Pan Am adds service to Baltimore/Washington

SANFORD — Officials with the Orlando/Sanford International Airport announced Tuesday that Pan American Airways will begin flights Dec. 6 to Baltimore/Washington International Airport.

The move is part of Pan Am's efforts to increase its destinations and expand the number flights offered by Boston-Maine Airways, a Pan Am affiliate that offers regional service in Maryland and Florida.

Airline will drop routes to St. Louis in December because of sluggish ticket sales

OSI Vice President Victor White informed Airport Authority board members Tuesday morning of Pan Am's expansion plans.

"This is great news for Sanford because this is the first very large airport we will provide service to," said White. "It's now possible to fly non-stop directly into

Baltimore from Sanford."

White noted the Baltimore destination provides Pan Am with an opportunity to expand its regional service, both in Maryland and in Florida.

Boston-Maine will provide regional flights from Baltimore to Cumberland and Hagerstown, Md. The state of Maryland

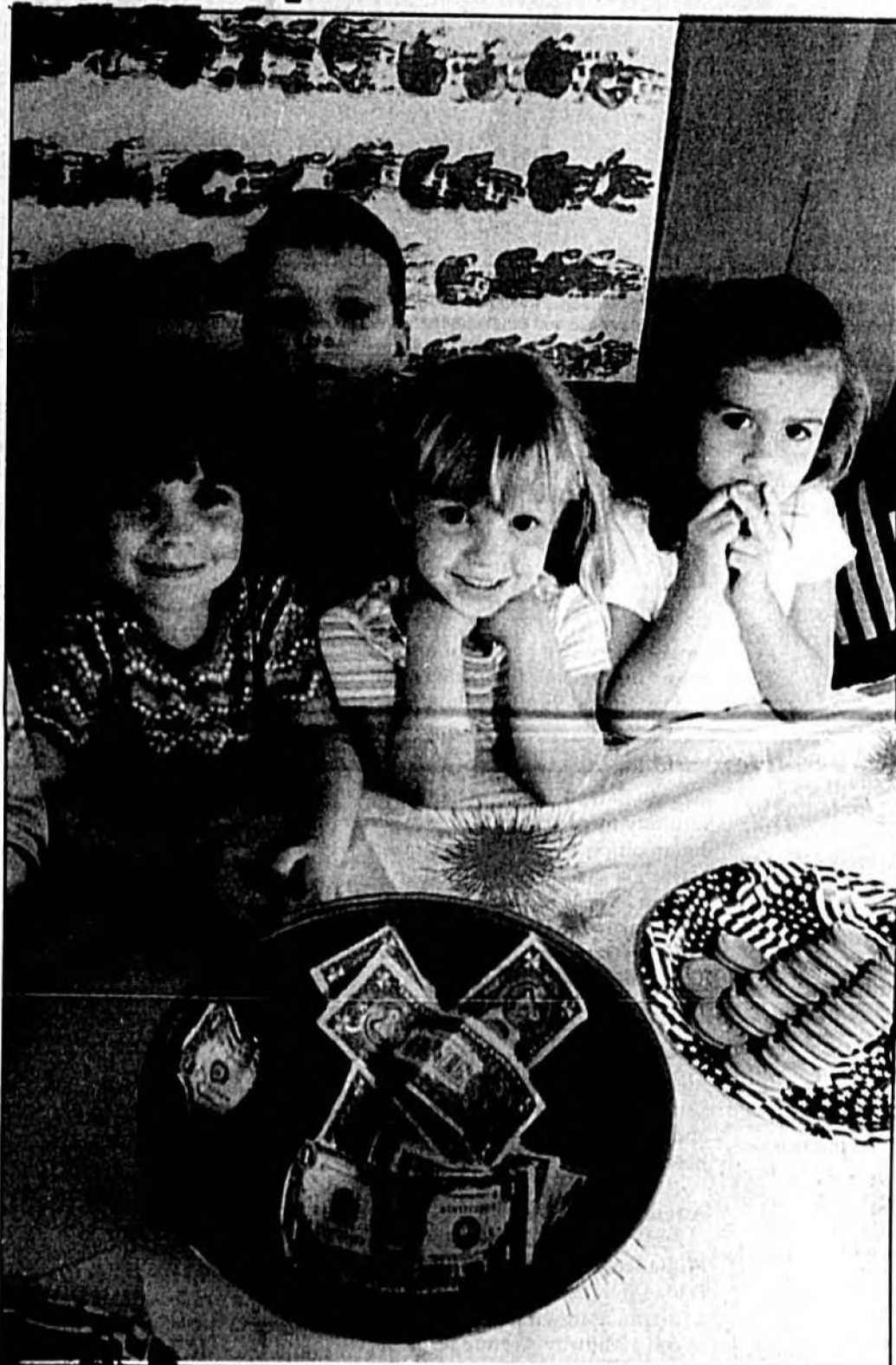
is paying the carrier a subsidy to operate the regional flights.

