A Case Well Done

Ill-advised persons who have been told that they could violate the State lottery laws with impunity, that the police would never bother the "Big Shots," that no Grand Jury would waste time investigating local gambling conditions, that if it did it couldn't bring an indictment, that the Assistant State Attorney didn't have a leg to stand on and couldn't possibly get a conviction, that they couldn't get a jury anyway and that one man could hang the jury and force a mistrial, should realize now the risks they have been taking.

For what they said couldn't be done, has been done. For what they said couldn't be done, has been done. The so-called King of Seminole County "Cuba" barons has been convicted. He has been found guilty of a violation of the state lottery laws and is automatically deprived of his rights of citizenship. He is subject to a fine of the least \$500, and possibly \$5,000; or he may be sent to the State Penitentiary at Raiford for from one to ten years. 




