



"He used to enjoy pounding on her for no reason at all." said Caroline Hays, a longtime friend who worked with Mrs. Warren at the Lakeview Nursing Home in Sanford. Mrs. Hays said Mrs. Warren worked at the nursing home for a year and she recalls the day the Sanford native

was fired for not reporting to work. "I saw her coming up the driveway. Her eye was badly trussed," Mrs. Hays said. "She didn't want to go in, she

"I don't want to go in and let them see me like this, Mrs. Hays quoted her as saying.
"We've been together several times and he'd begin

hitting her for no reason," Linda Dennis, who has known Mrs. Warren for nine years, said. "He was jealous, he didn't want her to have any friends. He wanted her to stay home," she said.

Ms. Dennis said the beatings have been going on for as long as the two women have been friends. The beatings would usually result in black eyes and facial bruises, but on one occasion several months ago it was more serious, Ms. Dennis said.

## Leftist Bomb Ruins Millions In French Art Treasures

terrorists today bombed the Versailles Palace, destroying millions of dollars of irreplaceable art treasures on three floors of France's most famous landmark.

Police said two radical leftist group claimed responsibility for the bomb, made of several pounds of dynamite or plastic explosive and planted on the ground floor Gallery of Stones during a public fireworks display Sunday evening.

Worst hit was the Gallery of Battles - a monumental colonnaded hall with dozens of French history from the days of the Roman conquest to Napoleonic times.

The explosion ripped a 30-foot wide hole in the gallery's ceiling, wrecked all its crystal chandeliers, shredded seven large murals, and made splinters of priceless antique furniture. One night watchman was slightly

## Canada Airline With

102 Aboard: 'Many Injuries'

TORONTO (UPI) — An Air Canada DC-9 with 102 persons aboard crashed on takeoff and broke into three pieces at Toronto International Airport today. Airport spokesmen said there were a "large number" of injuries but no immediate report of fatalities.

Airport emergency crews rushed to the end of runway 23-left, where the plane came to rest, and began taking the injured to hospitals.

SALISBURY, Rhodesia (UPI) - Rhodesian troops have reportedly invaded Mozambique in pursuit of the killers of 12 Britons - axed, bayoneted and clubbed to death in the worse massacre of whites of the six-year war.

### Israel Spurns Egypt Plan

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) - Israel has spurned an Egyptian plan calling on Israel to first withdraw from the West Bank and Gaza Strip and then allow the Arabs to decide the future of the occupied territories.

The Egyptian blueprint — which officials in Cairo said would be presented to the United States in time for Vice President Mondale's Friday departure for Israel and Egypt envisages Israel's withdrawal and the restoration of the West Bank to Jordan and the Gaza Strip to Egypt.

The other explanation offered for Mrs. Warren staying with her husband was financial support for their three children.

"Her children are more important to her than anything else in the world," Mrs. Hays said. "She couldn't support them on her salary." Mrs. Warren was working at Seminole Memorial dospital as a nurse's aide at the time of the murder.

"She's a very good humanitarian, she's always worked well with older persons," Mrs. Hays said. Ms. Dennis said she at one time lived next door to the Warrens, who reside at \$15 E. Ninth St., and the police were frequently called to calm down their domestic disputes. On one other occasion in the past year, a domestic argument ended with Mrs. Warren stabbing her husband, according to Willie Warren, brother of the dead

Mrs. Warren is free on \$1,500 bond following Friday's preliminary hearing. Bond was reduced after Bridges told

Judge Alan Dickey this is a domestic case with a history of wife abuse and self defense is indicated. Assistant State Attorney Ralph Erikason told the judge the state has not received all of the data pertaining to the case for a decision to be made on what charges will be filed against Mrs. Warren. She was arrested for second degree murder. A decision on the charges is expected at a preliminary hearing, scheduled for Friday at 2 p.m.