In addition, Boston-Maine is seeking a Part 121 certificate from the Federal Aviation Administration to provide regional service in Florida. The Pan Am affiliate would operate a "Clipper Connection" linking Sanford, with St. Petersburg/Clearwater and Naples.

"At a time when news about airline travel is not always positive, we are pleased to be in a position to offer the

Gennell sees HazMat trucks as possible targets for terrorist

Winter Springs leader calls for more regulation of hazardous materials

WINTER SPRINGS — Cindy Gennell, is worried Florida is not being vigilante in preventing terrorism as it relates to hazardous materials.

The Winter Springs City Commissioner and member of the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) for hazardous materials is unhappy with the Central Florida emergency planning committee's progress and says state legislature ignoring an everyday potential disaster.

"The intent of the federal regulations is not measuring up," said Gennell. "What are you going to end up with when you have a disaster? It's not going to

satisfy the public when it's said and done."

Gennell is one of 16 governor appointed officials on the SERC and represents more than 400 cities in Seminole, Orange, Osceola, Volusia, Lake and Brevard counties. Created in 1987 in a response to a growing concern for safety around chemical facilities, Congress enacted the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act (EPCRA). EPCRA contains five sections which cover issues associated with the manufacture, use, exposure, transportation, and public education of hazardous materials. It is the mission of the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) and SERC to implement EPCRA in Florida and to mitigate the effects of a release or spill of hazardous materials.

Each quarter the SERC meets to discuss the progress of a number of duties including the development of off-site conse-

For whom the bell tolls

Salvation Army needs volunteers to ring bells during holiday season

The call has gone out. Bell ringers are needed by the Salvation Army for Seminole County for the upcoming holiday season. Capt. Robert A. Reckline, Corps Officer said, "Volunteers are essential to our ability to provide assistance during the holiday season. The help they give now has an impact on the needy throughout the year."

Volunteers are needed to ring the bells for the annual Red Kettle Campaign from between Thursday, Nov. 16 and Monday, Dec. 24. Captain Reckline noted that "Funds raised in the kettles were used to help 6,800 people during the year 2000. We anticipate that the needs will be even greater this year."

Last holiday season saw an increase in volunteers but the need continues to grow. "We do not have enough volunteers and we do not want to turn any

needy persons away," he said. "Our neighbors have been generous in sending assistance to our efforts in New York, Washington, D.C. and Pennsylvania. With the delays in pay and sudden job lay-offs, we have already had an increase in persons seeking emergency assistance. We believe that is an indication of an increased need for the coming holiday season."

He concluded, "We invite religious groups, service clubs, neighborhood organizations, social organizations and individuals to help us with our holiday activities and to ring the bells so that we may help the needy in our community."

Nationally, the first bell ringer is to be John Busby, National Commander of the Salvation Army, who, along with noted artist Thomas Kinkade, will be in mid field Thanksgiving day, at Texas Stadium for the Cowboy's annual game. With Busby doing the ringing, Kinkade, serving as the 2001 Honorary National Christmas Kettle Chairman, is to make the first donation.

