmative action, yet he has fought having those same benefits extended to oth-

ers. Perhaps Thomas knows that many people perceive his success as the result of preferential treatment — with scant judicial experience, would he have been appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court if he were white? — and he struggles with that burden.

I don't. There is no doubt that my career received an assist from affirmative-action efforts. To hire me right out of college, The Atlanta Journal (now merged with The

Atlanta Constitution) suspended its usual rule of requiring a few years of solid experience at another daily newspaper. They did so as a remedy to years of legally sanctioned discrimination, which barred blacks from professional jobs at Southern newspapers, and years of restrictive social custom, which barred most women.

But they suspended no other rules for me. I was expected to write stories that were clear and concise, with names spelled correctly and numbers that added up. I was expected to stalk politicians trying to evade reporters, decipher budget documents and locate official records.

I had to work hard, since I

lacked experience and didn't know what I was doing. But there were experienced reporters and editors around — white men, given the times — who were more than happy to help me when I came to them for advice. I learned the trade, and I like to think I'm pretty good at what I do.

Are there those who think I'm in my job only because I'm black? Are there critics who suspect I'm just filling the newspaper's political correctness quota? Of course there are. I hear from them frequently. But I know better, so I'm not troubled by what they think. And I doubt that many other affirmative-action beneficiaries allow themselves to be limited by the prejudices of their critics.

Over the last two decades, the biggest group to benefit from corporate affirmative-action efforts has been white women, many of whom know what it's like to be highly competent but subject to old-fashioned stereotypes about their skills. However, no woman who has ever succeeded, whether in medicine, law, architecture, journalism or some other field, allows the prejudice of others to define her.

Nor do successful blacks, who have been subject to the

slander of inferiority for the last 400 years — well before the term "affirmative action" became part of the political lexicon. Less than a decade ago, two whites, Richard Herrnstein and Charles Murray, wrote an 845-page screed, "The Bell Curve," arguing that blacks are intellectually inferior. I don't know a single black engineer, neurosurgeon or molecular biologist who lost sleep over it. Black professionals who entered elite colleges through diversity efforts have not been defined by the misperceptions of others, either. According to "The Shape of the River," an exhaustive study published in 1998, those students have done well, many going on to graduate schools and prestigious careers.

I'll likely receive missives from my critics claiming this column is just more evidence of my incompetence, more proof that I'm in this job only because I'm black. They can believe what they like.

But I'll keep writing.

 when construction is finished," Litton said. "But, we have to do something, and it will still be a focal point from the boulevard."
 Closure of City Hall is planned for Sept. 12. Temporary cubicles will be created at the police department for the transitional period. Some office furniture will also temporarily be moved to the Cryatal Lake location, while some items will be auctioned off or put into storage.
 A temporary utility bill drop box for the public will be located in front of the police station. Litton said City Hall telephone

numbers will also remain the same during the transitional period, and city employees will be accessible during and after the move.
 All city board and Commission meetings will be held in the Community Center, located on Country Club Road, when City Hall closes for construction. Litton said parents will not be able to drop off or pick up their children from school at the Country Club Road location, since it will be a construction zone and unsafe for the public.
 "There is going to be some inconvenience during the

upcoming months, but everyone is really excited about the renovations," Litton said. "At the end of the seven-month renovation period, I think the citizens of Lake Mary will be proud of the building, just like they are proud of the police station, and it will be another anchor for the downtown area."

view the status of permits, gather information about parcels and perform other tasks related to planning and development.
 • Passed a resolution naming the month of July as Recreation and Parks Month.
 • Appointed Sanford City Commissioner Kevin Hipes and Barry Neece, chief financial officer of Workforce Central Florida, to the Community Service Block Grant Advisory Board.
 • Approved final plans for the expansion of the Florida Power & Light unmanned substation. The 5.34-acre project is located approximately 200 feet south of State Road 46, on the east side of Rinehart Road.
 • Postponed, at the applicant's request, a vote on whether to rezone 17 acres located on Hester Avenue, a quarter mile south of County Road 427 from agriculture to single family dwelling. Commission will vote on this item July 22.

