

### Saigon Corruption Charged SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) - National Assem-

blyman Tran Van Tuyen today called on Fresident Nguyen Van Thieu to Lisser charges of corruption made bloc of 2i deputies, told a news conference if Thieu failed to answer the charges satisfactorily, he would introduce a motion to impeach the president. He cited charges made by a group of Roman Catholics on Sept. 8 that Thieu and members of his family were involved in extensive corrupt real estate deals, a fertilizer scandal, narcotics smuggling, corruption in the construction and management of a Saigon hospital, and had profited from rice shortages in central Vietnam.

### 'Difficult Decisions' For Dutch THE HAGUE, Netherlands (AP) - The Dutch Justice Ministry has resumed negotiations with three Japanese terrorists holding nine hostages in the French embassy, a spokesman announced today.

The spokesman gave no other information about the negotiations seeking to end the siege that began four days ago. But Premier Joop den Uyl said in a television interview on Monday night, "I have a feeling that in the next 24 hours a series of very difficult decisions will have to be taken by us."

He expressed concern because both the terrorists and their hostages, who include French Ambassador Jacques Senard, were getting tired and edgy.

### Last U.S. POW Freed

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP) - Emmet James Kay, the last known American prisoner of war in Indochina, will be flown to the Philippines for a medical checkup Wednesday as soon as he is released by the Communist Pathet Lao, the U.S. Embassy said today.

The Pathet Lao announced today that a British Embassy plane would bring the 47-yearold civilian pilot to Vientiane Wednesday from Sam Neua, the Pathet Lao capital in northeast Laos where he has been a captive for those same men will be reap-

# Old Argument On Hijackers Revived

There has always been a serious difference of pinion as to what if any, action airline pilots should take when faced with a hijack attempt. When hijacking was something of anternational fad several years ago officials generally lined up on two sides: - The softliners who, concerned over the safety of innocent passengers, favored submitting to the demands of the hijackers and - The hardliners who argued that international piracy would become a fact of life until hijackers were convinced that they would be made to pay the ultimate penalty for piracy.

It was not an easy question to resolve. Any decision that threatened the lives of sometimes hundreds of innocent bystanders was, naturally, repugnant to civilized men and women, but the prospect of criminals and fanatics practicing wholesale blackmail almost at will was obviously an intolerable situation.

Fortunately tighter security and the disruption if not the elimination of many terrorist organizations made the question academic in

Then over the past weekend the inevitable happened. Three Vietnamese men hijacked an Air Vietnam jetliner and when their demands that they be flown to North Vietnam were not met exploded two hand grenades. Seventy-one persons died.

Officials said it was the first hijack incident in aviation history to result in massive deaths which. everything considered, is rather remarkable. Still, it did serve to revive the argument as to whether it is morally right to sacrifice 71 lives to make a

It had been our impression that most major airports had already installed security systems designed to prevent passengers from carrying such things as grenades aboard. Apparently in this one instance, at least, the system was something less

So if anything good is to come out of this tragedy it might be that airport officials will become a little more diligent in their search for such weapons and that the passengers will stop looking upon the search as a source of annoyance. The Vietnam incident should serve to remind us

all - airport officials and airline passengers alike - that a little inconvenience is a small price to pay


## **Press And Critics**

# Reversing **GOP Trend**

Political observers, noting President Ford's recent concessions to liberal opinion, and especially his designation of Nelson Rockefeller for Vice President, are wondering whether someone has persuaded Mr. Ford to abandon the "New Majority strategy" that has dominated Republican thinking in recent years and return to the "old time religion" of seeking victory through an Eastern-Midwestern coalition.

traditionally sought to win the presidency by carrying the big states of the Northeast and the Midwest, leaving most of the border South, the deep South, the Southwest, the Mountain states and the West to the Democrats. The coalition that nominated Barry Goldwater in 1964 spectarniarly reversed that strategy, virtually conceding the Northeast to the Democrats and concentrating instead on the areas of former Democratic predominance in the South and West, And while Goldwater was soundly defeated by Lyndon Johnson (himself a Texan, be it remembered), Richard Nixon employed the

New Majority strategy triumphantly in the

elections of 1968 and 1972.

