WASHINGTON, July 22.—Pending before the Interstate Commerce Commission—it was argued today and the commissioners are thinking it over now—is what a very dinky little railroad case, which, nevertheless, involves considerably more money than the war debt all Europe owes the United States.

The railroad in the St. Louis & O'Fallon, a 9-mile line running out of East St. Louis.

The Interstate Commerce Commission has tentatively valued this line at \$850,000. The road's management contends that it is worth more than twice the amount of the commission's estimate.

Split With Government

The point is: According to law, a railroad which earns more than 6 per cent profit on its fair value may divide the excess evenly with the federal government.

On an \$850,000 valuation the St. Louis & O'Fallon earns considerably more than 6 per cent and has something to divide with the government. On a basis of more than twice \$850,000 it makes nothing like 6 per cent and has nothing to divide.

The question, obviously, is one of valuation. How should they be made?

The Interstate Commerce Commission, an organization of the executives of all the important railroads in the country, which really

argued the St. Louis & O'Fallon's case before the Interstate Commerce Commission contends that a railroad's original cost has nothing to do with what it is worth today—that it is worth now as much as it would cost to reproduce it at present high prices.

Disagree On Basis

The National Conference of Valuation, an organization of railroad workers, shippers and communities served by railroads, which appeared before the commission in opposition to the Interstate Commerce Commission, maintains that the railroads are entitled to an undivided 6 per cent only on "the amount reasonably and honestly invested" in them.

The final decision on this valuation question in the St. Louis & O'Fallon case will set a precedent for all the railroads in the United States, which immediately explains why all of them are so much interested.

Athletic Field At Rollins College To Be Enlarged Soon

WINTER PARK, Fla., July 22.—(AP)—That the Tara of Rollins College are to have greatly enlarged and modernized field equipment for their intercollegiate games for the coming year was made known here today, when Mayor C. Fred Ward, who is chairman of the Rollins football committee, announced that the city of Winter Park had voted to invest \$16,000 in improving the municipal athletic field which is used by the Tara.

According to Mayor Ward \$7,800 of the \$16,000 is to be paid the present owners of the field and \$8,200 is to be expended for the erection of an up-to-date grandstand which has been one of the greatest needs of the field.

Other improvements will include leveling the grounds, constructing a track and repairing the fence around the park.

The field is located four blocks from the campus on the Dixie Highway between Orlando and Winter Park.

Notable football games played on this field during the past two years have been against teams representing Howard College, Newberry College, Stetson University and Southern College.

The two outstanding games to be played on this field during the coming fall will be against Stetson University and the invading team from Birmingham Southern College of Alabama.

 The district board in the opinion of the court, said today that it was proper to make a writ of mandamus to make a copy of the minutes of the board of county commissioners, he said, Van Agnew, who drew up the writ, had wide experience in the law and navigation of the courts. Mr. Van Agnew feels that the writ is good and is proper in all respects and that the county commissioners should provide for the levy on the county commissioners' salaries.

The opinion of County Attorney DeWitt was brief. Section 14 of the act, he said, "purports to give power and authority upon investigation district commissioner to assess, levy and collect tax according to the opinion, but it does not provide the 'modus operandi' or the machinery to carry out this work."

The authority is conferred upon the commissioners or upon the tax collector of either Seminole or Duval county to make any assessment, according to Mr. DeWitt's opinion.


