Births and the War

American women of 30 and over must have more babies if the present high birth rate is to be maintained, since the withdrawal of large numbers of men for military service will result in a decrease in births among younger women, according to the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company.
The company points out that in the case of women of ages 30 and over, the contribution to total annual births was smaller at the end of the last two decades than at the beginning. In 1920, their contribution was 35 percent of the total births, as against 29 percent of the total babies born in 1940.
