According to the Bookseller, the total number of new and reprint titles published in the two countries annually is about the same and represents a doubling of the figures of two decades ago. But there were significant differ-

Major categories or subject matter of newly published books (or reprints) in the United States dealt with sociology and economics, followed by natural science, fiction and literature. The classification of subject matter in England gave top rank to adult fiction, followed by children's books and works in the field of political gious and theological subjects.

On the basis of these findings, the United States has a priority of concern with social and financial problems, while England creates read ership for entertainment and education of the young. And in both nations there is less attention to religion. - Wichita Falis (Tex.) Times
