

Pope Pleases Lutherans

Unity Commission Set

FULDA, West Germany (UPI) - Roman Catholics and Lutherans, ideologically split for 450 years since the Protestant Reformation, praised Pope John Paul II's gesture toward reconciliation saying it contributed to Christian unity in West Germany.

The pope briefly visits the Bararian village o Altoetting today before traveling to Munich, the final stop on his five-day, seven-city visit to West Germany, before returning to Rome Wednesday. "This spontaneous dialogue clearly demonstrated the willingness, the openness and the intentions of the

pope," said Lutheran spokesman Dietrich Sartler, after the pontiff told Lutheran leaders Monday the. Roman Catholic church shares the blame for the centuries-old schism between the churches. Immediately after the meeting, the Lutherans said they had agreed to set up a joint commission to study the possibilities of Christian unity in West Germany, which is 49 percent Protestant and 44 percent Catholic.

Iran Sticks To Hard Line

Uni Al Press International Iran's parliament speaker says Iranian conditions for freeing the 52 American hostages from 381 days of captivity are final and the United States should "submit" to them.

At the same time four Iranian envoys, including the parliament speaker, Hojatolleslam Hashemi Rafsanjani, left on a trip to 15 nations in a flurry of diplomatic activity that could end Iran's isolation. U.N. peace envoy Olof Palme of Sweden arrived in Switzerland Monday on his way to Iran today and Iraq later in an attempt to set up a framework for peace negotiations in the 58-day Gulf war. But Palme said he did not expect to discuss the hostages. The international isolation of Iran began Nov. 4, 1979,

when militant students seized the U.S. Embassy is Tehran and took the hostages, but the Persian Gulf War apparently has forced Tehran to look abroad for support and sympathy.

Saturn's 6th Set Of Rings

Discovered By Voyager 1

PASADENA, Calif. (UPI) - Voyager 1's stop-action snapshots of Saturn faintly show a new sixth set of rings, but the planet's huge satellite Titan has been deposed from its status as the largest moon in the solar

At a final briefing Monday, scientists at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory disclosed their discovery of the ong-suspected sixth plane of rings 56,000 miles out from Saturn. The new ring — dubbed the G-ring — is so

faint, even Voyager's sensitive cameras could barely Also photographed, but again very faintly, was the D-ring. Its image will require special computer processing, said Dr. Bradford Smith, head of the imaging team.

Man Charged In L.A. Fire LOS ANGELES (UPI) - A caretaker was charged

with starting an illegal campfire and igniting a 6,000-acre brushfire that killed one man, destroyed 70 homes worth millions of dollars and pushed today tinto the Angeles National Forest. Southern California's vicious Santa Arts winds died down during the night, giving firefighters a chance to slow brushfires that have blackened nearly 50,000 acres in the suburbs of Los Angeles. But the largest fire near Lake Elsinore was still out of control today. The 6,200-acre Bradbury-Duarte fire, which gutted 62 expensive homes and damaged 10 others, was about half contained by Monday night but more than 1,000 firefighters remained on the lines early today to battle it as it inched into the Angeles National Forest. John Michael Budish of Asuza, a 23-year-old caretaker, was arrested Monday and booked on suspicion of arson in connection with the blaze. One area resident, John Hervey, 47, died of a heart attack while fleeing the flames.

William P. Clements would then appoint Republican John Connally to Tower's Senate seat. Connally, a former Texas governor and Treasury secretary in the Richard Nixon administration, would serve for 90 days until a special election could be held. He would then have the inside track in that election. Reagan conferred separately with Connally and Clements during the weekend in California.