Local case workers lend aid in NYC

SANFORD — Three weeks after three counselors from the Sanford state attorney office returned from helping victims of the World Trade Center, three more Seminole counselors were called to duty.

Sanford police Investigator Deborah Jacobs, Jim Rick from the State Attorney's office and Debbie Mittan from the Casselberry police along with

eight other Florida counselors were activated by the National Organization of Victim Assistance more than a month after the towers toppled.

The 11-member group left Oct. 13 to continue victim assistance at the New Jersey family assistance center in Liberty State Park. From across the park is the site, which Jacobs said rising smoke can be seen on a daily basis.

"It's a incredible sight at night," Jacobs said. "You can see

the cranes and the New York skyline. The presence is definitely there."

"I originally got called the Sunday after Sept. 11 and was supposed to leave Monday but due to scheduling I was unable to make that," Jacobs said.

The original team of Florida counselors helped establish the assistance center on Sept. 21. According to Jacobs, the center is still being used by those who lost

New tracking system helps courts, cops

What if a law enforcement officer stopping an adult or juvenile on the street could know their legal status with a click of a key on their laptop?

This is now a common occurrence in Seminole County with the implementation of the CAFE case tracking system. Developed by the Information Technology

Department of the Sheriff's Office, CAFE (an acronym for Computer Aided Forms Entry) is being used by most law enforcement agencies within the county, as well as Seminole County Probation and P.A.Y. (Prosecution Alternatives for Youth), the county's juvenile pretrial diversion program.

Along with the usual information regarding vital statistics and arrest records, users have access to entries regarding contacts

with these individuals by other agencies as well as their social history and court ordered terms of probation. This enables law enforcement to know whether a probationer has a pending court date or whether a juvenile has a curfew order.

Since data is updated 24 hours a day, seven days a week, the officer on the street can have the latest information in "real time."

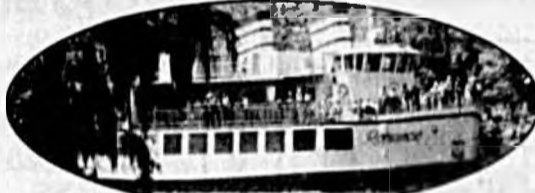

Statewide initiative nabs ID theft ring

Six people have been arrested and two others are expected to be brought into custody on charges that they assumed the identities of individuals participating in a medical study and used them to fraudulently obtain nearly \$300,000 in merchandise, officials announced late last week.

Among those arrested were Louie Foster, 36, Michaela Rosson, 34, both of Orlando, and Kimberly Bowes, 25, of Lake Helen. Also arrested were Herbert Smith, 44, Matthew Butler, 42, and Jessica Pugh, 23, all of Chicago. Two other Chicagoans, Cheryl Thomas, 41, and Rodney Coffee, 34, are expected to be arrested soon, officials said. Each of the eight faces up to 30 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine on charges of organized fraud brought against them by the Sixteenth Statewide Grand Jury.

According to officials, an employee of the Nemours Children's Clinic in Orlando obtained social security numbers and other identifying information of 18 individuals from around the country who participated in a study concerning cystic fibrosis and whose children suffer from the disease.

"That personal information was passed on to the employee's brother, Herbert Smith, who had false birth certificates and social security printouts created in Chicago," said Melanie Ann Hines, statewide prosecutor. "He then recruited people he knew previously in the Chicago area, as well as new acquaintances made in Orange and Seminole counties. They in turn used the false documents to obtain identity cards in the names of the victims through offices of the Florida Department of Motor Vehicles."

According to officials, the individuals used the false identities to obtain instant credit at electronic and furniture stores across Orange and Seminole counties, then purchased big-screen televisions, computers and other high cost items until the victims credit limits were exhausted. The purchased items were later sold on the streets of Orlando and Chicago for half of the retail value and the proceeds were divided by Smith and given to the suspects.

The investigation was conducted by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the Orlando Police Department as part of Operation LEGIT (Law Enforcement Getting Identity Thieves), a statewide initiative to combat identity theft in Florida.

