

New Alignments

The latest reports from Europe indicate that Russia is about to be invited to join the Anti-Comintern Pact That was the deal, you remember, which Hitler put over a few years ago when he got Italy and Japan to join in an alliance against Russia in particular and the spread of communism in general. Hitler at that time, together with his pal Mussolini, was saving the world from Red revolution.

Now apparently Russia is to be brought into that alliance, but whether it is now an alliance just against communism, or against Russia too, has not yet been made clear. It is funny to think of Russia joining in an alliance against Russia, but it is hardly less funny than Germany and Italy forming an alliance with Russia. And if the alliance is further expanded to include Japan it will be just about the funniest thing that ever happened in international diplomacy.
