Senators Want Investigation Of Carter Role With Vesco

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Several senators, aroused by complaints from a grand jury foreman, want to investigate whether the Carter administration sought to "cover up" an alleged attempt by fugitive Robert Vesco to bribe White House aides.

Justice Department officials say privately the alleged Vesco influence-buying approach was "overly thoroughly investigated" during an 18-month probe that resulted in no indictments.

They attributed the "cover-up" charges from Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, largely to politics and a "runaway" jury foreman, retired engineer Ralph

Hatch urged during a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing Wednesday the panel subpoena the former chief prosecutor in the case, whom Ulmer accused of trying "to lead the grand jury by the nose."

A related study showed many patients admitted to ICUs with apparent heart attacks could be transferred to general-care facilities within 24 hours and suffer no harmful effects.

The two studies, appearing in the New England Journal of Medicine, were conducted by two groups of doctors at the Massachusetts General Hospital.





MIDDLETOWN, Pa. (UPI) - The first two people to enter the crippled Three Mile Island Unit No. 2 reactor building say they are more intrigued than intimidated by the planned exploration, originally set for today but now postponed until next

"It's a real once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, said William very interesting to see what we find."

Michael Benson, 27, lead engineer at the crippled reactor, said neither he nor his wife were overly worried about possible bad health effects resulting from any excessive radiation exposure he might encounter during the 20-minute entry. The entry was expected to expose each man to one rem of radiation. Federal standards prohibit nuclear workers from receiving more than three rems each quarter of a year. Their comments were made at a news conference hastily called Wednesday by GPU to announce the entry had been postponed until late next week because breathing apparatus







Republican presidential candidate George Bush said he backed President Carter on the abortive Iranian hostage rescue mission and Sen. Edward Kennedy said the nation is determined to hold Iran accountable for the hostages. But the mother of one of the hostages accused Carter of "trying to kill" the hostages. Bush, in Southfield, Mich., said, "I unequivocably support the president — no ifs, ands or buts. This is not a time to go one up politically. He made a difficult, courageous decision."

Kennedy, in a statement issued in Detroit, was more subdued, saying he shares "the feeling of all Americans at this sad moment for our country." He said Americans are united "in our determination to hold the Iranian government fully accountable for the safety of the hostages." Family members of hostages expressed fear the Iranians might now