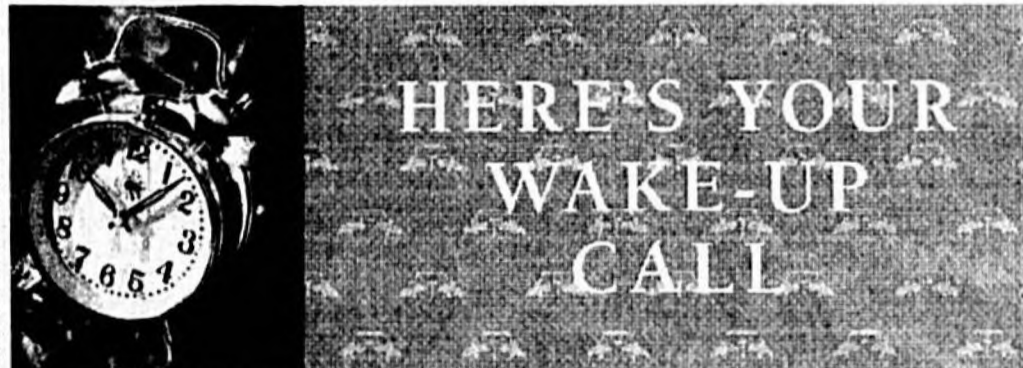

Woodruff leads clean-up effort in Georgetown

SANFORD — District 1 City Commissioner Art Woodruff led an effort, Oct. 20 to clean up trash and debris in the Georgetown community.

About 40 volunteers showed up for the clean-up, including city employees. Among the groups represented were the Community Improvement Association, Universal Needs Alliance, the SWEAT group from the Sheriff's Office, and a local sorority.

"We had four big roll-off dumpsters that we filled," Woodruff said. "We piled up enough stuff that we had to get three more roll-offs to pick it all up."

The community clean-up was done, Woodruff said, because, "it needed to be done," and to coincide with the city's new fall and spring pick-up schedule.

Beginning in the spring of 2002, the city will pick up household and yard debris twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall. The pick-up schedule was to have begun this fall, but city officials pushed the date back to spring.

"We had already scheduled this

when then changed the start date," Woodruff said. "We decided we should go ahead and do this regardless of when the spring/fall pick-ups started."

Woodruff publicized the event by going door-to-door in the community.

"We got to most of the homes," Woodruff said. "We encouraged them if they couldn't come out and help us on that day, to clean up around their homes and leave the stuff our front so we could pick it up. Several people did that. We also had residents who saw what was going on, and they brought out stuff from their yards."

Crew from the city's public works department used front-end loaders to clean alleys and pick up large piles of debris.

Woodruff said he was pleased with the event, but noted, "We didn't get everything. There's still work to do."

traveling public, and especially our growing family of loyal Pan Am customers, some good news," said Dave Fink, president of Pan Am. "We expect that they will enjoy the convenience of flying Clipper Class non-stop to BWI and to our expanding list of destinations."

While the Baltimore connection is good news for Sanford, Pan Am's most popular destination, officials at MidAmerica Airport in St. Louis weren't as pleased. Pan Am announced it is dropping service to the airport because of sluggish ticket sales.

Like Sanford, MidAmerica has hoped to establish itself as a hassle-free alternative to the region's major airport, Lambert Field. MidAmerica was opened in 1998 25 miles east of St. Louis in St. Clair County, Ill. The \$213 million facility failed to attract attention from the airlines and sat empty for two years until Pan Am began service in August 2000.

The most recent sales figures indicated flights to MidAmerica were less than half full, sometimes carrying only 30 passengers.

In other airport news, the Airport Authority:

- Re-elected Bill Miller as chairman; elected Jeff Triplett as vice chairman; and elected Jeff Longstaff as secretary/treasurer.
- Approved a 10-month, \$50,000 contract with Alcade & Faye to lobby the federal government.

"It's important that the airport obtain federal funding for some of its projects, like environmental clean-up," said Larry Dale, OSI president. "Those airports with federal representation have a distinct advantage over us in obtaining those funds."