As developed by Republican theorists, the New Majority strategy was based simply on an appreciation of what was happening in the country. The Northeastern WASP's who had dominated the GOP since its foundation were trending steadily leftward - either into the sort of near-beer Republican liberalism typified by the Ripon Society, or (like such beliwethers as John Lindsey) into the Democratic party itself. Meanwhile the old Democratic South was breaking up, and a whole new culture sympathetic to conservative Republicanism was developing in the fast-growing Sun Belt states of the Southwest. From 1964 forward, Republican conventions have been dominated, in a ratio of at least two to one, by a basically conservative coalition determined to continue expanding the cramatic Republican gains in those areas, at the expense if necessary of the Party's crumbling

pastions in the Northeast. Gerald Ford, of course, hails from Michigan - one of the old Republican bailiwicks now to be found, more often than not, in the Democratic column on Election Day. And as his Vice President and potential 1976 running-mate he has chosen the long-time New York governor and champion of Eastern liberal Republicanism.

Nelson Rockefeller. Offhand there would seem to be little in such a ticket designed to appeal to the New Majority put together by Richard Nixon in 1968 and 1972. If the Democrats in 1976 decide to pass up Senator Kennedy and nominate instead a ticket aimed at regaining the South and West (with Texas Senator Lloyd Bentsen, say, as the Presidential nominee, and California's young Senator John Tunney for Vice President), Ford and Rockefeller may have to do very well indeed in the Northeast and Midwest to offset Democratic inroads elsewhere.

With these words the then governor of New York launched, a year before the Goldwater nomination in July, 1964, an attack on the conservative wing of the Republican Party. No Republican has done more to damage his own party than Rockefeller. The political opportunism desplayed by Rockefeller, before and since, has been a series of acts that demonstrate a total disregard for "political morality." It is this record that makes President Ford's choice of the former New York governor so tasteless, mindless and perilous.

### **Voluntary Bugging Revealed**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Federal agents and informance vire themselves for sound to gather evidence in more than 1,000 cases a year, according to Asst. Attv. Gen. Henry E. Petersen. Petersen disclosed Justice Department statistics for so-called "consensual monitoring" in testimony before the National Wiretap Commission, a group of senators, congressmen and private citizens directed by Congress to recommend legislation controlling electronic surveillance. The practice has been overlooked previously as most hearings on government surveillance have focused on wiretapping and bugging requiring court warrants for domestic criminal investigations and the attorney general's authorization for national security purposes.

### Chicken Feed Not So

CENTRALIA, Ill. (AP) - Next time you're about to compare something inexpensive with chicken feed, bite your tongue. Poultry growers say a 100-pound sack of feed now costs \$9.50, about double the price two years ago. They also say they have to pay about \$2.25 for a pullet which will eat about \$9 worth of feed during the 15 months of the chicken's most productive egg-laying period. The chicken will lay about 20 dozen eggs, which will bring the farmer a return of about \$10.40, based on prices in Southern Illinois this month. That's for a total investment of \$11.25, and the growers point out that that still doesn't figure in pay for the help or repair to the coops.

### **AIM Leaders Freed**

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP) - American Indian Movement leaders Dennis Banks and Russell Means have won dismissals in the major test case of the 71-day Wounded Knee occupation, although the federal government may appeal the decision. In a slashing attack on "government miscenduct," U.S. District Judge Fred Nichol dismissed the charges against Banks, 42, St. Paul, and Means, 35, Percupine, S.D., on Monday, ending the eight-month trial. Nichel acted after the Justice Department refused to allow jury deliberations to continue after one juror suffered a stroke which left her partially paralzyed. Federal court procedure requires the approval of both sides before a jury may continue deliberations with one or more jurors

### Three Nations Join UN

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - The United Nations General Assembly opens its 29th annual session today with a record number of problems facing a record number of member nations. The first day's agenda included the admission of three

new nations: Bangladesh, formerly East Pakistan:



### Memories of Testudo, the king, and Maryland's losing seasons.

To me it's not so surprising that Alabama beat Maryland 21-16 this past weekend, but that the Terps were expected to be a threat at all to the perennial Crimson Tidal wave. I guess that I have yet to realize that the terrors of the

Atlantic Coast Conference have come a long way since they used to get whipped regularly by Wake Forest. It was lean times then, back in the 60's when I had the dubious pleasure of being an undergrad and attending every home football game. University academic reglations were beginning to tighten up after the free wheeling athlete-dominated 50's. For the sports conscious, this tightening had the effect of strangling the oncerespected Maryland football supremacy that the school knew under coach Jim Tatum.

