today that "Mr. Nixon is doing well" following an operation to stop a blood clot in his left leg from traveling any further toward his heart or

Dr. Eldon Hickman, who performed the hourlong operation, said Nixon's condition was "stable." He said Nixon returned to his room on the top of Memorial Hospital Medical Center of Long Beach for recovery.

Nixon's personal physician had said the operation was required because the clots in Nixon's leg posed a threat to his life.

"With the threat the clot could become a pulmonary embolus, we placed a mild clip . partially occluding but not completely occluding the vein," Hickman said. He said the clip was He caid the operation was uneventful and that

the former president was "recovering in the normal manner."

The doctor said he had the usual postoperative effects of being sleepy and was confined to bed. The operation began at 5:30 a.m. PST. None of Nixon's family was present at the hospital, but officials said his wife, Pat, was expected at the hospital later in the day.

signed as president Aug. 9, agreed to undergo the surgery recommended by his own physician and consultants.

Dr. John C. Lungren, Nixon's physician for 22 years, said in a statement Monday night that the decision to operate was reached after X rays and a venogram confirmed the presence of a large clot in a major vein in Nixon's left thigh.

"Dr. Eldon B. Hickman and Dr. Wiley F Barker, following the venogram, concurred that the new clot threatened to become a pulmonary embolus and thus endangers Mr. Nixon's life.' The operation was described by Lungren as more serious than usual because of the increased possibility of bleeding resulting from the anticoagulant drugs which Nixon has been taking.

Signs Drop;

Longwood Annexation Postponed

LONGWOOD - Planner David Farr left the city council meeting empty-handed Monday night after the city fathers ailed to act on or even mention the proposed annexation and rezoning of the Frank Schrimsher property, northwest of SR 434

Council Chairman Don Schreiner said that the Schrimsher request was tabled by Acting City Atty. Ned Julian Jr. Julian, however, in a private conference with Farr in the city hall reception room notified the development consultant he could go home - that council had decided to require plans for the property's development prior to taking action either to

Council last week unanimously, but informally gave Farr a unanimous "indication" that the land would be annexed and rezoned to permit commercial and apartment development and instructed Julian to prepare a resolution noting the city's intent on the matter.

Last week Council member June Lormann noted she did not favor the requested rezoning, but nodded approval of the entire request after a whispered conference with Councilman H. A. Scott, who sits next to her at the council table.

Farr at the time said his client planned to develop only the high portions of the property, 10 acres in apartments at the rate of 13 units per acre.

Ford Visits Home Town

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford returns for the first time since becoming chief executive to his hometown of Grand Rapids, Mich., today to campaign for the Republican challenger to the district's first Democratic incumbent in decades.

Ford planned to leave Washington by mid-afternoon and return to the capital later tonight. The trip opens four days of campaigning for Republican candidates by Ford, who will set out Thursday for a threeday political tour that will take him across the country to West Coast states.

Republican Paul Goebel Jr. is facing Democratic Rep. Richard VanderVeen, who won a special election in Michigan's 5th Congressional District to replace Ford when he was named vice president last year.

VanderVeen's victory to fill the remainder of Ford's congressional term was the first by any Democrat in the district since 1912.

45 Years Ago

NEW YORK (AP) - Wall Street today marks its gloomiest anniversary, 45 years after the stock market began its dizziest fall in history on Oct. 28-29, 1929. But even with numerous current troubles, including inflation, tight money and a slumping economy, traders can take heart that the bear market of 1974 and the great crash of 1929 are as different as night and day, many analysts agree. For one thing, speculators in the '20s had free rein. untouched by any sort of governmental regulation. The Federal Reserve and the Securities and Exchange Commission now act to keep speculators in bounds and protect traders from outright market fraud.

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Carla Rodriguez squirmed in the lap of her father, and to Salvadore Rodriguez it was a deeply emotional moment. "It's a miracle," said Rodriguez as his wife held Altagracia, Carla's sister. The 15-month-old Siamese twins from the Dominican Republic were separated in a recent operation, and Rodriguez saw them last weekend for the first time since the surgery.

Questions A Good Sign

CHICAGO (AP) - The "Why, Daddy?" and "Why, Mommy?" questions that often stump parents should be encouraged, says a University of Chicago psychiatrist. Such questions, asked seemingly endlessly by some children, reflect the kind of inquiring mind essential for a creative person, says Dr. Lawrence Z. Freedman.

Employers Urge Public Transit

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Employers throughout the city start asking San Francisco's 500,000 commuters today to give up their cars one day each week. The object: Save fuel by breaking the car-commuting habit. Thirteen major corporations already have agreed to urge all their employes - from top executives down to clerks - to use public transit instead of private autos once a week.

Chile Repression Eased

WASHINGTON (AP) -- Chile's military dictatorship has eased some of its repressive domestic policies, but there is no sign democracy will return soon, U.S. intelligence sources say. When the generals overthrew the elected government of Marxist President Salvadore Allende 13 months ago, they

moved hard against anyone even remotely suspected of opposing the new regime, the sources said. But the new government has eased its policies in the last six or seven months, the U.S. analysts said.

Two explanations are given for the shift. First, the regime has increasing confidence in its own strength internally, primarily because an opposition has not formed. Second, the U.S. Congress has applied pressure with threats to cut off arms aid.
