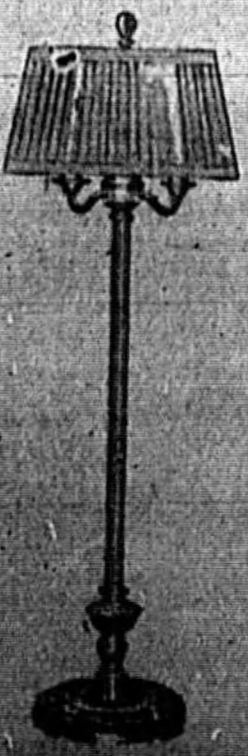

He was born on Dec. 25, 1862 in Decatur county, Georgia and on Jan. 6, 1886 married Susan Couche to whom were born five children. Survivors besides Mrs. Wight include Ralph B. Wight, Mrs. C. E. Kirtley, Mrs. P. A. Mero, 14 grandchildren and six great grandchildren, two sisters, Miss Carrie B. Wight and Mrs. Eugene Clower of Cairo, Ga. and one brother, G. A. Wight of Miami.

Indicative of Mr. Wight's character is this epitaph found on an old stone in a Midway (Ga.) churchyard and long treasured by Mrs. Wight: "His natural disposition was benevolent and cheerful, not prone to give offense, unapt to be offended; in deportment, courteous and social; generous and just of understanding; prompt and respectable. What he possessed he enjoyed and what he enjoyed he imparted. His house was the strangers' home. His piety, which he adorned the office of steward, was active, enlightened and sincere."

Admiral Asseris Atom Bomb Tests Will Not Cost over \$110,000,000—headline. And if that ain't chicken feed in this day and time, it ain't hay either.

As if the farmers didn't have troubles enough already, the railroads have decided to ask for a 25 percent increase in freight rates.

Whether or not the CIO is a political asset in Florida may be gained with the vigorance with which all candidates are denying that they have the CIO support.

We wish that we had room to sponsor all the civic projects which are brought to our attention by zealous advocates while most of them may be for the betterment of Sanford, limitations of space imposed upon us by the newsprint shortage compel us to neglect many of them, even if the City's limited pocket-book did not.

A Moscow magazine, the New Times, criticizes the United States and accuses it of not keeping promises made to the Philippines, of not "eliminating" the Japanese emperor in Tokio, and of persecuting American negroes. As a matter of fact, however, the American negro has more freedom, more rights and more privileges than any ordinary citizen, black or white, in Russia.

Jerse Jones, former Secretary of Commerce, who as head of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, has probably lent more money than any other man in the world, says the proposed loan to Great Britain is "un-businesslike" and warns "It will start the United States down a financial road that is likely to lead to disaster." Jones probably means that the loan to Britain is merely a fore-runner of other loans, none of which will ever be paid back.

A. B. Peterson, addressing a meeting of women voters Monday night, warns against the attempt of foreign "fists" to gain control of the American government and urges everyone to vote, if this is to be prevented, since only a small minority in this country is opposed to democratic principles. But "stern vigilance is the price of liberty" and unless people wake up and take a more active interest in their political affairs, they will find that their government has been taken over by a small group of communists who won't give them a chance to vote again.

Sanford has lost an outstanding citizen in the unexpected death of Ralph E. Chapman whose heart suddenly gave out on him Tuesday while attending a Masonic convention in Jacksonville. Mr. Chapman was what is perhaps the most often called a good citizen, and more than that, he was a leader of men. Everyone had heard and everyone trusted him. Everyone knew that as long as he was a member of the craft, everything would be fair and square. He served the community very ably and conscientiously.

The Sacred Cow

Herbert Hoover, as he travels around Europe from one war-ridden country to another, paints a most disheartening picture of the frightful destitution which plagues that devastated continent. The four Horsemen of unemployment, political strife, diseases and starvation are riding high and wide and the lives of millions more may be added to the awful toll of the war before conditions become normal again. We sympathize with the plight of Europe, as well as with the sick and hungry of other continents now darkening the horizons. In China there is outright civil war and millions are starving. In India there is virtual revolution and millions more starve. In Japan, in the Philippines, in the Dutch East Indies, there is much suffering, strife and destitution.

But we cannot help wondering to what extent these troubles are inflicted upon these people by themselves. Someone has said, long before us, that man is his own worst enemy. If the people of China went to work and plowed their fields instead of engaging in civil war, we are inclined to believe that much of that starvation might be eliminated.

We have read of seed, tractors, mules and fertilizer being shipped to ports in Greece where it immediately fell into the hands of black market operators who charged such enormous prices for it that Greek farmers refused to buy any of these materials so badly needed to produce their crops. We have read of boat loads of food for relief purposes tied up at docks by stevedores on strikes who refused to allow anyone else to unload it.

In India they have what is known as the Sacred Cow, and no one is allowed to eat these cows, or even milk them. In fact, it would be a sacrilege punishable by death even to touch one of them and everyone must bow down and render obeisance unto the cow. And then there is another religious sect which conducts great sacrifices of sheep and goats and even bulls to pagan gods while the people go hungry.