 approval for her vinyl fence in April 2001 and February 2002, was re-approved to install a vinyl fence on her property.
 According to Daniels, there are 13 vinyl fences in the district.
 "I'm sure if our predecessors who built these homes would have had access to vinyl fences they would have used it," said Daniels, who wanted to place a vinyl fence around his pool, while keeping the wooden fence in the front of his home. "We do have the Florida environment to deal with, so why put up a high maintenance product? You could use your energy to do other things to your home."
 "Vinyl fences have been granted by the HPB..." he added. "I do believe there has been inconsistency with the historic preservation board. If there was a trial period I don't believe the public at large was notified that it was a trial period."
 Antonia Gerli, Sanford staff liaison to the HPB, says, it was not the trial period that led to this issue, but admits it's difficult to find consistency with the high turnover rate of volunteers who serve on the 11-member board.
 "The decisions are different based on different members' outlooks," she said. "They [the HPB] really try to be consistent. There are a lot of issues that they are consistent on, but there have been some new board members that

brought a different outlook to the board and were not as well versed on the codes and regulations."
 According to homeowners, vinyl fences are not the only concern being brought before the HPB.
 During a recent appeal to city commission, Bob and Cheryl Turner explained to commissioners that a permit was granted for them to install vinyl windows by city staff. The staff, however, did not realize the Turners lived in the historic district. Once the windows, costing an estimated \$16,000, were ordered the HPB was alerted and the approval to install the windows was denied.
 The Turners were left with a bill for \$16,000 and windows they were unable to use. The city, in an effort to make up for the staff's error, paid the Turners for the windows. However, in September of last year Colleen and Alan Spring were allowed by HPB to install vinyl-clad windows in their home.
 According to Jones, in hopes of clearing up any confusion regarding regulations, the HPB began revamping its Schedule 5 Codes, the document that governs the decisions made by the HPB, last summer.
 "The goal of re-writing the ordinance was not vinyl fence eccentricities, but about creating something that is a guideline to use as a handbook in homeown-

er's restorations," said Singeisen.
 The revisions have been presented to the Sanford City Commission during both of its June work sessions. The HPB took into consideration the commission's requests and has tentatively scheduled to bring the revisions to the commission for a vote next month.
 "It's more of an education endeavor to make it easier to understand the HPB's goals," said Singeisen. "I think we have tried to make it more user friendly. There are many more positive attributes other than the vinyl fence topic. I hope that doesn't become the sensationalism of it."
 Of particular concern when revising the codes were variances. "Some people will get them and some people don't," explained Commissioner Velma Williams.
 Jones agreed, stating, "In order to have consistency, we need to do away with variances."
 According to Singeisen, the revised Schedule 5 Codes will recommend to commission that no vinyl fences or windows be allowed in the historic district, and no exceptions will be made. However, this does not affect those homeowners who have already been approved for those items.
 "Once this is adopted in final form, we have to start at that point with consistency," said Mayor Brady Lessard. "Whatever it says, that's what it will be."