Dale said the company currently represents Orange and Dade counties, and L.A. "Skip" Bafalis, a former congressman from Central Florida, will handle most of the duties for OSI.

Authorized Dale to ask the Sanford City Commission to renew the lease between the city and the Airport Authority for five years and consider renewal every five years.

Dale said the Airport Authority currently has a 39-year lease, which began Oct. 7, 1995. Dale said the five-year extension would enable the authority to offer 30-year leases to prospective tenants at the airport. Under the current agreement, the authority can not offer leases that extend past its own lease with the city.

"I'd like to be able to renew the lease every five years so we can continue to offer a 30-year lease," Dale said. "Anything that goes longer than our lease, we have to take to the city commission, which is a hindrance not only to our potential tenants and staff but to the city commission, as well."

"The tenants need to have some security," said Steve Coover, the authority's attorney. "It makes sense not to bother the city with every lease we want to enter into."

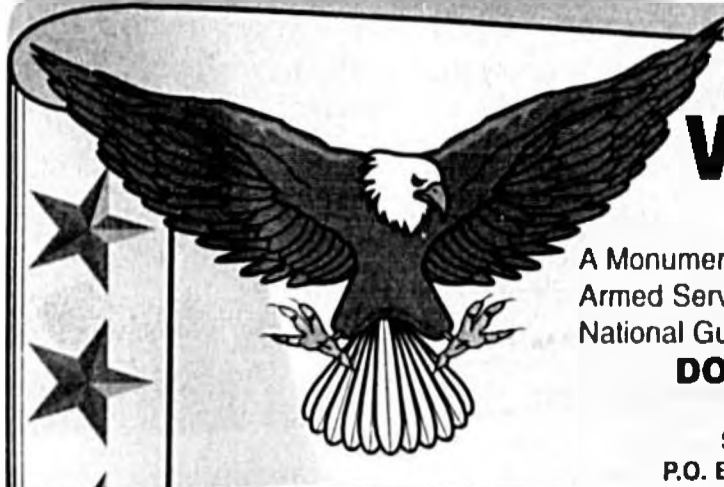

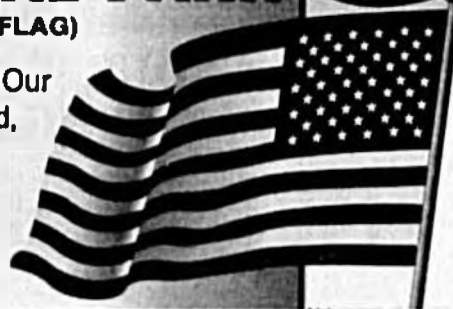

Longwood's Scott serves U.S. Army by fighting fires

OMAK, Wash. — When firefighters called in the Army in their battle to snuff out wildfires in northeastern Washington, the son of Longwood couple traded his M-16 rifle for a pick and shovel and joined the cause.

Alongside more than 500 other soldiers from Fort Lewis, Wash., Army Pfc. Garrett L. Scott of Longwood, deployed to Omak in late August to back up firefighters working to contain wild land fires burning across nearly 80,000 acres on the Colville Indian Reservation. With fire crews stretched past their limits battling over 50 major blazes in 11 states across western U.S., federal officials brought in military reinforcements to relieve the firefighters who had been fighting the Colville fire since Aug. 12. The fires also threatened the town of Omak and other neighboring communities.

The soldiers, mostly infantrymen and engineers, worked in 25-man teams and performed mop-up operations to keep fires from restarting in scorched forest areas. Soldiers dug fire lines, put out hot spots, cut down burnt trees and extinguished fires still burning in tree root systems.

"We're here to fight flames throughout this mountainous area. I'm part of a 20-man team whose job is to extinguish hot spots in the forest that has already been burned. This is important because smoldering areas can flare up and restart the fire. With the Army here doing this task, the trained firefighters can concentrate on the larger fires," said Scott, a 2000 graduate of Lyman High School, Longwood.

