

#### Decision May Boost Prices

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford's decision limit imports of specialty steel could increase prices of some products to consumers because the imports are 20-30 per cent below domestic prices.

but even officials of the U.S. steel industry, who have advocated import restrictions, say prices could increase in the short-run. However, they have argued that consumers would benefit in the long-run from a strengthened domestic steel industry.

Specialty steel, which is only about 1.5 per cent of total U.S. steel production, is primarily stainless and alloy tool steel. Stainless is used extensively in the food, chemical, textile, pollution control and electrical power industries, while alloy steels are used to make tools, including tools for the manufacture of nearly all industrial products.

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford's decision t limit imports of specialty steel could increase prices of some products to consumers because the imports are 20-30 per cent below domestic prices.

The exact effect on prices won't be known right away, but even officials of the U.S. steel industry, who have advention inport on the little prices could increase in the short-run. However, they have argued that consumers would benefit in the long-run from a strengthened domestic steel industry

Specialty steel, which is only about 1.5 per cent of total U.S. steel production, is primarily stainless and alloy tool steel. Stainless is used extensively in the food, chemical, textile, pollution control and electrical power industries, while alloy steels are used to make tools, including tools for the manufacture of nearly all industrial products.

As we have said before, we think the County Commission took a giant step toward improvement of the county administration by opting for a county manager form of government. But we did feel that subsequent decisions made by the commissioners tended to water down the authority of the job to such a degree that for all practical purposes it might well be ineffectual.

However, we sincerely hope that the commissioners are indeed prepared to turn over to Neiswender the full authority that should go with

At the same time, we hope that Mr. Neiswender will use his strength of leadership to withstand any pressures which surely will go with the job and, further, that he will always place the interest of the people of Seminole County first in

### Effort Is Faltering

When the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that the new Federal Election Commission is improperly constituted as an executive agency, it looked like a simple matter for Congress to revise the law to suit the court. Nothing is simple where politics is involved, however, and if Congress does not pull itself together the Supreme Court's grace period will be used up in an indecisive debate over how extensive the revisions in the new law should

In the original 1974 election reform act, the House, the Senate and the President each were empowered to appoint two members to the commission which administers the law. To satisfy the Supreme Court, the President must appoint all six. By giving the President that power and providing for confirmation of his appointments by the Senate, Congress can still keep its iron in the fire.

What threatens to scuttle that solution is that many members of Congress were not entirely satisfied with the 1974 act in the first place. They are proposing that some of the powers of the commission be changed, and that the public financing for candidates for Congress be included in addition to the present arrangement giving campaign money to presidential candidates.

Those issues could keep Congress squabbling for months. For the election commission to go out of existence at this time would undermine public confidence in election reform and pull the rug out from under presidential candidates counting on public campaign funds. If members of Congress want to avoid that, they should narrow their sights on a bill limited to meeting the Supreme Court's objections, and save the rest of the arguments until later.

next fall will be lowered by \$680 from \$5,665 to \$4,985, says Dr. Ira Goldenberg, president of the 265-student liberal arts college located in the White Mountains.

The reduced fees are a result of the reorganization of the college last September in which students and faculty began operating the college and its enterprises. This has enabled the administrative staff to be cut by 40 per cent, without affecting the college's traditional 11-to-1



But simply reminding your kids what not to do when flying a kite is not enough. Because in spite of all your warnings, there's always the chance they'll still get their kites snagged on a power line, or caught up in a tree. And what do they do then?

If it's a power line, the answer's simple. Leave it alone. And sure they use only wood and paper. For that matter, you should call us for advice. Trying to pull the kite down, or climbing up never fly a kite with wire or anything metallic. As metals are after it, could result in a serious shock.

On the other hand, should the kite get caught in a tree, make sure there are no power lines around. Trees near power lines can be accidentally charged with electricity. So if the tree is near a power line, again it's best they leave the kite where it is. And call us.