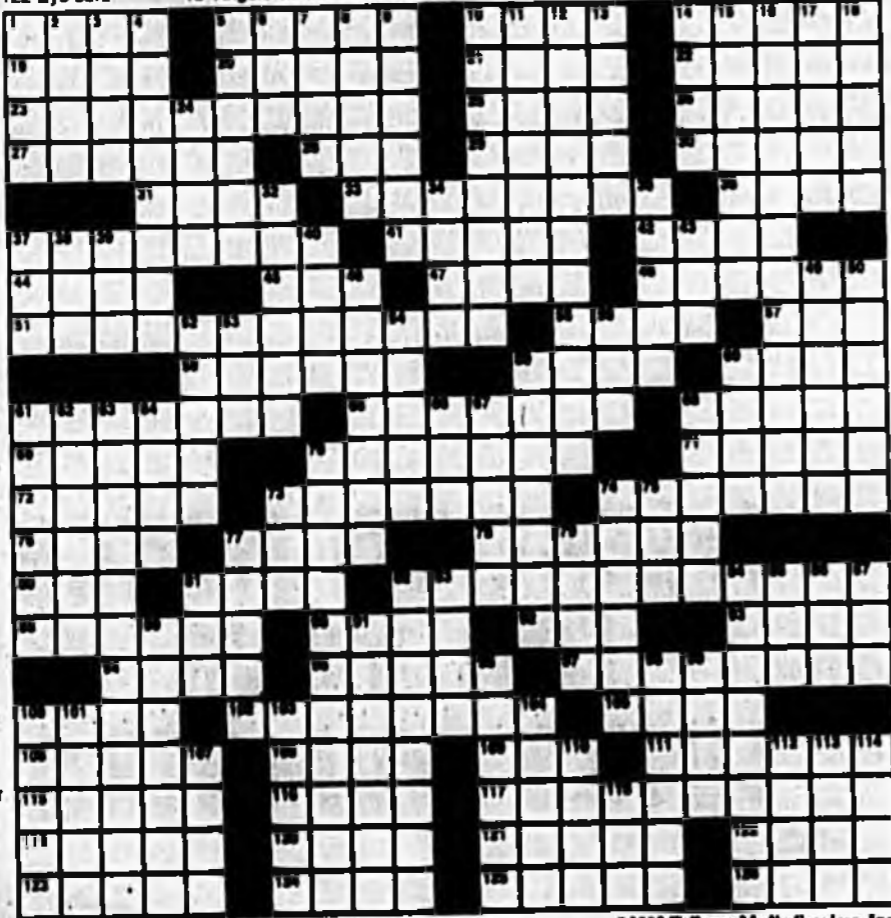

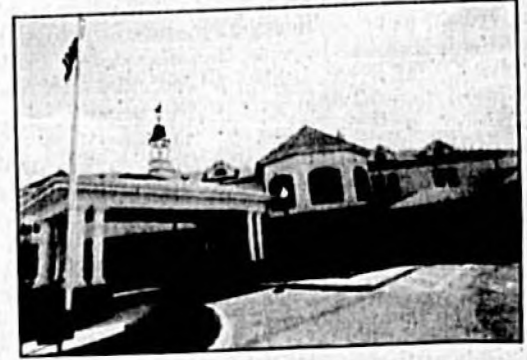

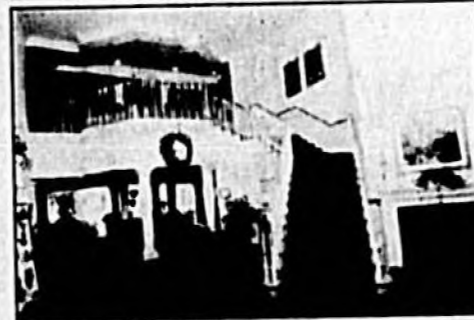

Seven boys recognized by FSWA

Only one player from Seminole County earned a spot on a 'team', but the county still had seven representatives when the Florida Sports Writers Association released its All-State Boys Basketball Teams recently. Oviedo's 6-foot-7 senior forward/center Grant Herren made the Class 6A Third Team after leading the Lions to a 24-6 record and a spot in the Regional Semifinals in what could easily have been termed a rebuilding year. Earning Honorable Mention honors in Class 6A was Lake Mary's sophomore sensation Darryl Merthle.

The 6-foot-2 guard has been recognized as one of the top players in Florida and easily in the Top 10 among state 10th graders.

SCC to hold first Baseball Camp

SANFORD — With its first State Championship and initial national tournament appearance under its belt, the Seminole Community College baseball program will be offering its first Seminole Community College Baseball Camp in July.

"We see other summer camps going well and this gives us a chance to get some exposure for our program and let the public see what we offer here at SCC," said head coach Mike Nicholson.

The camp, which is for players ages 6-to-12, runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily at Raider Park on the Seminole Community College campus.

With full use of College equipment and facilities, the Camp provides instruction in the fundamentals, techniques, and strategies of baseball.

Participants will be matched by age, experience, and skill level (Rookies - Ages 6-8; Juniors - Ages 9-10; Seniors - Ages 11-12) for small group instruction.

"Campers should dress in baseball gear or comfortable workout clothing. Each camper should bring a cap, glove, spikes or turf shoes, and sneakers. A change of clothing will come in handy," said Nicholson. "We'll be working hard and may get wet on sliding days."

"Baseball equipment (bats, helmets, catching gear, etc.) will be provided, but campers can choose to bring their own gear if they prefer. The Florida sun is hot — wear sun screen! Campers can choose to bring lunch with a drink or buy pizza for \$1 per slice. Plenty of water and sport drinks will be available all day to campers at no See SCC, Page 2B

GATOR trout fever in high gear

This is a great time of year to catch big GATOR trout.

The key to catching these mammoth trout is a stealthy approach and finding them early. Trout are basically low light feeders and they are very aware of their surroundings. It is very important to approach these fish properly. If you try to use a trolling motor forget about it, the big GATOR will here you coming from 100 yards away.

The best way to approach these guys is by shutting down your motor at least 100 yards from where you think these beasts may be located. Use the push pole to work shallow areas where grass and sand holes are located.

Several baits can work on big trout such as a top water plug (Top Dog, She Dog, Skitterwalk or Chug Bug), soft jerk worms or the old reliable 1/8 ounce jig. The Rip Tide 5 inch Flats Chub in white, new penny or golden glow are my top colors in jerk worms. Blue and chrome is a great color choice for the top water plugs. When using th 1/8 ounce jig, the Rip Tide 3 inch mullet in

sand perch/chartreuse tail is a hot bait.

One other trick that can work is to take a weedless hook and a frozen mullet and work the mullet like a top water bait. A big trout has a hard time resisting this offering.

Usually it is better to downsize your line when fishing for GATORS. Use 6-pound or 8-pound test with a 20-pound fluorocarbon leader so that the line is invisible. These big fellas have great eyesight. Use a Daiichi 3/0 Copperhead Bleeding Bait Hook for the soft jerk bait. This will keep the bait weedless if you are in thicker grass.