Although firefighting isn't what most of the soldiers were trained to do, the experience still provides squad leaders, platoon sergeants and platoon leaders an opportunity to gain experience leading soldiers under stressful conditions. The enemy isn't human, but Scott and his colleagues are still battling a force that could be just as deadly as any tank, gun or bomb.

"It feels good to help out our fellow Americans. The people who line here have been very supportive and friendly. All our hard work and effort is really appreciated."

No matter how unconventional the mission, for Scott and his colleagues, fighting the fires in Washington is just another way to serve their country.

 quence analyses. These reports help the public understand the potential dangers of a specific hazardous materials site accident, said Gennell. That information is disseminated to the public through public hearings, but Gennell said that avenue of communication is not effective. According to Gennell, there is also a "lack of interest and cooperation" of the six counties in the LEPC. Gennell said the Central Florida LEPC has "not been as effective" as other LEPCs in the state. A better base of support from the public and elected officials is needed to push the state legislature in addressing and

correcting potential hazards, she said. On potential hazard Gennell said she became concerned with years ago was how tractor trailers carrying hazardous materials travel through the state unchecked. Although hazardous placards on trucks have helped some cities address the potential danger, Gennell said there still needs to be more regulations. "There is no place in the state of Florida that checks these trucks," she said. "Nobody knows what is being done where, when or by whom. Way before the terrorist issue, I knew we had an issue of these trucks

driving up and down I-4. I have 434 going through my city. My fire chief has no idea of what's going through our town. Is a truck full of ammonia coming through at 3 a.m.? We need to know. This is ridiculous. This just can't be this way." These issues and others on making the community safer in the face of terrorism will be addressed Wednesday at the Council of Local Governments in Seminole County monthly meeting at 7 p.m. at the Winter Springs City Hall.  loved ones or lost their job as a result of the terrorist attack. As of Oct. 13 the center had already helped 1,300 families, said Jacobs, and one day during her stay the center helped 76 families. "We had some pretty high numbers while we were there. A lot of them just didn't know about the facility," Jacobs said. The center is not only a place where families and survivors can find comfort, but with the help of counselors like Jacobs who usually work from about 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. the center is also helpful at fulfilling needs. The center offers a variety of services provided by groups such as social security, department of motor vehicles, department of health and business, veteran affairs, attorneys for filing death certificates, law enforcement for missing person reports, Red Cross and the Salvation Army. "There was so many people that worked in the World Trade Center and no longer have employment because there is no place to go to," Jacobs said. One thing had changed since the first Florida team of counselors left the family assistance center. The center was now administering World Trade Center site visits for families. A

ferry would transport about 15 people a day across the Hudson River into Manhattan. "We did find some families that considered loved ones missing would come back and file for their death certificate. I guess it was giving them some closure," said Jacobs who went on two of the site visits. "It's hard to put in words the devastation," Jacobs said. "You see pictures of what it looked like before — it's hard to describe the large amount of rubble. Its unbelievable mass destruction." Jacobs said the most memorable part of the trip was all the stories from the people who experienced Sept. 11 in New York firsthand. "Your actually working with people that were that day or lost someone," Jacobs said. "There telling you stories of what they saw - the running. You see the