The 39-year-old Warren called police himself to report the stabbing at 11:30 p.m. on that Friday. Sanford policeman Joe Dillard was first on the scene and he reported finding Warren lying on the living room floor in a pool of blood. "My wife stabbed me," Warren

reportedly told Dillard. One hour and 15 minutes later Warren died on the operating table at Seminole Memorial Hospital. He had been stabbed once in the back and Mrs. Warren was in the house when she was taken into custody.

## N.Y.C. Bankruptcy Bill Due For Callup Thursday

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Senate set a busy work schedule this week to make up for time lost in the 17-day suspended filibuster on labor law revisions.

Both House and Senate will quit Friday for a 10-day Fourth of July recess.

The Senate agenda was mostly appropriations and relatively minor legislation, with only one major item - a bill to prevent bankruptcy for New York City.

Senate Democratic leader Robert Byrd said he intends to call up the bill by Thursday. The current program that has kept the city solvent since 1975 expires the following day, June 30 the day the holiday recess begins.

### House Vs. Disney On Resort

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The decade-old battle between Walt Disney Corp. and conservationist groups reached Congress today. The House scheduled debate on legislation adding the Mineral King Valley to California's Sequoia National Park instead of letting it become a Disney ski resort.

## No Faith In President?

It is a disquieting sign of our times that some of our congressmen and senators should suggest more credence for Fidel Castro's denial of Cuba's role in the invasion of Zaire than for the President's word to the contrary.

This is not to say that President Carter should go unquestioned about foreign policy or anything else.
But we find it not only ridiculous but damaging that congressional critics of the administration's toughening response to Communist aggression in Africa should deny overwhelming evidence and dispute Cuban complicity in the Shaba province

It is ironic that these critics are mostly Democrats.

During his June 14 press conference, President Carter patiently explained the basis for U.S. criticism of Cuba, as he has done on several previous occasions.

He simply pointed out that Angola, whence came the invaders, is a vassal state over which the Cubans exercise military and political control. There are, he indicated, more than 20,000 Cuban troops occupying Angola with about 4,000 of these based in the invasion staging area. Mr. Carter pointed out that Mr. Castro, by his own admission,

knew of the invasion beforehand and failed to stop it, as he could easily have done, and he failed to warn Zaire and other nations. None of these factors is in dispute. The decisive fact is that the Katangans could not have mounted such an invasion without training, supplies - and

consent — from the Cuban high command in Nevertheless, Cuba's altogether-expected-denial was enough to send Congressmen Anthony Beilenson, D.-Calif., and Stephen Solarz, D.-N.Y., scurrying to Havana for a seven-hour personal

interview with Fidel Castro. "President Castro makes a very compelling case," Congressman Solarz proclaimed upon returning to this country. U.S. evidence "is not compelling and certainly not conclusive." said

Congressman Beilenson.

We are reminded of a recent headline in an Eastern newspaper, "Prayda, McGovern Berate Brzezinski About Africa." This capsules the role of Sen. George McGovern, D.-S.D., as a leading critic of administration foreign policy in the Senate.

If these Democrats and others on Capitol Hill have no faith in their president and must seek information from abroad, one wonders why they don't consult Free World allies instead of Communist defendants.



## Liberals Warn Carter

WASHINGTON - There was a familiar ring to the warning from Americans for Democratic Action that President Carter faces the loss of liberal support for 1980 unless he shifts leftward over the next two years.

Back in April, 1967, the ADA convention issued a similar ultimatum to President Lyndon B. Johnson over the war in Vietnam, a warning LBJ ignored. Within a year, opposition to the war had reached such a pitch that Johnson withdrew from the 1968 presidential race.

Liberal disenchantment with Carter has been sharpened by the president's recent embrace of Cold War rhetoric and return to fiscal conservatism in the wake of passage of Proposition

In fact, only the restraining influence of ADA national leaders — including outgoing chairman George McGovern — kept the convention's final esolution phrased as a mere warning. Some delegates had wanted to press for adoption of a 'dump-Carter" resolution, even though it is still more than two years to the next presidential

ADA Vice President Joseph L. Rauh Jr., a Washington lawyer and civil rights activist who has consistently been one of Carter's harshest critics, argued it is too early to write Carter off as a dead loss to liberals.