When you use the plug or jig make sure to use a loop knot on the lure for maximum action.

One important thing to remember about GATOR trout is that it took a long time for them to reach this size. Take a good camera with you and release these big fish so that they can continue to make more trout.

Some of the big females have already laid their eggs, but many have not, so it is important to handle them with great care. Wet your hands before handling these fish so the slime stays on See Outdoors, Page 2B

SOME FWC LICENSE FEES CHANGE JULY 1

Seven Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission permitting and licensing fees increased during the 2003 legislative session. The increases take effect July 1.

- The changes are:
 - Non-resident Turkey Permit increases from \$5 to \$100.
 - Non-resident 10-day hunting license increases from \$25 to \$45.
 - Permit for exhibition or sale of Class I or II wildlife increases from \$5 to \$150 for up to 25 animals, or from \$25 to \$250 for more than 25 animals. All Class III wildlife, any number of animals, will be \$50.
 - Permit to keep Class II wildlife as a personal pet increases from \$100 to \$140.
 - Permit to keep venomous reptiles increases from \$5 to \$100.
 - License to operate a game farm increases from \$5 to \$50.
 - License to operate a hunting preserve increases from \$5 to \$70.

The majority of Florida hunters and anglers will be unaffected, because the price of resident hunting and fishing licenses stay the same.

FWC OFFERS UNIQUE

HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

In addition to regular and special quota hunts, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is offering sportsmen some unique hunting opportunities for the upcoming season.

The FWC is providing sportsmen mobility-impaired hunts, supervised youth hunts and track vehicle and airboat hunts on wildlife management areas (WMAs). Applications are available from FWC regional offices. The deadline period for getting applications in for the random drawing is July 9-25.

Mobility-impaired hunts are for persons who require special equipment. These hunts are not intended for hunters who have Florida Disabled Person Hunting and Fishing Certificates, but

rather those who are permanently confined to a wheelchair, persons who require the use of mechanical aids (crutches and walkers) to walk or those with complete single-leg amputations.

Applications can be found online at www.wildflorida.org/hunting/quota_hunt/default.html beginning July 9.

Another unique hunt is for hunters 8-15 years old. Two WMAs in the North Central Region (Camp Blanding and Andrews) offer opportunities for adults to take young hunters on public hunting areas where the number of hunters and the hunting areas are rigidly controlled to provide an optimum learning experience and maximum safety. These hunts are popular, and the number of applicants exceeds the number of spaces available each year. Applications can be found online at www.wildflorida.org/hunting/quota_hunt/default.html beginning July 9.

Wildlife management areas in the southern part of the state offer hunters an unusual challenge because of their open-marsh landscape. Hunting these areas requires special vehicles, and the FWC has established quotas on the number of vehicles allowed.

Permits to operate track vehicles on the Rotenberger, Everglades and Holy Land WMAs are issued in two random selections. Track vehicles that were included in the 2002-2003 random selection and did not receive a vehicle permit will be included in the first random selection. All other track vehicles will be included in the second random selection.

Applications for permits to operate airboats on the Everglades and Francis S. Taylor WMAs also are available from FWC regional offices. Like the track vehicle permits, airboat permits are issued in two random selections. Airboats that were included in the 2002-2003 random selection, but did not receive an airboat permit will be included in the first random selection. All other airboats will be included in the second random selection.

A quota hunt permit will be required to hunt quail on the Blackwater WMA Hunt Unit in the Northwest Region. There are seven two-day hunts available, and the quota is two groups per hunt. A group may consist of up to three hunters. Shooting hours end at 3 p.m., and the bag limit is 12 quail per group per day.

Hunters submitted approximately 50,000 requests for regular nine-day and special quota

hunt permits during the June 1-11 application period. Data entry into the computer is in progress. The drawing will take place approximately July 29. Hunters will receive either a quota hunt permit or a rejection notice. Hunters who receive rejection notices also will receive instructions for applying for other areas that may still have permits available.

Eddie White, FWC's quota hunt coordinator, said there appears to be some confusion about the choice numbers used on quota applications by hunters eligible for the preference drawing.

"If you used the choice numbers from your preference rejection notice instead of the choice numbers from the 2003-2004 quota application,

contact the quota hunt office at (850) 488-8573," White said. "You may wind up with hunts other than those you thought you were applying for."

Hunters who have not submitted regular nine-day and special hunt applications should do so as soon as possible. Applications received after June 11 are processed in first-come, first-served order for permits for areas that do not reach their quotas during the random selection. Information about when hunts reach their quotas is available from FWC's Web site, www.floridacconservation.org. Click on "Hunting," then "WMA Quota Hunt Information."

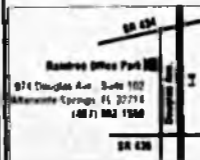