Of course, we are not entirely without our sacred cows in this country. We have organizations which seem to believe that the ten-hour week will produce for us a more abundant life, and that paying people not to work will help to feed hungry mouths. These superstitions in our own country could easily be carried to the point where everyone would starve, just as they are in certain other countries.

But those who have any knowledge of American history whatever will remember that it was thrift and industry of a high order which made this country great and not the witchcraft trials of New England.

Red Cross Charges

In cases where the Red Cross charged service men for food and lodging overseas, it was through army orders. This fact, known to many soldiers already, was recently restated by Harvey D. Gibson, national chairman of the Red Cross 1946 fund drive. Signs were erected in all overseas clubs, explaining the reason for the charges, and every excuse for not charging was seized upon.

"On holidays everything was free," says Mr. Gibson. "On a man's birthday everything was free to him. On guest nights everything was free. There was no charge for anything served from our 175 clubmobiles, or at transient points, such as ports, railroad terminals or airports. We made it a rule that if at any time, anywhere, a soldier raised the slightest question about paying for food and coffee, he was told 'to help himself.'"

With army orders being what they were, there does not seem to be much else that the Red Cross could have done. The complaints recall similar ones made during and after World War I about the Y.M.C.A. Some soldiers resented the charges levied in the Y huts; yet these, too, were at army orders.

STATE NEWS BRIEFS

Sawmills in Florida are reported to be turning out relatively little of the lumber badly needed for construction of homes because of OPA price restrictions based on old sawmill wage standards of 25 to 30 cents an hour. Wages have gone up to 75 to 80 cents an hour, and mill owners complain they cannot produce lumber at a profit. Although OPA has permitted some increase in prices to sawmills, owners contend that prices should be 50 to 75 percent higher to order to make a profit. High labor turnover, because workers know they can quit at any time and earn as much elsewhere, is also giving the mill owners many headaches.

Continued gains in Florida business are reported by the research division of the Florida State Chamber of Commerce. The January-February total this year, based on bank debits (charges against individual accounts), shows a 28 percent increase over the first two months of 1945. February, 1945, was the only month since October, 1939, that monthly bank debit totals failed to exceed the corresponding month of the previous year. The decrease was noted only in Jacksonville and Miami and not in the other four of the six financial centers of the state, Orlando, Tampa, Pensacola or St. Petersburg.

Representative Joe Hendricks, who has been battling railroad association opposition to St. John's River and other Florida waterway improvements, would probably like to get a good rest and take one of those inland waterway boats from Trenton, N. J. to Sanford and sleep all the way. Instead, with an Easter holiday ahead for Congress, he will have to come down here before the May primary and shake a lot of hands and renew old acquaintances, which he has been forced to neglect because of the pressure of legislation. Legislators, in our opinion, should really be twins, one a sympathetic and amiable type to shake hands and hear opinions and complaints at home, and the other, hard-headed executive type to handle

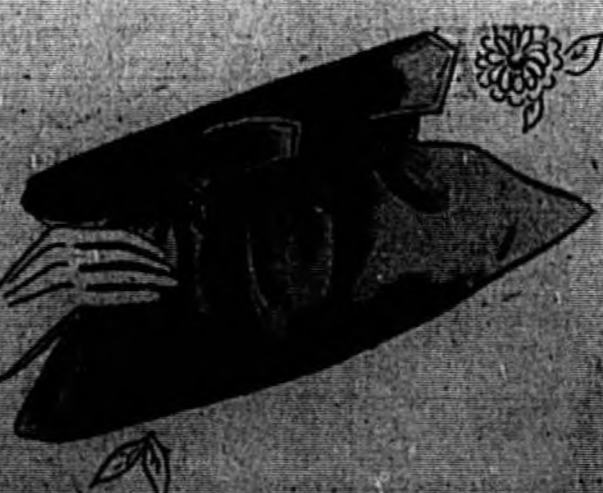
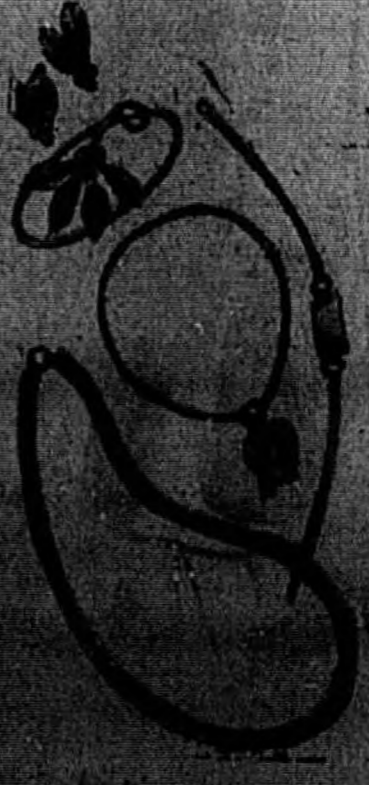