"Harry Truman swung sharply to the right after the 1946 Republican landslide and stayed there throughout 1947. But in 1948, he moved left again. Carter may yet do the same thing," Rauh Unless Carter starts fulfilling some of his

liberal campaign promises, however, Rauh and ther ADA leaders predicted that a "Draft Kennedy" movement will develop by this time next year. "If there had been a vote at our convertion last weekend, Teddy Kennedy would have won overwhelmingly," he said.

Republican hopefuls, meanwhile, continue to jockey for position in the 1980 sweepstakes, with one eye on Carter and the other on the mounting list of contenders within the GOP.

Former CIA Director George Bush, although seldom visible in Washington, is very much in the thick of the competition out on the road

Bush has already traveled to some 30 states, and will no doubt visit more between now and the November congressional elections. Having been served as U.S. liaison with the Peoples Republic of China and as CIA director, he is working hard to rebuild his GOP credentials this year.

He makes no bones about his presidential ambitions, although he stops short of an outright declaration of candidacy. "I know inside what I want to do but it's too early to make a decision," he said during a recent trip to Washington. Bush insists his determination, expected to

come either late this year or early in 1979, will not be affected by the plans of either Ronald Reagan or Gerald Ford. "My chances might not be unaffected by their ctions, but my decision will be," he said.

Another GOP presidential prospect, Senate Minority Leader Howard H. Baker Jr., is raking in contributions for his Tennessee re-election campaign from a lot of "heavy hitters" of earlier Republican campaigns.

## Too Much Oil For Awhile

The good news is that the price of oil on the world market is going to remain at \$12.70 a

By DON GRAFF

That is about five times what it was five years ago when the oil producers liberated pricing from the restrictions of supply and demand. The not-so-good news is that price stabilization is only temporary. It could last out

the year, but certainly not much longer. The Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries concluded its recent Geneva pricing session with good guys - from the Western poin of view - Saudi Arabia and Iran carrying the argument for a price freeze. Iraq, Libya and Algeria, among others, had pushed for an immediate boost to counter the erosion of oil income which is a result of continuing depreciation of the dollar - a situation, it should be noted, to which ever-higher oil prices have made their very substantial contribution

Something more than Western interests is involved in Saudi and Iranian caution, however. There is currently a glut of oil on the world market, and a buyers' market is no time to try to squeeze more out of a buyer.

The Saudis are reported to believe that curtailed production should take care of the surplus problem in six months or so. Once supply and demand are back in balance, consuming nations can be confronted with an offering price they'll be in no position to refuse.

The reason for the current oversupply is in part OPEC overproduction, but also in significant part the coming onto the market of increasing quantities of oil from other sourches principally Alaska and the North Sea.

This is Western oil, and should improve the West's position in dealing with OPEC. But it is also very expensive oil to produce. It is economic in very great part because of the artificially high price the OPEC countries have set for their product. If OPEC is in a situation to raise prices when

supply and demand are in balance, it conceivably could also drop them in a price war that the new Western producers would quickly lose. It is a situation fraught with possibilities, none particularly encouraging for Western An incident made some news pages a few



## **Gator Bites Arm**

Of Boy On Shore

DEERFIELD BEACH (UPI) - Eight-year-old Eric Glatt of Hillsdale, N.J., crouched on a canal bank behind his grandmother's house Monday trying to scoop minnows from the water with his bright red toy bucket. Suddenly, an alligator - its mouth wide open- appeared in front of the boy and the powerful jaws snapped shut on his arm, Eric later told his mother.

He fell back on the canal bank acreaming and the gator turned loose and sank back into the water. Bleeding and crying in terror, the boy ran to his mother, Carol Giatt, and grandmother, Mrs. Nora Gilbert. They wrapped his arm in a towel and rushed him to North

Broward Hospital. Surgeons reported the alligator had bitten flesh from Eric's arm, tore tendons losse and broke a couple of bones. They operated in an attempt to save his arm, which

they said may never be the same again. Authorities said none of the residents of the area have ever reported seeing an alligator in the canal.


