## Better Legal Service For GIs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Sam J. Ervin Jr., D-N.C., has proposed an overhaul of the 1950 Uniform Code of Military Justice designed to provide improved legal services for men in the armed forces.

This bill would require that servicemen have access when facing special courts-martial. This form of military trial is for charges less serious than those handled at general courts-martials.

Ervin wants guarantees of basic procedural due process for servicemen subject to immediate discharge, a professional corps of lawyers in the Navy and Marine Corps, and incoming courts made up of officers and civilians to act as appeal judges.

Ervin said that after young men are called up to serve, "we are bound to consider what offer them the best legal system we can devise to protect and judge them while they are in uniform."

## S. Vietnamese Women To Tour

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agency for International Development and the Asia Foundation will send a delegation of 12 to 15 Vietnamese women from the United States this summer and fall to 27 businesses from South Vietnam.

They will attend a week intensive marketing seminar at the Harvard School of Business. They will follow this with a tour of 12 American cities to see first hand business and marketing procedures.

The delegation interests range from import export to small manufacturing enterprises.

Their tour in August and September will take them to New York, Boston, N.Y., Cleveland, Detroit, Ohio, Louisville, Ky., Chicago, Milwaukee, Denver, Atlanta, Calif., and San Francisco.

## Consolidation Is Rejected

TAMPA (AP) — Hillsborough County and Tampa voters Tuesday overwhelming rejected a proposal to consolidate the two government entities from the countywide voting gave 12,000 votes in favor of consolidation, 20,300 against.