But during the winless 60's, Tatum was only a legend-and no more real to most undergrads than the legend about Testudo the turtle. (Testudo was the large cast-iron turtle who sat dormant in front of McKeldin Library. Whenever a virgin graduated from the school, the legend goes, Testudo would leap up and trot around Byrd Stadium. That he never did this trick, was a failure of either the legend or the chastity of the coeds. I always preferred to believe the latter.) Tom Nugent was coach when I arrived on campus, as he

had been several years before. Tom would sit up in a crows nest suspended at the top of a tower during afternoon football practice and shout commands through a megaphone. Tom was reportedly as accessible to the players as his physical proximity during practice might suggest. The crow's nest, most of the players felt, was a good place for him. My most vivid memory of the man was watching a pep rally

where he was burned in effigy. That, and his television slot the Tom Nugent Show - during which the losing coach would approach the previous week's loss with all the naivete of a Walt Disney World Guide. If nothing else, Tom was always happy. After leaving Maryland, Tom took a public relations position for the annual Orange Bowl Classic - a tribute to his own giddy posture during several seasons at Maryland.

After Tom came Lou Sabin, a coach from the ranks of the NFL. Lou recruited a helluva freshman team for the next year. But for the time being, he was stuck with a varsity that had been recruited and organized by his predecessor. Most of the players, taking advantage of Nugent's self-imposed aloofness, had developed their own judgments of how college football should be played, on and off the field.

One specialty team back, known for his erratic and often spectacular on the field performances, fractured his ankle early in the summer practice session and later took to showing up at sweltering early fall practice sessions with several cold beers iced down in the top of his oversized cast. Four other players were dropped from the squad (a move that made Sports Illustrated) because, in Sabin's judgment, they didn't conform to behavior standards expected of a college football team.

This was also the era during which the now infamous King Corchron, presently quarterback for the WFL Philadelphia Bell, was starting third string quarterback behind a player by the name of Phil Petry and someone else whose name escapes me. King (it's not his given name, he tagged himself with it to emphasize his regalty) was into things like bellbottom pants and tinted shades even then. Obviously, a man before his time. Most of the King's greatest moves were made in the Varsity Grill, a local campus hangout. The King, at least, provided a little diversion during an otherwise bland season.

Sabin left at the end of that season. The next year most of the stalwarts on the freshman team flunked out. Academic rules were bent a little for athletes, especially those on schlorship, but they-weren't remolded to suit the individual players, as they were in the 50's. As a result, the athletes who made it through the first year were usually the brightest of the lot. This usually meant that the entire line didn't qualify.

But it didn't matter. Sabin's successor was Bob Ward, a former All-American guard from Maryland with very little coaching experience. Standing only 5'7", Ward tried to impress upon the players how important it is to have desire. Desire was what made him All-American, not size or ability, they were told. If Sabin had been hated and respected by the piayers, Ward was hated and ridiculed. The school newspaper called him a gnome. The players mocked him behind his back. Quality of play rapidly deteriorated.

In a 2-9 season, Terp fans, notorious for their heavy consumption of alcohol during games in Byrd Stadium, lapsed into irrational behavior. Pelting Testudo II, (the \$10,000 fiberglass turtle mounted on a Volkswagon chassis that the Student Government Association bought to revive school spirit) with ice and beer cans and driving a male cheerleader who had been riding on the shell underneath the safety of a table, hitting the leader of an official student cheering squad with a pie in the face, etc., it was slapstick all the way, and play on the field was

A man by the name of Roy Lester, a high school coach in nearby Montgomery County, became coach the following season in keeping with the school's coach-a-year plan. Lester's performance brought Maryland to an all time nadir in football

A few seasons later, Jerry Claiborne was brought in from . Virginia Tech and the rebuilding began. But by the time that the Terps got around to having a winning season, my student I.D., stuck away in the back of a drawer, had begun to turn

Last year on TV, I watched Maryland play a team outside the ACC. They not only played well, they won. I'm sure this winning team wasn't the University of Maryland, though. I had never seen them play that good in my life. In fact, I'm positive that they were Michigan State in Maryland uniforms. And you know how I could tell? Testudo II wasn't running around the


