

Power Company Advises Visitors To 'Stay Thru May'

Nearly every winter visitor and resident in this section of Florida will see or hear the invitation "Stay Thru May" during the next six weeks as a result of advertising now planned by Florida Power & Light Company and other merchants of this area. Announcement of the campaign was made by H. H. Coleman, utility manager.

Newspaper advertising will, as usual, tell Florida winter visitors of the many advantages of prolonging their stay in this state during one of the most pleasant months of the year. Visitors will be urged not to risk the uncertainties of northern Spring. One hundred and thirty thousand automobile windshield stickers, printed in colors will be distributed from Florida Power & Light Company stores and offices throughout the state to all persons who wish them, Mr. Coleman said.

Figures compiled by the utility company for the past several years indicate a marked improvement of Spring business since the "Stay Thru May" campaigns were first inaugurated.

Indexing March sales at 100%, April sales for the period 1932-36, before the campaigns were inaugurated fell to 76%. However, since the campaigns were inaugurated, the drop was only to 82% and in 1939, the decrease was only to 86%. In May during the pre-campaign period, the average was 61% of March business but in the three campaign years, the average was up to 78% and in 1939 it was up to 74%.

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Chance Seen That Soviet Will Send Oil To Italians

BERLIN, Mar. 20.—(AP)—Russian oil was mentioned last night as an immediate reason for Russia and Italy to come together in a better understanding as a result of Monday's Brenner peace conference between Adolf Hitler and Benito Mussolini.

The subject of oil was brought up as Germans discussed creation of a new "European order" through extension of the Rome-Berlin axis to Moscow.

Russia always has held out that Italy would like, but informed sources said Italy in the past never had been interested in contracting for it when the only feasible means of transport was through the Black sea and the easily-closed Dardanelles.

Also Italy regarded the Soviet union as an unpromising trade partner and an even worse political ally.

But Germany's new friendship with Russia, elimination of Poland as a buffer state and the development of land transportation facilities have made Russia all more accessible to Italy.

German economic experts say there is, or soon will be a secure land route for the transportation of oil.

In addition, if a more cooperative attitude toward Russia would aid in solving Balkan problems where Mussolini wants peace, informed Berlin circles said some sort of an understanding would become more attractive to Italy.

Official quarters refrained from reflecting hope that Moscow might drop its hostility to the axis. All that authorized sources would say was that Russia must have a voice in the new European orientation which Hitler and Mussolini have in mind.

Ellender Seeks Aid Of Western Solons On Bill

WASHINGTON, Mar. 20.—(AP)—Senator Ellender of Louisiana sought the aid of western senators yesterday in his attempt to decrease excess acreage penalties to cane sugar growers in Louisiana and Florida through an amendment to the agriculture appropriation bill.

In an informal conference, Ellender requested that Senators Adams and Johnson, Colorado Democrats, and others from sugar belt states offer no resistance to the amendment.

Johnson said that the best sugar growers gave little indication of their intentions, preferring to wait until the amendment came up before the Senate.

Ellender's amendment would graduate the scale of penalties that would be assessed on sugar cane growers to range from one cent to the limit of \$20 an acre, depending on the amount of excess acreage in individual instances.

Johnson said it would have no direct effect on beet sugar growers, though they are interested in some form of cane sugar protection.

The excess production resulting from the over-planting of cane sugar has been withheld from the market by the government for a year until it was determined that the market could absorb the surplus.

Ellender said that he hoped to have the amendment passed by the Senate before the end of the session.

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Billion Dollar Farm Bill Delay Seen In Senate

WASHINGTON, Mar. 20.—(AP)—The Senate is expected to delay passage of a \$1-billion farm bill for a 24-hour period ending today, according to reports from the Federal Reserve Bank of New York.

The delay is expected to be caused by a provision in the bill that would require the government to purchase surplus crops.

The bill would provide for the purchase of surplus crops at a price of 80 percent of the market price.

Silver Springs Is Scene Of Filming Of 'The Yearling'

Location Near Ocala National Park Is Considered Ideal

OCALA, Mar. 20.—Chester Franklin, who directed "Sequoia," and will direct the animal sequences in the film version of the Florida cracker novel "The Yearling," arrived at Silver Springs today from Hollywood and joined an advance crew of motion picture technicians here to make preliminary plans for shooting "The Yearling."

The moviemakers anticipated lengthy shooting schedules near Silver Springs in the Ocala National Forest, which is the original locale of the Marjorie Rawlings Pulitzer prize-winning book. The picture is to be made in technicolor, and directed by Victor Fleming, who directed "Come With The Wind."

It was learned from Jay Bennett, business manager of the unit on location, that settings will have to be prepared in advance and "seasoned," and that filming would probably start not sooner than June 15. Then too, Jody Baxter, who will likely be portrayed by a Florida boy, must associate weeks in advance of the film with the animals in the picture. And the wild deer, the bear, the hound and bull dogs and other animals must become accustomed to one another before they will work properly. This requires weeks, perhaps months, the movie experts said.