people telling their stories on TV, but when you're actually meeting someone telling a story it validates everything you've seen." Not only is Jacobs a NOVA trained counselor and Sanford police investigator for crimes against children and child sex crimes, but she has also been a Seminole County Sheriff's Office volunteer victim advocate for the past seven years. "Just the opportunity to go is a life experience," Jacobs said. "I would do it again. There was something you got out of it because you were helping. I personally got a lot out of it.  If a probationer is in violation of the terms of his/her court order, for example, a violation order can be generated on the spot. Because images, such as booking photos, can also be added to the system, officers are able to verify identification at the scene. This feature also enables victims and witnesses to identify suspects more quickly which saves law enforcement valuable time in apprehending them. Developed as part of the Community Justice Coalition, CAFE allows law enforcement agencies and other related organizations to share information on common clients. Very often a probationer being supervised by County Probation will have a child or sibling in the juvenile system being monitored by P.A.Y. Knowing this helps both agencies, as well as law enforcement, to be more effective and proactive in holding these individuals and families accountable for "toeing the line." Another feature of CAFE is the addition of the RADAR system. RADAR (Repeat Adolescent Delinquency Abatement via Responsibility) is a youth referral program for law enforcement. When an officer finds a juvenile in a place they shouldn't be or doing something that could lead to trouble, they can issue a RADAR report. Even though there may have been no law violation, this report alerts both their parents and law enforcement that this particular youth bears watching. Current users of CAFE are enthusiastic about the results so far. Community justice agencies and law enforcement report that access to shared information has resulted in more effective supervision of offenders and that better inter-agency communication has produced an increased sense of working together for the common good. The implementation of CAFE provides a vital tool for all those seeking to promote public safety within the community.

Demand on FWC law enforcement officers on the increase

OCALA — Because of the country's high state of alert, law enforcement officers with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) are being called to perform security details, which will limit some of the time they can devote to the duties they normally perform.

"Our officers are certified state law enforcement officers and as such are under the same auspices as every other state law enforcement officer in Florida," said Capt. Mickey Otwell, FWC law enforcement supervisor for Brevard, Osceola and Indian River counties. "That means that they can and are being called upon to respond to the current heightened state of alert because of the recent terrorist attacks."

Since Sept. 11, numerous FWC officers have been involved in security details statewide as part of a joint task force of all state law enforcement agencies under direction of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) and the Emergency Operation Center (EOC).

"To accommodate the current situation, we are adjusting agency enforcement issues and making changes in schedules, and will have to temporarily curtail or postpone some of the activities our officers normally perform," Otwell said.

One such planned activity that has been put on hold is the agency's plan to announce, through the news media, when and where law enforcement officers will be performing manatee zone enforcement details in Brevard and Lee counties. The idea of regular announcements is to increase boater compliance in the targeted zones, as well as others.

"Manatee zone enforcement remains a priority, and officers will still be patrolling critical areas on a regular basis. However, we feel that with security patrol demands increasing daily now is not the best time to launch such a sustained effort," said Otwell.

Other areas that will be affected include outreach efforts such as presentations to school and civic groups, fairs and other exhibitions.

There are currently 678 sworn law enforcement officer positions in the FWC statewide (including vacancies and 44 recruits currently in the agency's academy). Most will likely be affected by the need for security patrols. In addition, 14 officers have been activated by military reserve duties.

FWC STAFF UNDERTAKES REVIEW

OF MANATEE STATUS

TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) directed its manatee program staff to evaluate whether West Indian manatees still qualify for listing as an endangered species.

A petition, filed with the FWC Aug. 17, requested the agency undertake a review of the species' status, based on indications the manatee population has increased over the past 20 years.

"Manatees appear to have successfully recovered to a level which clearly exceeds the defined parameters for listing as an endangered species under FWC rules," said Coastal Conservation Association Florida executive director Ted Forsgren in a letter to FWC Chairman David Meehan.

FWC scientists have reviewed the petition and determined that it meets minimum requirements to warrant investigation.

Commissioners directed FWC

biologists to launch a year-long study of the manatee's status. Following that, a panel of scientists from outside the agency will review the staff's conclusions and make a final recommendation to the Commission. The third step, if the Commission agrees to a change in the manatee's status, is to prepare a new management plan for the species. The entire process will take about two years to complete.

Manatees are large marine mammals which congregate in Florida's waters, especially in cold seasons. Speeding boats and other hazards have taken a heavy toll on the slow-moving animals.

The latest survey documented the manatee population at 3,276. Last year, 273 died of natural and man-made causes. As of Oct. 19, 271 manatees have died this year.

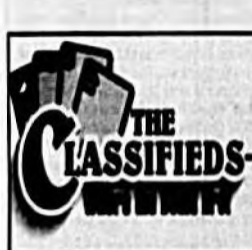
