

More Indians Killed When Police Try To Disperse Mobs In Street Battles

BOMBAY, Sept. 3, (/P)--New riots between Hindus and Moslems have flamed again in Bombay before the city could recover from Sunday's street battles. The latest communique says that 81 persons were killed and 300 injured since the weekend violence broke out. Fresh communa lights began

early this morning.

There were pre-dawn outbursts in tones beyond the area where a curfew was imposed yesterday. Two were killed and eight injured when Hombay police tried to disperse armed mobs in a street battle on Victoria Gardens road. The mobs hurled stones. sticks, aoda-water buttles,

Alting that came to hand.

Altogether police had to open fire three time during the morning to quell duthreaks with estimated casualties of ten killed and 50 injured. Violence spread to the northern part of Bombay where several assaults and stabbings occurred Two shops were looted and police killed a man at one of them.

The city is beginning to feel the affects of the rioting. No meat is available in the riotstricken areas. Tram and bust