A corn crop, planted yesterday, must mature considerably before it is ready. Meanwhile, a home will be built for the Baxter family, and a decision must be reached on Jody, Ma Baxter and the other supporting Spencer Tracy as "Penny Baxter."

Today's activities included the preparation of plans for the Baxter house and a "talent hunt" for a battered hound dog to duplicate the one mentioned in the novel. This proved difficult as agents searched three counties for the ideal dog. The movie men termed the hounds they saw as "fine looking, blooded fox hounds, entirely too handsome. We want an old sinner with scars across her nose and chewed up ears almost dragging the ground."

Art directors, however, were more successful. They enthusiastically praised locations they found yesterday with Spring foliage in the Ocala national forest near Silver Springs. "It's all very, very beautiful," they declared.

The crew on the ground, besides Franklin and Bennett, includes Paul E. Grosse, associate art director for "The Yearling," W. A. Horning, assistant to Cedric Gibbons, art director, construction engineer, and Deloy Sawyer, transportation manager. They will make Silver Springs headquarters as well as the case when "Tarzan Finds A Son" was filmed at Silver Springs last year. The crew contains several who worked here on the "Sequoia" picture at that time. "The Yearling" will keep them here for months.

Inspectors Study Threatening Note Received By Men

ATLANTA, Mar. 20.—(AP)—Postoffice inspectors studied yesterday the second of two threatening notes received by law enforcement officials engaged in probing a series of night-riding lynchings.

Chief Matheson of the Fulton (Atlanta) county police department said he turned over to postal officials a letter menacing his two-year-old grandson unless he halted his part in the flogging investigation.

The note, made up of letters from a newspaper, read: "Warned: Call your men off flogging and lottery cases or watch your child and..."

The unfinished sentence was followed by a picture of a child with bandaged head and a newspaper headline which read: "Four arrested by county police in raid."

Policeman Blount of East Point previously had reported receipt of a letter threatening him "with death" unless he "ceased up" in his investigation of the floggings, climaxed about 10 days ago by the fatal whipping of Isaac Gaston, suburban barber.

Four men are under indictment for participation in floggings disclosed after Gaston's death. None, however, was charged with flogging Gaston.

Meanwhile Imperial Wizard Colecott of the Ku Klux Klan said his personal investigations

Local movie-goers will have an opportunity to see how a great American nation of eleven million people mobilizes under conditions of modern warfare in the latest March of Time film "Canada at War," which comes to the screen of the Ritz Theater today and Thursday.

In this timely issue, the March of Time pictures the whole story of the national war effort of the Canadian people today. The film shows the activities of each branch of the Dominion's military services—Army, Navy, and Air Force; the organization of Canada's rapidly-expanding industries to meet the country's war needs; and many other phases of Canadian participation in the war.

The film will emphasize particularly the "Home Front" aspects of the conflict, and the swift growth of the Royal Canadian Air Force, which is now putting into operation a vast and unique cooperative air-raising scheme for the entire British Empire.

"Canada at War" was filmed in many sections of the Dominion of Canada during the past two months by March of Time cameramen working under the severe handicap of sub-zero weather.

Pendergast Aide Is Sentenced To 2 Years In Jail

KANSAS CITY, Mar. 20.—(AP)—Matthew S. Murray, two-job wheelhorse of the Pendergast Democratic machine, was sentenced yesterday to serve two years in federal prison for evading income taxes, and another machine lieutenant, R. Emmet O'Malley, came back from prison to face two state bribery indictments.

Murray, 56-year-old, scholarly appearing engineer, was the first major Pendergast figure to stand trial on tax-dodging charges and the sixth to be sentenced.

The gray-haired executive, who quit under fire as Missouri's WPA administrator, and Kansas City's director of public works, was indicted for evading taxes on \$60,691 between 1934 and 1938, inclusive.

He claimed Tom Pendergast and his favored contractor, John J. Fryor, gave him \$40,800 in "gifts" and "gratuities," and

that these were tax exempt. The government, however, contended the money was paid for favor and services. Judges Albert Reeves said Murray's claim was "incredible and beyond belief," and that the government's charge "can not be controverted."

A motion for a new trial was over-ruled by Judge Reeves before he passed sentences—two years on each of five counts to run concurrently.

At the same hour that Murray was in court, portly, 65-year-old O'Malley hurried from the Leavenworth penitentiary, smiled broadly and waved to a tower guard.

The former state superintendent of insurance was the first of the machine king-pins to be released from prison where he served a sentence for income tax evasion.

Still behind the bars, serving terms for similar offenses are Pendergast, Fryor, Otto P. Higgins, former police director, and Charles V. Carollo, the machine's gambling overlord.

O'Malley had pleaded guilty to dodging taxes on \$62,500 received for aiding in the compromise of the \$9,500,000 Missouri fire insurance rate case.

He stood mute when arraigned on a state bribery indictment, charging he received \$82,500 from Pendergast "directly or in-

directly," to influence official acts as insurance superintendent. Trial was set for April 18.

Sheriff Fitzsimmons of St. Louis then took O'Malley to St. Louis for arraignment on another bribery indictment. It charged he received \$24,000 of the payoff in St. Louis.

There he pleaded not guilty and was released on \$10,000 bond.
